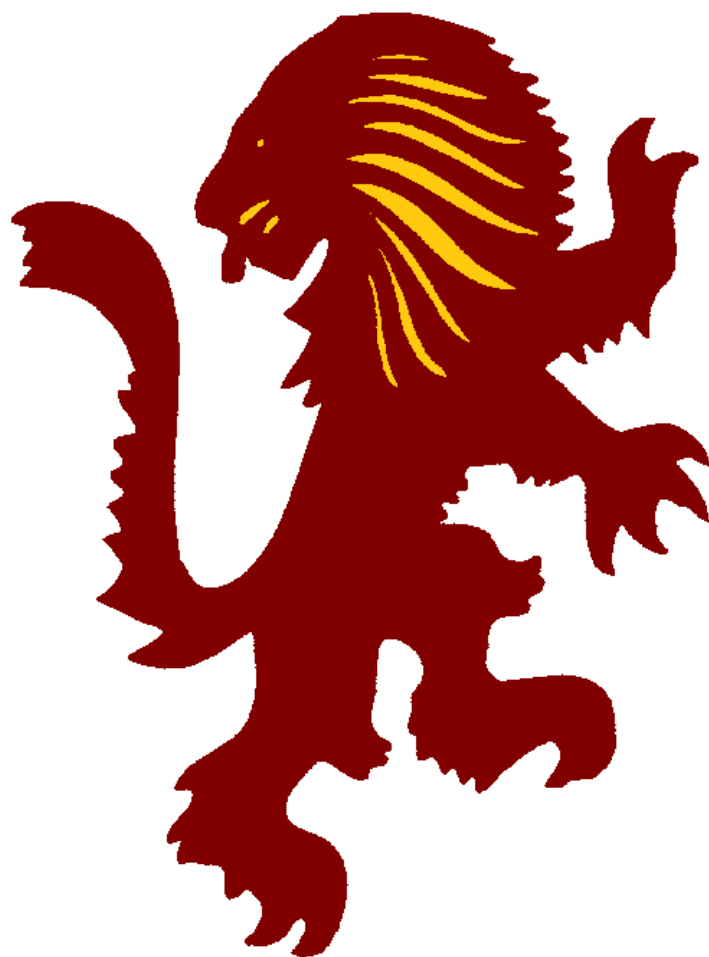

Coach's Report

The 2012/13 season finished on a high with the 3rd Grade taking out the Premiership in wonderful fashion. The team, astutely led by club stalwart Simon Heyting, achieved their success on the back of an outstanding home and away season punctuated by 3 outright victories and then a tense and pulsating semi-final win and finally a commanding performance in the final. Many congratulations to Simon and his team.

Our other three grades did not perform quite so well and indeed, our 1st and 2nd grades were somewhat disappointing overall. Our 1's played an Elimination Final against Melville and, as was the case for much of the year, our batting failed under pressure and we exited the season in that first week of finals. The 2's lacked consistency throughout and whilst finals were possible with a couple of rounds to play, the boys lost crucial games late and missed the play offs marginally. Although missing out on finals in the 4's, significant progress was achieved just to be in contention late and the side had many outstanding performers. All 3 skippers, Alex Malcolm, David Colin-Thome and Faisal Rashid are to be congratulated on leading their respective sides with great enthusiasm and dedication and I thank them for their efforts.

From a First Class point of view Nathan Coulter-Nile and Jason Behrendorff continued to build on their growing reputations and the club welcomed Warriors opener Liam Davis to the group for the first time. The 1st grade also welcomed 3 new debutants in Ash Blake, Perry Colyer and Adam Bowker and all performed extremely well and demonstrated an ability to continue at that level for years to come.

1st Grade Report

Looking back on season 2012-13, the 1st grade side will be frustrated with a season of underachievement. We were driven by the pain and disappointment of letting a premiership slip through our grasp the previous season, but unfortunately we were never able to put together consistent performances to get us back in position to vie for the flag we desired.

The amazing thing is, for as badly as we played, by our lofty standards, we still managed to play off in an elimination final, and even after batting horrifically we still tested every ounce of Melville's resolve in their chase of 129.

Our year started well. Although we never reached our potential with the standard of cricket we played, we won games regularly to reach the Christmas break with four wins, a loss, and a draw.

Round one was ruined by rain, which cost us a win. We made 260 batting first. David Bandy, on return after a year away from the game, made a superb 113. Steven Glew chimed in with 51. Matt Thomson had three of the four scalps when rain ended our progress with the ball.

