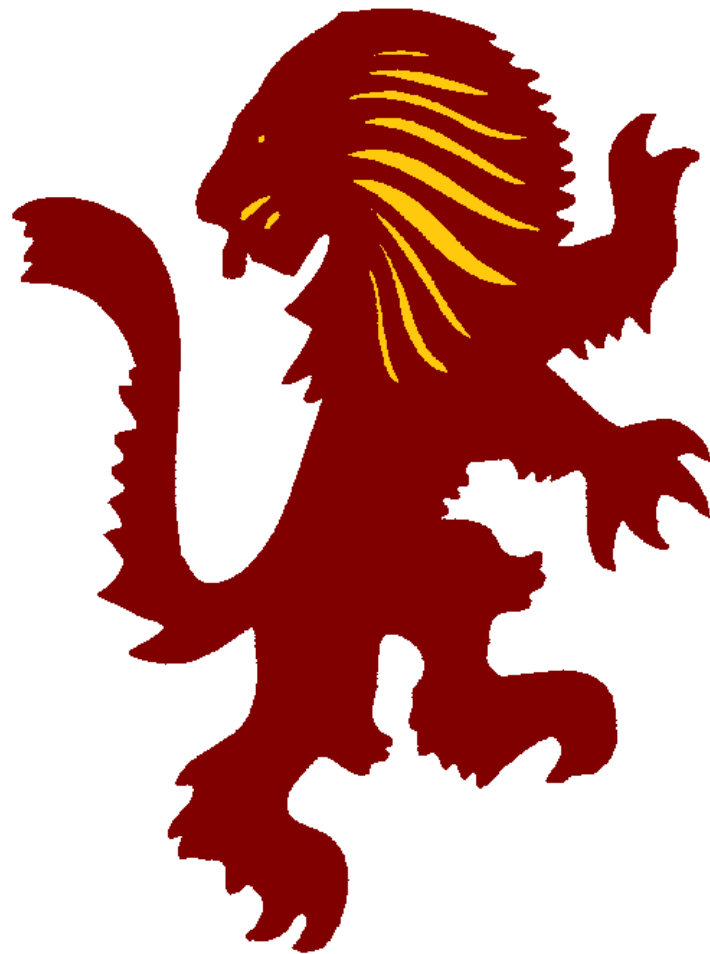

President's Report

We will look back on the 2019/20 season as the season that COVID-19 unfortunately cut short by two weeks, and that the cancellation of the back end of the finals probably deprived us of a few additional premierships. However, on the positive side, we were fortunate to get nearly a full season of cricket completed and were still able to enjoy an extremely successful year for the club.

A major highlight of the year was being recognised as the Number one ranked Premier League Club in Western Australia. This ranking was based on a variety of off field and on field performance measures including strength/skills of the committee, number of volunteers, facilities, finances, quality of coaches, talent development, junior programs, culture/behaviour, female participation, governance, administration and community engagement. This is a fantastic achievement and would not have happened without the significant contribution by the Committee, the Coaches, Managers, the Players and the many other volunteers including parents who help the club in different ways. We can all take credit for this outstanding result and it makes me very proud to be involved in our great club, and I'm sure you will all feel the same way.

Other highlights were the premierships won by the men's T20 colts and 3rd grade teams ably led by Jack Retallack and Tom Moscarda respectively and a 3rd placing in the Club Championships, which was a reflection of the strongest depth of players seen at the club for a number of years. A great effort by all of the players and coaches involved, and it was particularly pleasing to have Wayne Clark join the club as the Head Coach and along with Swanny, played leading roles in setting the tone and direction for the culture, behaviour and performance of the players. It was also great to see the efforts and talent of Jayden Goodwin, Lucas Martin and Michael Hart rewarded with selection in Futures League fixtures. Another highlight occurred when Chris Hansberry broke Steve Glew's games played record for the club. An amazing effort of sustained excellence by Junior who is firmly entrenched in Lion's folklore.

