



The 2018/19 season has been one of great success for the club both on and off the field. Our 12 teams competed in 16 different competitions and qualified for 9 grand finals and won three premierships. An outstanding result by any standards. In particular, the female program has gone from strength to strength and they underpinned the strong on-field performance.

I am fortunate to be following in the footsteps of Glyn O'Brien, who did an outstanding job as President for the preceding 6 years and passed the baton over with the club in a far stronger position than it was when he took on the Presidency. I am hoping to be able to do the same. It was great to see Glyn (and Jane's) efforts rewarded with a life membership last year.

Everyone involved in the female program should be very proud of what has been achieved over the past season. Premierships in the A grade 50 over and Youth League competitions were the icing on the cake for a clean sweep of grand final appearances by the A grade, B grade and Youth teams across their 5 competitions. Well done to Jim Sansalone for once again leading the coaching team with aplomb and he was a very deserving winner of the Coach of the Year Award for the WACA's female competitions.

For me, the highlight of the senior men's teams' season was seeing the Colts and 1st grade sides play back to back games at the WACA in the T20 grand finals. Although the 1^{st's} fell short, they should learn from the experience and will be better placed the next time they find themselves in that position. A fantastic effort by the Colts team which saw them fight their way back into the game after an early batting collapse showed a lot of ticker and belief. It brought a tear to my eye hearing Ross Williams lead the boys in a heartfelt rendition of the club song.

It was great to see the coaching team bolstered this year with the return of club legend Gavin Swan to the fold. Swanny provided a breath of fresh air to a coaching team that was unfortunately not operating at its maximum potential. Chris Hansberry very kindly stepped up in a time of need to take on the Caretaker Coach role, which was greatly appreciated by all. I am also very pleased with the addition of Wayne Clark to our coaching team for the coming season, and I'm sure the players will all benefit from his involvement. I would also like to acknowledge the efforts of Dermot Reeve and Ken Lilly for their valuable years of service to the club.

The junior program was once again led very capably by Andrew Sculthorpe, and whilst its success is not gauged only by wins and losses, it was an excellent reward for effort to see the U/17 and U/13 teams make it to the grand-final. A big thankyou to Richard Hacker, Tim Beattie, Dave Barbieri and Andrew Sculthorpe for coaching the respective junior teams and for developing the pipeline of future Lions stars.

Our very loyal and dedicated curator, Scott McLean was duly recognised for his efforts at Floreat Oval by winning the Premier League's Best Pitch Award this year. He helps our club to provide a point of difference compared to the other clubs by continually providing first class practice and match wickets.

It is also important to recognise the contribution made by our sponsors, the Town of Cambridge, the WACA and Cricket Australia. All of these partners provide significant amounts of funding to the club and we would not exist without them. A special mention to the ARK Group (the Kapinkoff family), Revo Sports (the Holder family) and the Inglewood Hotel (Murray Cutbush who has amazingly supported the club for over 30 years). In a very positive development, we recently received confirmation from the Town of



Cambridge that they have agreed to commit to a new 5-year Turf Wicket Maintenance Agreement, and this gives us the financial certainty we were seeking for the foreseeable future.

I have left my biggest thankyou to last. We are very lucky to have a committee full of highly skilled and good people that put in an enormous amount of work to give the players the best chance of success and enjoyment. I can't thank Stu, Sam, Doss, Scully, Erik, Phil, Willo, Larry, Ian, Josh, Monty, Kingy and Johnno enough for their dedicated and selfless service. Please thank these people whenever you get the chance, because you will probably never fully understand the work they do for you and the club. It was nice to see Stu recognised for his contribution when he won the Premier Club Administrator of the Year Award. A fantastic reflection on Stu and the rest of the Committee. I'm sure he managed to get Roughy, Ruth, Subi and Hawthorn into his acceptance speech. We were also awarded by the WACA for being one of the top 3 Premier League clubs from an off-field perspective.

I am looking forward to the year ahead where the Committee will do its best to implement some of the improvements identified by the club's members as part of a year-end survey. We will be introducing a new Leadership program to develop our captains and emerging leaders, seeking grants to fund an upgrade to the Floreat Oval changerooms, and working with the Town of Cambridge to deliver better facilities at Alderbury Reserve. We will also look to further engage the past players group, continue the integration of the male and female players and encourage more engagement of social club members living nearby to our facilities. These initiatives will all take time, but we will work hard to progress these as best we can.

