The season started with some challenges. Our biggest challenge was at the start of the season with the WACA leaving us high and dry in regards to Floreat Oval. Six weeks from seasons start of the season They advised us that they would not be honoring the contract to look after the Club's turf wickets. We were very lucky to have Peter Jones agree to fill the void. He flew back from Melbourne five weeks before the season started and threw himself into the work. We were one of the first Clubs to have turf wickets for practice at the start of the season and only Fremantle and Perth were above us in the pitch ratings at the end of the season. It was a great effort by Peter and we are very grateful.

A personal highlight for me during the season was seeing several first and second grade players make the effort to attend the Junior windup function. Despite having to travel quite some distance and being involved in finals they made it and it was greatly appreciated by the junior players and their parents. The same sort of respect is evident throughout the Club, with no regard to the level or age of various players. It is a trait in the Club to be fostered and celebrated.

Two other highlights were the return of Club veterans to play with their sons and the introduction of young women into our Third and Fourth grade sides. 1st Grade Report

To defend a title is one of the toughest tasks in sport. To lose a grand final by the narrowest of margins is an even tougher thing to comprehend. The First grade side of 2011-12 almost accomplished one of the great feats in Subiaco-Floreat's storied history. With six different players from the team that won both the One-Day and Two-Day premierships of 2010-11, the side almost claimed back-to-back titles. Unfortunately it was not to be. Some ill-fortune and some unforced errors in the Final meant that Wanneroo escaped from 6-45 to run down our 210, and steal the Premiership.

We cannot dwell on what happened. It has happened and we can only move on. There were some wonderful team highlights throughout the year. Winning a one-day game at Burrendah against Willeton with the most inexperienced line-up the club had fielded in nearly three seasons was an exceptional achievement. A crushing 191-run victory over Flag favourites Melville in the semi-final was arguably the most satisfying of our eight victories this season.

We had 20 players that played First grade this year which is a testament to the talent and depth at our club.

We had five debutants in Calum How, Matt Thomson, Daniel Reid, David Colin-Thome and Luke McShane. The beauty of those five debutants is where they have come from. Calum is a recent graduate of the Under 17's, Matt and Daniel are from other clubs, and Luke and David are Third grade Premiership players from three seasons ago. From that Third Grade side, five players have now subsequently represented Subi-Floreat in First grade. That is a phenomenal achievement.

The wonderful part about our season is the evenness of the contribution from all 20 players.

We had three players; Alex Malcolm, Chris Hansberry, and Stefan Collins make 500 plus runs for the year. We had four centurions which is one more than last season and three of those players, Stefan Collins, Nathan Coulter-Nile and Ben Hansberry made their first centuries in First grade cricket which is a first in my time at the club.

We had three bowlers take more than 20 wickets, being Chris Hansberry, Jason Behrendorff and Matt Thomson. Those three, plus Nathan Coulter-Nile, each claimed five wicket hauls.

We had three players; Chris Hansberry, Malcolm, and Behrendorff, represent WA at 2nd XI level. Behrendorff and Coulter-Nile played Shield cricket for Western Australia.

Jason Behrendorff was selected in the Cricket Australia Chairman's XI to play against India which was an incredible achievement. He was also named Future Legend at the 2011-12 WACA awards. Nathan Coulter-Nile has been selected to go to the CA Centre of Excellence this winter as a full scholarship recipient.

We had three captains in first grade this year, due to some unforeseen occurrences. Thanks must go to Anthony Murphy and Steven Glew who both stood in on separate occasions and did a tremendous job. Both lead in their own unique way but both have been have been tremendous support to me this year.

Brett Bowker deserves enormous credit for the job he has done this season. I don't think anyone truly understand the time he has committed to the role. The job of coach has been taken to a new level by Brett. The time he gives away from the club is the thing that most impresses me and I am most thankful for. He has been a wonderful mentor and advisor not only for me for but a number of our young



players. He cares deeply about all of them. His influence on the group has been profound. Three Grand finals in two years is a remarkable achievement, and that is undoubtedly due to his influence.

Thank you to Noel Knight for his support this season. Noel's passion for the game, knowledge and experience proved invaluable to me throughout the season. Chatting to him was a great source of strength for me and my players.