For the female program, it was always going to be tough to match the lofty standards enjoyed in the previous season, and a bad run with injury made it tougher than normal to perform at different times throughout the season. Despite this, the A grade made it to the grand final in the 50 over comp and B grade to the GF of the 20 over comp, and the club provided a number of players for WA's representative teams, with the highlight being 4 of our ladies playing a major part in guiding WA to an inaugural victory in the Woman's National Cricket League. Well done to those ladies. And thanks to Viv Paver who took on the Female Head Coach role and to his devoted assistant Josh Monaghan and to one of the club's best and enthusiastic volunteers, Jordan Brock.

The junior program was once again led very professionally and tirelessly by Andrew Sculthorpe. A successful and enjoyable season culminated in the U/13's team making it to the Grand Final with some very exciting matches along the journey, and many of us were lucky to see the true Subi-Floreat spirit on display when the T20 colts team (who were commencing their flag celebrations) joined the U/14 team to sing the club song together after the 14's had a nail biting 1 run victory at Floreat Oval. A huge thankyou to Richard Hacker, Dave Barbieri, Andrew Sculthorpe, Mike Thacker and the managers for coaching/managing the respective junior teams and for continuing to develop the pipeline of future Lion stars. The female junior program struggled during the season, but it was pleasing to know numbers at the trials for next season were significantly up, and this augurs well for the coming season. A very special thanks to Trina Quadrio, who after many years of putting in an amazing effort as the Junior Co-ordinator administrator is handing over the reins.



And we shouldn't forget the important role our Master's team plays in our club. If you ever want to hear how good a bunch of old Lion's players were back in the day, you should head along to see Larry Davies (our legendary nets captain) and co ply their trade on a Sunday afternoon. These gents are a valuable resource for our club and I plan to further engage this group in the coming season.

One of the off-field initiatives this year was the introduction of the Lion's Leadership Program by Phil Gregson and his Leadership sub-committee. This program is designed to provide our leaders and emerging leaders with some extra skills and tools in this important area and the sessions featuring James McMahon and Adam Gilchrist were both well attended and received. Further sessions are planned next season. In addition, mental health / wellbeing sessions organised by Stu McKenzie were also held and these were very beneficial to both those needing some help and those that would like to offer their help to other club members.

Our very diligent and talented curator, Scott McLean continued to provide first class practice and match wickets despite the continued increase in the amount of cricket played on our grounds. We are extremely fortunate to have these excellent facilities which directly assists the development of our players.

It is also important to recognise the contribution made by our sponsors, the Town of Cambridge, the WACA, Cricket Australia, Revo Fitness, the ARC Group, the Inglewood Hotel, Wembley Settlements and other sponsors who continue to generously support the Club. All of these partners provide significant amounts of funding to the club and we would not exist without them. Given the impact COVID-19 restrictions have had on the revenue generated by a lot of our partners/sponsors, there is a strong possibility that the Club's revenue next season will be significantly lower, and we will be working hard as a Committee and a club to work out how we manage the Club's finances during this difficult time.

Finally, I would like to thank all of the Committee for their efforts and ongoing support. We are very lucky to have a committee full of highly skilled and good people that put in an enormous amount of unpaid work to give the players the best chance of success and enjoyment. I can't thank Stu, Sam, Doss, Scully, Erik, Phil, Willo, Larry, Gary, Rob, Josh, Gus, Jack, Kingy and Johnno enough for their dedicated and selfless service. In particular, it was fantastic to see Doss's years of service to the club recognised at last year's AGM where he was awarded Life Membership.

Although there are ongoing uncertainties relating to COVID-19, both the Committee and coaches are currently working hard and planning ahead on the assumption that the season will start at the normal time, and until we are told otherwise, we encourage all players to do the same. Stay fit and healthy and I look forward to seeing everyone next season.

2nd Grade Report

Firstly, I would like to thank the committee for allowing me the opportunity to skipper in 2019/20, the opportunity to captain a great group of men has been a privilege and something I have thoroughly enjoyed. My message to the group at the start of the year was that we were going to carry a 'club first' ethos to everything we did, make sure we enjoyed our cricket and had a great time together. Every player who featured in 2nd grade over the course of the year bought into this, and they were an absolute pleasure to captain.