We managed solid wins in the next two rounds. We beat Willetton comfortably at Burrendah. The attack bowled superbly as a unit to dismiss Willetton for 170. Cal How starred in the chase, after a last minute promotion to number three, making a wonderfully composed 84 on an inconsistent surface.

Cal again rescued us against South Perth making 45no as we squeezed past South Perth in a low-scoring affair.

A loss against Claremont-Nedlands followed, but we regained some form against Joondalup in a 50-over match. We compiled 9 for 195 batting first with contributions from Bandy (42), How (38) and Stefan Collins (34), before our bowlers strangled the eventual premiers with a great display of discipline. Chris Hansberry bagged 4 for 7, but all of our bowlers played their part.

Round six against Rockingham was a breezy win where our WA representatives showed their class. Jason Behrendorff took 6 for 37 to ensure Rockingham fell for 128. He also made 31 in the chase, alongside Nathan Coulter-Nile who smashed 64 from 47 balls, showing the immense talent that has seen him subsequently represent Australia in an International T20 against the West Indies.

In the second innings, Ash Blake took his maiden five-wicket haul in 1st grade and Chris Hansberry picked up five wickets as well.

But after Christmas the wheels fell off, losing three in row. We lost an extraordinary game to Fremantle, where a freak innings by Ashton Turner proved the difference. After setting 317 to win following half centuries to Chris Hansberry (50), AJ Murphy (62) and Behrendorff (59), we had Fremantle 7 for 209 at tea before Turner turned the game with a spectacular 99.

We followed that loss with defeats to Perth and Midland. Against Perth, Murphy (76) and Bandy (52) helped set up a total of 242 at Fletcher Park, but lapses in concentration with the ball and in the field saw the Demons run down the total.

Against Midland, Matt Thomson bagged 5 for 39 as the 'Townners fell for 202. But despite a career-best 56 from Aaron Lilly we fell 11 runs short in the chase, having been in control throughout.



We got back on track against Gosnells with a solid all-round win. Bandy (50) and How (49) combined for the first 100-run partnership of the season, in a total of 9 for 293 dec. The highlight though was undoubtedly Steven Glew becoming the third player in WACA history to accumulate 10,000 career runs. It is an astonishing achievement by an exceptional player. Chris Hansberry took four wickets as we dismissed Gosnells easily.

Our win against Wanneroo was the finest of the season, and a rare outright success. We were sent in on a wicket with some moisture in it and Alex Malcolm (64) and Ben Hansberry (35) put on 103 for the first wicket to set the game up. Glew clubbed 94 and How 54 to take the total to 8 for 331 dec. We then bowled Wanneroo out twice for 58 and 154 for one of the great wins this group has been involved in. Ash Blake was the star taking nine wickets for the day, 3 for 4 in the first innings and 6 for 36 in the second.

Our season ended poorly though with back-to-back losses to Melville. Our bowlers performed well in both matches but our batsmen failed to deliver, with the exception of Ben Hansberry in round 12, who finished 32no batting at number four.

We finished with six wins, six losses, and a draw. No batsman managed more than 420 runs, and only David Bandy made a century. Cal How had a breakout season though playing a number of match-winning innings and thoroughly deserved to win the batting award.

Our bowling was superb all year, led by Ash Blake (31 wickets at 13.48), Matt Thomson (33), and Chris Hansberry (30). We've come to expect that type of quality from Matt and Chris but Ash Blake's season was unbelievable. It is a credit to his work ethic.

We also had a number of debuts this season. Ash Blake, Adam Bowker, and Perry Colyer all made their 1st grade debut having played junior cricket and lower grades for the club, which is outstanding to see. Liam Davis also joined us this year. We had 20 players in all represent Subi in 1st grade this season.

Davis, Behrendorff, and Coulter-Nile all represented WA this season in first-class cricket with Coulter-Nile playing for Australia. Cal How played for WA in the Australian U19 Championships.

Thanks to coach Brett Bowker for his efforts this season. His passion and enthusiasm for the club is self-evident. Thanks also to both Noel Knight and Tony Cranstoun for their contributions this year.

Thanks to our scorer Dale Shelton for his tremendous work again. To Peter Jones, our curator, thank you for the superb training and game-day wickets you put together.

Thanks to all of the volunteers involved in putting on lunches, afternoon teas, and dinners for the players. There are too many to mention, but particular thanks to Keith Blake, Sue and Dom Sansalone, and Jane O'Brien.