2nd Grade Report

Firstly, I would like to thank the committee for allowing me the opportunity to skipper in 2018/19. I've learnt a great deal about cricket and leadership, and hope that I have had a positive impact on what was one of the younger teams I have been involved in. My message to the group at the start of the year was that we were going to carry a 'club first' ethos to everything we did, make sure we enjoyed our cricket and had a great time together. Every player who featured in 2nd grade over the course of the year bought into this, and it was an absolute pleasure to skipper.

We had 22 players filter through the 2s this year, 9 of these players were under the age of 21, a number of these played critical roles over the course of the year, which bodes really well for the club going forward.

We got off to a poor start, losing three of our first four matches. We weren't playing our best cricket, but it was a testament to all of the players that the feeling at training and on game day was positive considering our start to the season. In amongst this, there were some really positive signs, with Jamie Collins making his debut in round 1, scoring some crucial runs and bowling important overs. The way the boys rebounded and turned our season around was a real show of character, starting in round five where we bowled Melville out for 27 and got our season rolling.

Going through seven rounds of cricket without losing set ourselves up for a finals' berth and gave us the opportunity to achieve something special. To get us to this position there were some really pivotal performances, Ben Tredget (492 @ 37.85), Kiran Prashanth (334 @ 30.36), and David Lane (245 @ 49), all performed well and worked incredibly hard to get us into the top six. The talent and upside of this group is immense, however, turning the 20s and 30s into 60s, 70s, 80s and hopefully 100s will see this group of batsmen take the step forward into 1st grade. Our performance with the ball at times saved us and got us out of trouble, with a number of players – Conor Moldrich, Andrew Hall, Ash Blake, Cam O'Brien, Jack Retallack and Michael Hart, all playing important roles to turn our season around, five of these six names played 1st grade which speaks volumes to the talent in the bowling cohort coming through.

A real highlight for the 2nd grade players was the opportunity to play finals cricket against older and far more experienced teams. Knocking off Mount Lawley in the Semi-Final was incredibly satisfying, watching two of our youngest players, Kiran Prashanth (62no) and Ben Tredget (59no), add over 100 for the second wicket and take us to a comprehensive victory was great to see and a positive sign for the club. The following week, we lost comprehensively to a fantastic Perth team, who would go on to be premiers, which was disappointing, but provided some fantastic learning opportunities of what a great team looks like.

An extra year under the belt for this young group and added experience in finals will set this group and the club up for season 2019/20.

I would like to thank the other skippers, Gianni and the coaching group for everything you have done to get four competitive sides on the field every Saturday.

Thanks to all the volunteers who gave up their time over the course of the year, the club would cease to function without you and the players are incredibly grateful for your contribution. An extra special thanks must go to Andrew Wilson and Phil Gregson who generously gave up countless hours of their time to help the 2s as we strived to realise our potential. Under 15s Report

The highlight of our batting was a fine 70 off 88 balls by Zak Beattie and the highlight of the game was a scrambled single by Henry Vaughn off the final ball of the game to secure the win!

Unfortunately, we let the next game slip as we were unable to make the key moments go our way. A strong effort with the bat highlighted by 68 from Zak and 55 from Preston Campbell got us to a solid total of 186, but some more urgency during the middle overs could have seen that total pushed beyond 200. Similarly, while we bowled well throughout and held the upper hand at times, we couldn't find the killer blows and Joondalup got home with just an over to spare.

From there we went into T20 mode which was an education for us all. We found Scarborough and Bayswater Morley too strong for us in this format, but we put together a great run chase against Wanneroo only to fall 3 runs short in the final over.

We finally managed to clutch a key moment in the final T20 fixture where a double-wicket maiden in the second last over of the game by Henry Vaughn got us over the line.

Notable performances through these T20 games came from Duncan Bent who scored solid runs at around a run-a-ball throughout and Mani Kalia whose 'death' bowling showed great character and skill.

We then returned to the longer format and duly put together our best batting performance of the season, 197 from 60 overs against a strong Midland-Guildford side. Zak again lead the way with 55, though it could have been so many more, and he was ably supported by Alex Beattie and Duncan Bent who both played beautifully, only for both to be run-out for 49!

Unfortunately, we couldn't control their strong batting line-up the following week and the boys endured a tough morning chasing leather.

The final stanza of our season saw the exit of the PSA boys and opportunities open-up for others in our squad along with some of the boys from the U14s. It was great to see the 'train-on' members of our squad get the opportunity that they had absolutely earned through strong and consistent training performances across the season.

A disciplined bowling effort saw a reward first up for this new-look team as they defended 117 against Centurions. The stand-out performance with the bat was 53 from Blake Davies and the bowlers managed

In what turned out to be the final game of our season, we were hit hard by a strong Willetton team on day one but showed great character to fight it out on day two. More wickets to Jack Beggs and quality batting from James Pampacos and Ethan Barbieri gave proof of their potential and we finished up having the better of the second half of the game.