We had 24 players filter through the second grade side in season 2019/20, which is a significant number, of these players 11 were aged 21 or under, which is a great sign for the club going forward and hopefully a number of these players make the next step in the coming years.

For the most part the season started really well, losing only two games up to Christmas, which left us sitting in the top 6 and a great opportunity to hit the back end of the year with momentum. It must also be noted that there were two washouts in the first eight matches which halted the momentum and continuity of the side to a certain extent. Despite this there were a number of solid contributors that set the season up for us in the early rounds, a real standout was the emergence of Jack Retallack as a quality all-rounder, Jack stood up on countless occasions with the new ball, which is something we really missed later in the season when he made the step-up to first grade. Jack scored his maiden second grade hundred against Claremont in round 6 and took 17 wickets at an average of 14. Alongside Jack there were a number of quality performances that aided the cause early in the season, young Jamie Collins showed he has great potential to open the batting, highlighted by a match-winning 71 against Mount Lawley in round 8. Another pleasing sign was the emergence of Kiran Prashanth as a quality bowling option, being thrown the ball a number of times in tricky situations and giving his all on every occasion, showcasing his ability to be a good allrounder.

The second half of the season proved to be really disappointing as we dropped off in a number of key areas. We would only manage to win two of the remaining seven games and would miss the top six by a mere six points. Despite not playing at our best we still had two clear-cut opportunities to cement our position in the top six, we lost a match to Scarborough in the final over and would lose to Fremantle in a nail biter by a mere seven runs. This was ultimately a disappointing finish to the season, but it must be noted that there were some pleasing performances, with Bailey Gregson averaging 48 in the final six matches of the year and showing us what we all know he is capable of, which is a great stepping stone to launch into next season. Whilst young Tom Murray and Andy Nicholson both came into the second-grade side later in the season and looked at home and performed well when required.

Going forward it is pivotal that as a batting unit we start to convert some of these quality starts into bigger scores and start to consistently score more than 250 as a side. One area that really dropped off later in the season was our discipline with the ball, which is something as a side we need to regain and work as a bowling unit.

Despite not making the finals this year there were a number of positive signs for the club and hopefully a return to the finals isn't too far away.

I would like to thank the other skippers and the coaching group for everything you have done to get four competitive sides on the field every Saturday.

My simple message to the group at the beginning of the year was to make sure we all trained at match intensity, but to have fun along the way. We reiterated this throughout the year, along with the need to get the 'extras' in to further improve, combined with a quick jokes session before each days play. What was so impressive about this group was that I didn't need to remind them to do these things, they took it on board and wanted to improve not only their own game, but their teammates games. Each time I checked the players involvement at training, they were working on their game. To go with this, there were only a handful of messages I received throughout the season for players unable to make training! All players took on feedback and played their roles really well throughout. Leadership amongst the whole club improved significantly this year and this contributed in many ways to our success. Cricket becomes a lot more enjoyable when you're doing well, so a massive thanks to the boys for working hard, doing the extra's and ultimately creating team success!

Looking back on last year's 3rd Grade report, I outlined a couple of weaknesses – losing wickets in clumps (particularly in the top 6) and failing to get 200 runs on the board. I couldn't remember a game that we lost clumps of wickets, and we went on to average 209 runs per innings this season. Our ability to be patient early and cash in towards the end of the day became the blueprint for many of our games.

Our leading wicket taker was young Andrew Nicholson – 24 wickets at an amazing 9.41 runs per wicket. Nicho was influential throughout the season and played a strong part in our success. At one point, Nicho bowled 34 overs straight, taking 6 wickets and leading us to victory vs Perth. His patience and ability to outsmart the batsmen were really impressive and I have no doubt he will succeed in the higher grades. Well done on a great season, Nicho!