Finally thanks to Glyn O'Brien and the committee for their support, and congratulations to Simon Heyting and the third grade team on their premiership success.

2nd Grade Report

The second grade battled through a tough season that saw us miss out on playing finals cricket by a couple of games.

The team for round one against Scarborough had eight changes from the side that played in the 2011/12 2nd Grade Grand Final but gave opportunity for the return of two stray Lion veterans in Aaron Lily and David Kinsella and the 2nd Grade debut for Josh Parker. The match against Scarborough had us in a winning position but was eventually washed out but not before Ash Blake kick started his season in style with a four wicket haul that saw him elevated to make his 1st Grade Debut on Day 2.

The next three rounds were tough games where we lost two of the three against Willetton and Claremont-Nedlands who finish first and second on the ladder respectively and another frustrating rain tarnished draw from a winning position against South Perth who also finished in the top six. These matches were also the beginning of a rich vein of form for Ben Hansberry who peel off back-to-back scores over 50 and the 2nd Grade Debuts of our two English imports in Matt King and Greg Hollins.

With two rain effected draws and a couple of losses it was round five that we notched up our first win. Day one was washed out across all grades meaning we played a one-day format game on day 2. I managed to win the toss and send Joondalup in on a green deck. For the next 21 overs it was the Sansalone, Lilly and Colyer show and we managed to skittle Joondalup for 45 in 21 of the allotted 50 overs. The return of Anthony Murphy who made 84 not out ensured we passed the target.

Round six saw the return of Simon Heyting to not only play but also Captain the side in my absence. Another tough round for the 2's but personal efforts from Perry Colyer in the first innings and Glen Stockden and Dan Reid in the second innings who all picked up four wicket hauls. Adam Bolton also passed 50 for the first time this season in the 2nd Grade.

We started well after Christmas. Round seven against Fremantle. We batted first and Benny Hansberry (150) and Perry Colyer (117) combined for a 200 run partnership that certainly set the game up for us. With half the job done on day one we came out the next day and bowled Fremantle out for 176. Jimmy Sansalone, Aaron Lily and Matt King doing the damage with the ball. In the second innings Adam Bolton and Emmerson Walker combined with some big hitting for a 113 run partnership that saw us 1-118 from 16 overs at stumps.

Round eight against Perth saw Aaron Lily produce the innings he had threatened to produce all season. We had top order collapse and Lils was at the crease with the score at 4-80. 25 Fours and a six later and Lils walks off the ground with 172 next to his name and the team well into the 300's. Again with only half the job done we came out the next week and managed to knock over Perth for 142 within 45 overs, Dan Reid the star with a 5 wicket haul. The hope of still playing finals cricket in the back of our heads, we sent them back in and just fell short of an outright victory. Perth finishing 7-115. The wickets were shared but a welcome return to the 2nd Grade for Tom Moscarda.

Round nine and we continued our momentum from the last couple of games but not without fright. Another top order collapse had Perry Colyer walking to the crease with the score yet again at 4-80. Pez and Josh Parker put on a hundred run partnership. Perry was out for 91 and Josh was out for a personal best score of 40. The score still not much above 200 and a couple more quick wickets, in enter Jason



Hart and Dan Reid. Both Jason and Dan showing the rest of us how it should have been done, leaving the good balls and putting away the bad balls Dan and Gritty put on a partnership of 87 that took the total past 300. For the third game in a row we had done the job with the bat and needed the 10 wickets to seal the win. A 35 degree day two had our English import in Matt King almost pass out due to exhaustion on his way to four wickets off almost 20 overs. Wickets also to Jimmy, Pez and Reidy sealed our third win on the trot. This game was also saw Alex Bell make his 2nd Grade Debut.

Losses in the next two rounds saw to the end of our finals chances for the season. Personal milestones to Adam Bowker who scored his first 50 for the club, Josh Parker who took a personal best 3 wicket haul in an excellent spell of bowling and to Perry Colyer who took a 5 wicket haul and was unlucky to not have won us the game againsts Wanneroo.

The final game of the season saw James Sansalone take the Captaincy in my absence. The make up of the team only containing five players that started in the 2nd Grade in Round one. We batted first and made 287 on a good batting track at Floreat Oval. 50's to Steffan Collins, Aaron Lilly and Paul Glew (from number 9). With runs on the board we started well on Day 2 and at one stage had them 5-85. A couple of good partnerships from the Melville batsmen and a couple of decisions that didn't go our way and Melville just scraped past our total. This final match of the season saw Western Fury Captain Nicole Bolton make her 2nd Grade debut, she capped her first game by taking an outstanding catch going back to end the Melville innings.