Thanks to the selection panel for their support. This includes Chris Payne for the first half of the season, as well the other captain's Faisal Rashid, Perry Colyer and Glyn O'Brien. Particular thanks must go to the Gianni Di Rosso who has been a great friend and ally throughout the year, and also to Peter Farlie whom I have grown to know very well over the last six months. We are the first double act to take the First and Second grade sides to simultaneous Grand finals in the clubs history. I am very proud and honoured to share that with Peter.

Thank you to the committee but particularly to Larry Davies, Frank Collins, and Alan Bolton for their unwavering support throughout the year. It was greatly appreciated.

An enormous thank you must go to our curator Peter Jones. The state of the facilities at the club this season is amongst the best in all my time at Subiaco-Floreat. The wickets he prepared for both practice and game-day were first-class.

Thank you to all of the volunteers and sponsors around the club for their tremendous support. There are too many to mention individually, but without you the club would cease to exist.

Two volunteers do need mentioning though. Thank you to Dale Shenton for his work as part-time scorer this year.

But finally thanks must go to Phil Thomson who has been our First grade scorer for my entire career. Thank you Phil for your passion, enthusiasm, and love for the club and its players. You have been a magnificent servant. I am sorry we could not send you out with another flag. It's going to be hard to imagine turning up to play next year without you scoring each and every ball.

The challenge for the club now is to get better. The challenge for every player from First to Fourth grade is to improve, and we have the capabilities to achieve this. Every player at this club has the potential to become better cricketers. That should be our aim.

We are the envy of the competition and we need to continue to set the standards. Every player and supporter at Subiaco-Floreat should be extremely excited about the shape that the club is in, and the direction in which we are headed.

2nd Grade Report

The second grade enjoyed a very successful season, and we almost managed to cap it off with a remarkable win in the grand final, but unfortunately we fell just short despite a great effort from all involved.

We hit the road for Round 1, kicking the season off at Rocky Bay, where we took a very young side down, including 3 first gamers and a very inexperienced side as a whole. We managed to get the season away with a win after a close game, with a few great individual efforts with the bat from David Colin-Thome and ball from Dave Bolton and a restricted Jason Behrendorff returning from injury. Wet weather played a part in the next few rounds as we lost to eventual premiers South Perth and drew semi-finalists Perth, before we were back on the winners list at Breckler against Mount Lawley. In this game we had two more young second grade debutants in Rohan Quain and Ben Reed. Both of these guys showed great talent and unfortunately injury got the better of both for the middle part of the season. They are definitely two to watch for next year and I'm sure they have the ability to put in great performances in higher grades.

We then ventured up to Illuka where the Centurions got the better of us in another tight one. At this point in time we were midway on the ladder and struggling to get some consistent performances together. This round we saw the debut, not just his second grade debut but his senior debut at SFCC, of the very impressive Ash Blake, who then played 2's right through to the semi-final. Ash exceeded all expectations this year and everyone has been impressed by not only his on-field performances but also his application at training and his attitude that belies his age. We then returned to Floreat Oval and finished off the calendar year with a strong win over Midland Guildford and took some momentum into the break.

In the second half of the year the side was starting to build on experience with Luke McShane and Simon Heyting returning from their overseas adventures and our debutants had become more comfortable in their roles within the team. Perry Colyer also started his rich vein of form with both bat and ball. Success for the side then followed, and we didn't drop a game through to the grand final which was a great effort from everyone who played two's during these times.

A few success stories from the year, in the first few games there were two blokes who were making the selectors stand up and notice and one of these was lower grades veteran David Colin-Thome. David kicked the season off with back to back fifties from the number 6 spot at times which were crucial to the our innings and the match. After many seasons battling away in the 3's and 4's it was great to see DCT rewarded for consistent performances and hard work with his A grade debut. The second was round 1 debutant Daniel Reid, who has had a great first year at the club. Reidy was the trump card for much of the year with the ball, taking several bags and forced his way into the A grade side. Whilst he conditions didn't always suit, he still managed to impress all and will hopefully continue to develop into a class A grade spinner. Luke McShane also showed tremendous application at the crease, and after several stubborn displays he was also rewarded with his first A grade game.