Overall, it was another season of improvement but also another season of some missed opportunities. Female Coach's report

The SFCC Female Cricket program went from strength to strength in 2018/19. We are fortunate to have an extremely talented and loyal group of players in our Female program and with the club being able to retain the vast majority of players from last season, the expectation for the group was to improve on our results from last year. The group decided to maintain the same values we established last year which are;

- Respect
- Loyalty
- Community
- Ruthlessness
- And most importantly fun

What was to follow was something we believed we could do but knew it would take plenty of hard work. Our players jump almost weekly from T20 to one day games. This along with WNCL, WBBL and Representative cricket means there is a considerable amount of fluidity between grades and teams each week. This is hard on coaches but even tougher on players but to their credit everyone's 'team first' mentality went a long way in ensuring the terrific results we achieved this season.

There were several significant individual and club achievements throughout the season.

The first was that we were one of six inaugural participants in the Premier Girls Youth League (PGYL). This was a leap of faith for the club but one that has already paid dividends through introducing a number of quality young female players to Subi as well as bringing home the first ever PGYL premiership. SFCC has always placed great emphasis on our Colts/Youth programs and to win the Men's Colts, PGYL and finish runners up in the Under 17s holds the club in great stead for the future.

On the senior front, we qualified for all four grand finals across A and B grade. The highlight of the season was finishing on top of the A Grade 50 Over ladder, gaining a home final at Floreat, then rather emphatically, beating Midland to achieve our first A Grade 50 Over Premiership as Subiaco-Floreat. This is a massive achievement for our relatively young club. In this team, the majority of our 12 players were under the age of 23.

We finished second on the ladder in the A and B Grade T20 and the B Grade 40 Over competitions. I'm proud to say the girls fought to the end, however, came up short against deserving Premiers Melville.

At Representative level, Nicole Bolton represented the club at the International level with distinction. Bolts was joined by Co-Captain Emma King, Heather Graham and Megan Banting at state level and throughout the Perth Scorchers WBBL campaign. Heather Graham had the distinction of being named the Domestic Player of the Year, which was deserved recognition for a great season.

SFCC also had six players in the final 15 for the State Under 18s with five going away to the carnival. Millie Monaghan was named Captain of the team. Whilst the team results were below par the contribution of the SFCC players was admirable given they all have at least one more year in the program.

Club History

The Subiaco Floreat Cricket Club was formed in 1977 when the Subiaco and Floreat Park clubs merged. 1900 to 1949

A cricket club in the Subiaco area was first formed in 1896 and played in the Senior Matting Association based at the Shenton Park Lake ground. In 1907-08 the Subiaco Club was admitted to the WACA A Grade competition but after two seasons were relegated to B Grade. During this time the Club moved to the newly developed Mueller Park in Subiaco where at the western end (later Subiaco Oval) they shared the playing fields with the Subiaco Football Club.

In the 1910-11 season, Subiaco combined with fellow B Grade team; Whittaker's and was re-admitted to A Grade as the Subiaco Cricket Club. The following season Subiaco merged with the neighbouring Leederville club to form the Subiaco-Leederville Cricket Club and played under this name until 1930-31, when they reverted to Subiaco Cricket Club.

By this time Mueller Parker had been renamed Subiaco Oval and from 1929-30 the Club enjoyed sustained success winning six premierships in the 17 seasons until 1946-47. Many Subiaco players from this era represented Western Australia, in the days before WA was admitted into the Sheffield Shield competition. Future Prime Minister, R.J. Hawke, played for the Club in the post-war years.

1950 to 1977

The Subiaco Club did not enjoy team success during the 1950's and 1960's finishing runner-up twice and making the finals one other time. The highlight for the Club from this era was Jack Rutherford being the first Western Australian to be selected for Australia on a major tour and the first to be capped when he was included in the Australian side which visited England, India, and Pakistan in 1956. Rutherford's single test was against India in Bombay.

In 1965-66 the Subiaco Club left Subiaco Oval and moved to Rosalie Park on the west side of Thomas Street. Jim Hubble became the Club's second Australian representative, touring South Africa in the summer of 1966-67, playing in nine matches, but not in the Tests. During the 1960's former England player Tony Lock played for the Club.

The Floreat Park Cricket Club was formed in the post-war years. In the 1959-60 season, Floreat Park was admitted into the WACA completion as a 2nd Grade club fielding teams in the lower grades only. Talented Floreat Park juniors seeking to play 1st Grade invariably moved to the neighbouring Subiaco Club. Notable Floreat Park juniors who made the move to Subiaco were Kim Hughes, Terry Alderman and Sam Gannon who all played Tests for Australia.