As this point I would like to mention and thank Brett Bowker for all his help and support throughout the season. Thanks also goes to Noel Knight for his input and advice this season. Also to the other Captains, Pro, Simba and Faisal thanks for helping me through my first season as skipper I couldn't have done it without your support. Special mention to Simba and Jimmy Sansalone who skippered the side in my absence. Congratulations to Simon and the 3rd Grade team on their Grand Final win.

Whilst the 2012/13 season was not as successful on the field as we would have liked in the 2nd Grade we saw the growth of a lot of the younger members of the side and improvement from senior members and that will see improved results on the field next season.

## 3rd Grade Report

The 3rd grade side enjoyed a highly successful season, one that started slowly but resulted in the ultimate prize, a premiership.

The slow start to the season involved a rain affected draw to start with, two weak performances with the bat resulting in losses and a nail biting 1 wicket win in which we lost 3 for 0 with 2 runs required for victory. These first 4 games saw the debuts of several players, including Josh Parker, Baillie Waller and Ben Monro, and the return to the club of Wayne and Paul Glew. Highlights from the first few games included Josh Parker's 50 on debut and Wayne and Brent Eales' sensational partnership that bought us to the cusp of victory at South Perth. But perhaps the most pleasing performance was the efforts of two of our under 17's in Baillie and Ben Monro who batted for well over 2 hours together against Claremont Nedlands in compiling a partnership of 60 out of a total score of 129. The pair of them showed great fight and hopefully we will see more of these performances over the coming seasons.

A one day game against Joondalup in Round 5 really kick started our season and it was from here that we started to play a more consistent, harder brand of cricket. We posted 8/222 batting first built by a magnificent innings of 88 by Emerson Walker. Round 8 saw a slight hiccup in our season with a trip to Perth resulting in a rather embarrassing performance. Chasing 208, we found ourselves 6/20 early on day 2 and wondering if any of us knew how to use a bat. Midland Guilford were next up and it saw us win another game by 1 wicket. Tom Moscarda was the hero this time around as we found ourselves in deep trouble chasing 154. By this stage of the season we were in the 6 but far from safe with a number of sides in contention for the finals.

A lovely 2 days in Gosnells was our fixture for round 10 and what we certainly enjoyed our time out there. After bowling them out for 68 early on day 1, we had victory in our reach by tea. By stumps we had worked our way to 5/200 with Rohan smashing them everywhere on his way to 72\*. A special mention must be made to Luke McShane who finally hit a six in senior cricket. Congratulations Plodder. Day 2 arrived with expectations of an outright and after a bit of a grind we were eventually able to get the result with a few runs up our sleeves. Ben Reed the pick with 4/24 and 6 wickets for the match. A top of the table clash loomed in our one dayer against Wanneroo but after our poorest performance with the ball all season we left ourselves with too much to do with the bat and came up 20 runs short.

Coming into the last game of the season we were still a chance to finish on top but we need a big result against Melville and a few results to go our way. Fortunately for us they did. Melville kindly rolled out the best kids they could find against us and after we dismissed them for 93 in the first innings we were pretty confident our 3rd outright of the season was coming our way. We didn't cover ourselves in glory

with the bat but 155 proved far too much with Melville meekly rolling over for 52 in the 2nd innings to deliver us the outright well before tea and top spot on the ladder. Josh Parker finishing with 8 wickets for the match.

His 108\* guided us home and the game was never in doubt whilst he was at the crease with his level headed and determined approach. It was a knock of pure class and bodes well for Josh's future at the club.

University awaited us in the Grand Final after doing us a favour and knocking out or bogey side Perth. They kindly sent us in on what proved to be a belter of a wicket and from the start we always seemed to be in control. A strong opening partnership of 72 between Ben Moseley and Luke McShane set the tone, then a 87 run stand between Adam Bolton (76) and Josh Parker (51) put us in a great position. We batted the day and a few overs into Sunday, eventually finishing with 261. Their chase did not start well, with Ben Reed taking a wicket in the first over and from there our tails were certainly up. At 4/75 we were confident but a partnership put the celebrations on hold. 3 quick wickets put an end to that and at tea we required 3 wickets to achieve glory. Tom Moscarda quickly put an end to it shortly after tea and the celebrations are still going now. Adam Bolton was named man of the match for his efforts with the bat. A special mention must be made to Plug for his efforts over the finals. He produced 3 sensational cricket wickets at Floreat and it was a privilege to play on them during the finals.