Not to be outdone by the emerging young cubs, some of senior members of the side also made valuable contributions to the two's, none more so than Dave Bolton who took out the competition player of the year. Perry Colyer has reinvented himself as a quality all-round cricketer, and after making his way into



the 2's in round 6 he managed to finish 3rd in the competition vote count. AJ Murphy needed no time to have a big impact in second grade, with two 100's and an 80 in the short time we had him. Kim Manolas returned from injury and blasted another big second grade century putting on. Our bowlers were consistent all year and a large part of our success can be attributed to not relying on any one bowler to do the job. Strong performances were shown by each of our bowlers at various points in the season, with Dave Bolton, Dan Reid and Perry Colyer picking up 5 wicket hauls, and strong 4-for's by Jason Hart, James Sansalone, Simon Heyting and Ash Blake. Never to be outdone, Tom Moscarda's six-for on a flat deck in the semi-final set up a great win to get us through the GF. Two magnificent partnerships were witnessed during the year, Perry Colyer (127) and Kim Manolas (167) put on 234 in Round 11 vs University, and David Bolton (117*) and Anthony Murphy (106*) combined for 243 in the Semi-Final.

A special thanks must go to the coach Brett Bowker for all his assistance and hard work put in during the year, from all the twos you did a fantastic job and thanks again for your commitment to the club. Further thanks to the assistants Noel Knight and Kim Hughes later in the season. 3rd Grade Report

Season 2011/2012 for the third grade side was as volatile as the stock market. The side played a total of 12 matches, recording a home and away record of 4 wins, 1 draw and 7 losses, all in all a disappointing year. If you purely based our year on statistics, the results flatter the human eye although the progressive development of a number of players was a significant win for the cricket club. With the limited success throughout the season morals could have been expected to waiver, however that was never the case and the enthusiasm and encouragement from all the boys see each other success ultimately contributed to their development both individually and as a team.

Our season started with a limited overs game against Rockingham Mandurah at Alderbury Street, a game that was never in our grasp, culminating in a disappointing loss to a side who would eventually win as many games as we would. We started slowly against eventual premiers South Perth in round two but a disciplined bowling effort put us in a situation where we victory was a real possibility, unfortunately our batsman were not able to produce enough runs for the bowlers too defend.

Sitting at 0 wins and 2 losses, it was difficult to pin point which areas of our game needed improvement. The players were confident success was only a game away and rounds 3 and 4 brought that, with the side notching 2 success wins against Perth and Mount Lawley. Highlights over this period included 123 from Nick Harmer against Mount Lawley, 5 wicket hauls from Perry Colyer, Rohan Quain and Sunny Singh against Mount Lawley, Perth and Joondalup, a spectacular outfield catch from Jake Colvin against Perth and consistent performances with the bat from Joel Heyting and Ben Sandhu. We had played some good hard competitive cricket it was just a matter of sustaining the efforts of all players over a longer period post Christmas.

We began the post Christmas phase with 2 disappointing performances against Claremont Nedlands and Fremantle being outplayed for the majority of both games. At this point in the season, sitting on 2 wins and 6 losses, the inconsistencies in our game were becoming more and more evident. Round 9 brought about some long awaited success, with a well overdue win against Gosnells. The experience gained from playing senior cricket will fast track their own development proves valuable for the club in years to come.

The introduction of the Singh's (Sunny and Laddie), Ben Sandhu, and Brad Hughes into the structure of Subiaco Floreat provided some fun and enthusiasm into the group. Their love for the game is second to none, especially Brad, as he had never played a competitive cricket match until this year. People like Brad are needed around such a club, as his attitude toward improving his skills and that of his teammates is what creates success and enjoyment for the game.

The introduction of Nicole Bolton into the side was a remarkable story and something that shouldn't be overlooked. Nicole, who captains the Western Fury, joined us towards the end of the season and proved a valuable asset to the side. Her professionalism towards training and games was of the highest order, making it know surprise amongst the players her easy transition to 3<sup>rd</sup> grade.