Our leading run scorer was Daniel Wells – 396 runs at 36. Wellsy began in the 4's coming off a knee injury and quickly transitioned into the 3's where he opened the batting. Wellsy was really reliable at the top of the order for us and, along with Tom Wilson, got through some tough periods of play for us! This meant our middle order cashed in – a great example of *playing our roles*. His ever-reliable cut shot was in full force this season, despite the opposition placing numerous fielders in these areas. Well done on a great season, Wellsy!

4th Grade Report

The 19/20 fourth grade season will be remembered as a year unforeseen events denied us the opportunity to achieve our potential.

After sitting 12th on the ladder mid-way through January, an undefeated final four rounds during which we bowled three sides out for under 100 runs, saw us race into finals contention and finish the year in 5th position. The squad was peaking at the right time of year and playing a brand of cricket which was not only fiercely competitive and enjoyable but at a standard that made selection each fortnight a headache for all the right reasons.

As a club we were fortunate enough to have an oversupply of players coming down to training and putting their hand-up for a game. A circumstance which speaks volumes of the positive culture fostered by the players, coaches and committee at the Lions this year. Accordingly, the fourth grade adopted a squad mentality for the year, supporting those who were not playing that week as well as helping one another develop our games and maintain a competitive attitude which allowed for our late charge at the end of the year.

I would like to thank each fourth grade representative for the way they conducted themselves at training and on game day this year, whether it was coming down as a supporter, building new skills such as wicket keeping, throwing balls at training whilst injured or committing to extra sessions during the week.

This season saw a number of players stand up when required and develop their games to new levels. Our bowling stocks presented a luxury of options which were often hard to fit into one team. Stevenson (team high 22 wickets at an average of 15), Massey and Humphryson displayed fantastic control all year, superbly supported by the likes of Jones, Evans, Kavanagh and Crawford. The SFCC women's program for 2019/20 kicked off beautifully, with both grades generating successful outcomes throughout much of October and November. The A grade campaign, which had rested atop the ladder with superior percentage points from rounds one to eight, ended savagely in the final round, where a 3-wicket/2-ball loss to eventual champions South Perth dropped us from 1st to 3rd place and out of the final in one fell swoop. A ruthless reminder for us all that we had work to do in the new year.

The B grade was a weekly force, posting a perfect 10-0 record to advance as favourites to the final. South Perth hosted this bowling-dominated thriller, which was reduced to a super-over following a tie! Our 3 super over runs were overcome on the 4th ball of our fielding over, and despite having spent almost the entire tournament atop the ladders in both grades, we entered the xmas break without a flag.

In January, the squad was severely tested with three serious injuries, and more positively, by the WACA taking a huge percentage of our players for WNCL and the junior national championships. Club History

The Subiaco Floreat Cricket Club was formed in 1977 when the Subiaco and Floreat Park clubs merged.

1900 to 1949

A cricket club in the Subiaco area was first formed in 1896 and played in the Senior Matting Association based at the Shenton Park Lake ground. In 1907-08 the Subiaco Club was admitted to the WACA A Grade competition but after two seasons were relegated to B Grade. During this time the Club moved to the newly developed Mueller Park in Subiaco where at the western end (later Subiaco Oval) they shared the playing fields with the Subiaco Football Club.

In the 1910-11 season, Subiaco combined with fellow B Grade team; Whittaker's and was re-admitted to A Grade as the Subiaco Cricket Club. The following season Subiaco merged with the neighbouring Leederville club to form the Subiaco-Leederville Cricket Club and played under this name until 1930-31, when they reverted to Subiaco Cricket Club.

By this time Mueller Park had been renamed Subiaco Oval and from 1929-30 the Club enjoyed sustained success winning six premierships in the 17 seasons until 1946-47. Many Subiaco players from this era represented Western Australia, in the days before WA was admitted into the Sheffield Shield competition. Future Prime Minister, R.J. Hawke, played for the Club in the post-war years.

1950 to 1977

The Subiaco Club did not enjoy team success during the 1950's and 1960's finishing runner-up twice and making the finals one other time. The highlight for the Club from this era was Jack Rutherford being the first Western Australian to be selected for Australia on a major tour and the first to be capped when he was included in the Australian side which visited England, India, and Pakistan in 1956. Rutherford's single test was against India in Bombay.