The season on the whole was highly enjoyable. As a captain my job was made easy by the great bunch of blokes that played and the willingness they had to do what was needed for the team and I thank all 30 guys that played this year for that. To those that missed out on playing in the finals I really appreciate your efforts to do what the team needed regardless of your own personal disappointment. It was rare that we had a game where there was one dominant performance by one player, it was generally always a team effort with contributions coming from a variety of players. Perhaps the most pleasing aspect of the season was the younger group of guys standing up in the pressure situations. Hopefully this holds the club in good stead moving forward.

A special thanks to Emerson and Wayne who stepped in to the captaincy for me when I was unavailable. Thanks also must go to Phil Thomson who scored for all our home games at Alder bury and for the entire finals series. To Brett, thank you for your efforts over the last few years, I'm glad we could grab another flag whilst you were with us. Alex, DCT, Faisal and Hammer also deserve thanks for their support and help over the season. To Glyn and the Committee, thank you for having the faith to install me as the skipper for the year and all your support over the course of the season, especially come finals time.

2012/2013 was a great year for the 3's and I hope the club can continue to experience success in all grades moving forward

## Colts Report

Having lost only one player during the off-season (Adam Bowker) and gained a number of new faces, the Colts entered the 2012/2013 with high expectations. Round one saw the side take on University at Alderbury Reserve. The Books won the toss and elected to bat, however they were ruining this decision early with Ashley Blake and Ben Reed doing some early damage to have the opposition reeling at 2/1 and 3/35. Despite some resistance from the University middle order, the Lion Cubs managed to take all 10 wickets for just 145 runs. Blake was the pick of the bowlers (3/28 off 10), while Cameron O'Brien (3/22 off 8) continued his miserly form from the previous year. In response, Subi was seemingly cruising at 2/71, before proceeding to lose 6/15 and eventually being bundled out for 130. Calum How made a nice 49, while Blake completed a fine all-round performance with an unbeaten 28. It was an extremely disappointing loss for the side after slipping from a winning position.

The team played Mount Lawley at Breckler Park in round two, looking to atone for its poor showing in round one. The Lions were again made to bowl first, and restricted the Hawks to 8/140 from their 50 overs. Matt King was impressive in just this second colts match, taking 4/19 from 10. Blake bowled without luck for 1/21 off 10 including four maidens, while Bailee Waller was composed on debut (0/17 off 6) and will be an important player in the side going forward. Ben Moseley got the side off to a flying start in response to the small total (25 off 27 deliveries), however the lingering memories of round one ensured the players were never comfortable. After Moseley's dismissal, Josh Parker and Josh Newman combined for 46 to steady the ship. Blake again contributed with the willow, scoring another unbeaten 33. The score was passed with four wickets in hand.

In the other round two match, Bayswater-Morley scored a bonus point win over University. Because of Subi's low net run rate, the side entered the round three match knowing that it had to win with a double bonus point to progress to the semi-final stage of the competition. Having again lost the toss, the Lions bowled first knowing that they would have to chase whatever total the Bears set in 25 overs. It was the side's worst performance in the field for the season, with a number of catches going down and bowling plans not being adhered to. Moseley was the pick of the bowlers, managing to snare 2/39 from his 10. Blake was economical (0/30 off 10), however Bayswater ended up posting 5/196.

In order to gain the double bonus point, the Lions required 197 in 25 overs at a run rate of 7.88. Considering the side's run rate in the first two games was 3.03, this was always going to be a tough ask. The side approached it with a 'nothing to lose' attitude, taking a positive approach to each delivery. Moseley fell in the third over for 11, when the run rate was above 10. Emerson Walker and How then put on 97 in 11 overs to have the side well placed at 2/124 after 14 overs. After Walker fell for 51 (44), How continued on his merry way to guide the Lions to a memorable victory in the 24th over, scoring 90 not out off 62 balls in 91 minutes. How played every shot in the book (including a reverse pull shot off a man who opened the bowling for the WACA Under 19s later in the Summer) and was simply a class above any other individual on the ground. All in all, it took the side 103 minutes to score 4/198 at a rate of 8.49 runs per over to qualify for the semi-final against South Perth a few weeks later.