A special thank you must be given to Glyn O'Brien and Emerson Walker, who were great sounding boards all year and captained the team with great distinction. Glyn's involvement should not be overlooked considering his responsibility for the entire year was solely towards the under 17s. The ability to juggle both roles when required speaks volume of the man and love for the game, thank you Glyn. A massive thank you must be given to Brett Bowker and Noel Knight as their involvement in coaching, preparation and recovery is truly remarkable and brought a side of professionalism that has rubbed off on the entire playing group. The correlation of their plans and 2 sides reaching the grand final is no surprise,

Finally I would like to thank Brett, Noel, Gianni Di Rosso and the committee particularly Larry Davies, Frank Collins, and Alan Bolton for their support throughout the year. Their involvement enables all the players the ability to play the game they love especially at such a wonderful club like that off Subiaco Floreat. The facilities provided are among the best in the state and the tireless work put in by these men only reiterates why Subiaco Floreat are the most successful club in the competition.

I have enjoyed every part of the 2011/12 season and hope to celebrate more success down at Floreat Oval in years to come.

### **Club History**

The Subiaco Cricket Club was admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association in 1907 and was formed from the remnants of a mercantile cricket club based at Whittaker's timber mill in Subiaco. The Club played originally at Subiaco Oval before re-locating to Rosalie Park in the 1960's. Some of the better-known Subiaco players were Johnny Rutherford, Jim Hubble, Des Hoare and former Prime Minister Bob Hawke.

The Floreat Park Cricket Club was founded in 1956 and admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association as a 2nd Grade Club. The most famous players to be produced by the Floreat Park Club were Australian Test players Kim Hughes and Terry Alderman who both went to the Subiaco Club to play 1st grade cricket before returning to Floreat Oval when the two clubs merged.

The Subiaco-Floreat Cricket Club was founded in 1977 as a result of the amalgamation between the Subiaco Cricket Club and the Floreat Park Cricket Club and commenced playing in the 1977/78 season. Ray Young was the inaugural President and Paul Nicholls the inaugural 1st Grade Captain.

Since the amalgamation the Club has produced from within its own ranks, many 1st class representatives including Glenn Hughes, Giles Bush, Todd Breman, Gavin Swan, Michael Clark, Steven Glew and Murray Goodwin.

In season 2000/01, the Club won the Club Championship by a margin of 300 points. This was the largest winning margin on record. In 2001/02, the Club became the first club since 1982/83 to win successive 1st Grade Premierships, the first club since 1986/87 to win successive Club Championships and the only club in the history of the WACA competition to win successive 1st Grade Premierships and Club Championships and at the same time.

In season 2002/03 the Club won a third successive 1st Grade Premiership. This was only the third time in WACA history that a club has won three successive 1st Grade Premiership; the previous occurrence was back in 1924/25. In 2004/05, the club won the Sunday League one-day competition for the first time since it began in 1978/79.

In 2005/06, the club had a distinguished season, being the only club with all four grades making the semi-finals and, in what is probably a national first, all four captains losing the toss on rain-affected wickets (Richie Benaud would receive a frosty welcome if he was to repeat the quote below). The club



was also the runner-up in the club championship and we were semi-finalists in both the Sunday League and Colts competitions, whilst our Juniors took the flag in the U/17 competition.

In addition, the umpires awarded champion bowler Sam Howman the prestigious Olly Cooley Medal as fairest and best in the WACA competition and awarded the club the Lords Taverners' Spririt of Cricket Award on the basis of points for each match in every grade throughout the season. Previous Subiaco-Floreat Olly Cooley medallists since it was first awarded in 1976-77 have been Kevin Sharp, who won it in 1980-81, and Brian 'Big Bird' Raven, who won it in 1989-90.

Also in 2005/06, Chris Hansberry was awarded the 2005/06 WA Media Guild prize as State U/19 Cricketer of the Year and Adam Bolton was awarded the JP Robbins Medal as the Second Grade Cricketer of the Year, determined by umpires' votes in a similar manner to the Olly Cooley medal. In the Juniors, Tim Monteleone took the WACA Junior Cricketer of the Year Award and Jimmy Sansalone won the WACA U/17's Cricketer of the Year and WACA bowling aggregate and averages trophies.