The recruitment of former Australian player Des Hoare as Captain-Coach in the late 1960's saw the Subiaco Club play in the finals four times in seven years, winning Premierships in 1971-72 and 1973-74. However, while the Subiaco Club was competitive at 1st Grade level, a small district and declining junior player numbers saw the Subiaco Club merge with the 2nd Grade Floreat Park Club. The Club was named Subiaco Floreat Cricket Club and commenced playing in the 1977-78 season.

The last match played between the two clubs was the 1976-77 4th grade grand final where the Subiaco 4th's captained by future President Larry Davies triumphed.



The amalgamation was a true merger with administrators and players from both Clubs sharing the roles. The new Club's headquarters was Floreat Oval, with Rosalie Park retained as the second ground (until 1981) along with Floreat's Alderbury Street Reserve. Subjaco's Lion emblem and gold and maroon colours were combined with the royal blue of Floreat Park, but there was no room for the Floreat Park grey.

1977 to 1999

WA Parliamentarian Ray Young was the inaugural President and Jim Hubble the inaugural Captain of Subiaco Floreat and Terry Alderman returned to Floreat Oval but the first season did not bring instant success. During the following three season the Club were runners-up twice and semi-finalists once, as well as being Club Champions in 1978-79. All-rounder, Graeme Porter played for Australia in the 1979 World Cup.

1st grade success was finally achieved in the 1987-88 where a strong squad including Test players Terry Alderman, Kim Hughes and Tom Hogan alongside present or future 1st class players Giles Bush, Todd Breman and Peter Gonnella won the first 1st grade flag for the amalgamated Club and the ninth overall.

In 1983-84 future cricket broadcaster Glenn Mitchell, captained the Colts undefeated for nine matches to capture the Club's first Colts Premiership.

The 1980's decade was overall successful, in addition to the 1st grade and Colts, the Club also won a 2nd grade and a 3rd grade flag, while the 4^{ths} won a hat-trick of flags under the wily leadership of club stalwart Alan Bolton.

The 1990's were fairly lean for the 1st grade with only three final appearances. However, this decade saw the debut of Bunbury junior, Murray Goodwin, who would go on to play Test cricket for his native Zimbabwe. In 1990-91 all four senior sides qualified for the finals and the Club was once again Club Champion. The lower grades continued to be successful in this decade, the 2^{nds} and 4^{ths} both won two flags each as did the Colts. The 1997-98 Colts were captained by Steven Glew in his first of seven Premierships for the Club.

2000 onwards

The 21st Century began with a bang. Under the inspiring leadership of fast bowler Gavin Swan, the 1st grade team won three successive premierships from 2000-01. The 1^{sts} competed in the finals in eight times in the first decade of the new century. The dominance of the 1st grade team in this period saw the Club also claim the Club Championship in successive seasons 2000-01 and 2001-02. The Colts added three more flags to their collection, while the 3^{rds} with two flags and the 4^{ths} with one continued the success of the lower grade teams. In the One Day Sunday League competition, the Club finally found a winning formula, winning titles in 2004-05 and 2008-09.

Success continued into the 2010's. Under David Bolton the 1st grade did the "double", winning both the Pennant competition and the One Day League in 2010-11. The following season, the Club finished runners-up after losing a close grand final. The 1st grade bowling attack was particularly strong with fast bowlers Nathan Coulter-Nile and Jason Behrendorff operating. Coulter-Nile has gone on to represent both WA and Australia while Behrendorff debuted for WA in 2011.

The 3rd grade won a flag in 2012-13 and in the following season with Noel Knight returning to the Club as Head Coach the 1st grade once again won the Sunday League Championship



2014/15 saw the Club expand when the local WA Female Cricket Council A and B grade teams elected to join Subiaco Floreat. It was a homecoming of sorts, as back in the 1970's the Subiaco men's and women's cricket clubs shared the facilities at Rosalie Park. The ladies made an immediate impact, winning the T20 final at the WACA ground.

Season 2016-17 saw Chris Hansberry lead the First Grade team to a premiership, with gritty victories against top teams Fremantle and Claremont in the semi-finals before a memorable victory over Joondalup in the grand final. Cameron Green also made his debut for Western Australia.

In 2017-18, the Colts competition was changed from a 50 over format to 20 overs. In 2018-19, the Subi-Floreat Colts produced one of the most remarkable performances seen at the WACA. After reaching 9/86 off 20 overs, an inspired spell of opening bowling dismissed Scarborough for 66 and saw the boys bring home the premiership.