The match against South Perth at Richardson Park was the first final for many of the players. Walker lost his fourth toss in a row, and so the side would yet again be bowling first. King took 3/66 off his 10, although his figures were inflated due to some late hitting from the South Perth lower order. How was

economical in taking 1/35 from his full allotment, with usual spinner Moseley unavailable. O'Brien was again handy in taking 2/23 from five. The Sky Blues posted a final total of 7/242 after some powerful hitting in the final 10 overs.

Subi suffered an early setback in its chase, with How out to a brilliant direct-hit run out in just the second over. Walker soon fell for 19, however Parker, Blake (who was batting at second drop after his solid form) and Alex Bell gave the side a chance when it reached 4/137. However, wickets in succession saw South Perth grab the ascendancy and the Lions were eventually all out for 162. Blake was again the standout in scoring 60, which included a six which he proclaimed at training the following week was 88 metres – he had apparently measure it on Google Earth. The 10 wicket to fall consisted of four run outs and a stumping. Although nothing can be taken away from the elite standard of South Perth's fielding, it was always going to be tough to achieve the total with dismissals occurring in such a fashion.

Despite falling one win short of a grand final, the season can nevertheless be deemed a success for the side. It was a significant improvement on the 2011/2012 performance and for a young team losing only Walker and Joe Galati next year, there is significant upside heading into the 2013/2014 season.

Club History

The Subiaco Cricket Club was admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association in 1907 and was formed from the remnants of a mercantile cricket club based at Whittaker's timber mill in Subiaco. The Club played originally at Subiaco Oval before re-locating to Rosalie Park in the 1960's. Some of the better-known Subiaco players were Johnny Rutherford, Jim Hubble, Des Hoare and former Prime Minister Bob Hawke.

The Floreat Park Cricket Club was founded in 1956 and admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association as a 2nd Grade Club. The most famous players to be produced by the Floreat Park Club were Australian Test players Kim Hughes and Terry Alderman who both went to the Subiaco Club to play 1st grade cricket before returning to Floreat Oval when the two clubs merged.

The Subiaco-Floreat Cricket Club was founded in 1977 as a result of the amalgamation between the Subiaco Cricket Club and the Floreat Park Cricket Club and commenced playing in the 1977/78 season. Ray Young was the inaugural President and Paul Nicholls the inaugural 1st Grade Captain.

Since the amalgamation the Club has produced from within its own ranks, many 1st class representatives including Glenn Hughes, Giles Bush, Todd Breman, Gavin Swan, Michael Clark, Steven Glew and Murray Goodwin.

In season 2000/01, the Club won the Club Championship by a margin of 300 points. This was the largest winning margin on record. In 2001/02, the Club became the first club since 1982/83 to win successive 1st Grade Premierships, the first club since 1986/87 to win successive Club Championships and the only club in the history of the WACA competition to win successive 1st Grade Premierships and Club Championships and at the same time.

In season 2002/03 the Club won a third successive 1st Grade Premiership. This was only the third time in WACA history that a club has won three successive 1st Grade Premierships; the previous occurrence was back in 1924/25. In 2004/05, the club won the Sunday League one-day competition for the first time since it began in 1978/79.

In 2005/06, the club had a distinguished season, being the only club with all four grades making the semi-finals and, in what is probably a national first, all four captains losing the toss on rain-affected wickets (Richie Benaud would receive a frosty welcome if he was to repeat the quote below). The club was also the runner-up in the club championship and we were semi-finalists in both the Sunday League and Colts competitions, whilst our Juniors took the flag in the U/17 competition.

In addition, the umpires awarded champion bowler Sam Howman the prestigious Olly Cooley Medal as fairest and best in the WACA competition and awarded the club the Lords Taverners' Spirit of Cricket Award on the basis of points for each match in every grade throughout the season. Previous Subiaco-Floreat Olly Cooley medallists since it was first awarded in 1976-77 have been Kevin Sharp, who won it in 1980-81, and Brian 'Big Bird' Raven, who won it in 1989-90.

Also in 2005/06, Chris Hansberry was awarded the 2005/06 WA Media Guild prize as State U/19 Cricketer of the Year and Adam Bolton was awarded the JP Robbins Medal as the Second Grade Cricketer of the Year, determined by umpires' votes in a similar manner to the Olly Cooley medal. In the Juniors, Tim Monteleone took the WACA Junior Cricketer of the Year Award and Jimmy Sansalone won the WACA U/17's Cricketer of the Year and WACA bowling aggregate and averages trophies.