In 1965-66 the Subiaco Club left Subiaco Oval and moved to Rosalie Park on the west side of Thomas Street. Jim Hubble became the Club's second Australian representative, touring South Africa in the summer of 1966-67, playing in nine matches, but not in the Tests. During the 1960's former England player Tony Lock played for the Club.

The Floreat Park Cricket Club was formed in the post-war years. In the 1959-60 season, Floreat Park was admitted into the WACA completion as a 2nd Grade club fielding teams in the lower grades only. Talented Floreat Park juniors seeking to play 1st Grade invariably moved to the neighbouring Subiaco Club. Notable Floreat Park juniors who made the move to Subiaco were Kim Hughes, Terry Alderman and Sam Gannon who all played Tests for Australia.

The recruitment of former Australian player Des Hoare as Captain-Coach in the late 1960's saw the Subiaco Club play in the finals four times in seven years, winning Premierships in 1971-72 and 1973-74. However, while the Subiaco Club was competitive at 1st Grade level, a small district and declining junior

player numbers saw the Subiaco Club merge with the 2nd Grade Floreat Park Club. The Club was named Subiaco Floreat Cricket Club and commenced playing in the 1977-78 season.

The last match played between the two clubs was the 1976-77 4th grade grand final where the Subiaco 4th's captained by future President Larry Davies triumphed.

The amalgamation was a true merger with administrators and players from both Clubs sharing the roles. The new Club's headquarters was Floreat Oval, with Rosalie Park retained as the second ground (until 1981) along with Floreat's Alderbury Street Reserve. Subiaco's Lion emblem and gold and maroon colours were combined with the royal blue of Floreat Park, but there was no room for the Floreat Park grey.

1977 to 1999

WA Parliamentarian Ray Young was the inaugural President and Jim Hubble the inaugural Captain of Subiaco Floreat and Terry Alderman returned to Floreat Oval but the first season did not bring instant success. During the following three seasons the Club were runners-up twice and semi-finalists once, as well as being Club Champions in 1978-79. All-rounder, Graeme Porter played for Australia in the 1979 World Cup.

1st grade success was finally achieved in the 1987-88 where a strong squad including Test players Terry Alderman, Kim Hughes and Tom Hogan alongside present or future 1st class players Giles Bush, Todd Breman and Peter Gonnella won the first 1st grade flag for the amalgamated Club and the ninth overall.

In 1983-84 future cricket broadcaster Glenn Mitchell, captained the Colts undefeated for nine matches to capture the Club's first Colts Premiership.

The 1980's decade was overall successful, in addition to the 1st grade and Colts, the Club also won a 2nd grade and a 3rd grade flag, while the 4ths won a hat-trick of flags under the wily leadership of club stalwart Alan Bolton.

The 1990's were fairly lean for the 1st grade with only three final appearances. However, this decade saw the debut of Bunbury junior, Murray Goodwin, who would go on to play Test cricket for his native Zimbabwe. In 1990-91 all four senior sides qualified for the finals and the Club was once again Club Champion. The lower grades continued to be successful in this decade, the 2^{nds} and 4^{ths} both won two flags each as did the Colts. The 1997-98 Colts were captained by Steven Glew in his first of seven Premierships for the Club.

2000 onwards

The 21st Century began with a bang. Under the inspiring leadership of fast bowler Gavin Swan, the 1st grade team won three successive premierships from 2000-01. The 1^{sts} competed in the finals in eight times in the first decade of the new century. The dominance of the 1st grade team in this period saw the Club also claim the Club Championship in successive seasons 2000-01 and 2001-02. The Colts added three more flags to their collection, while the 3^{rds} with two flags and the 4^{ths} with one continued the success of the lower grade teams. In the One Day Sunday League competition, the Club finally found a winning formula, winning titles in 2004-05 and 2008-09.

Success continued into the 2010's. Under David Bolton the 1st grade did the "double", winning both the Pennant competition and the One Day League in 2010-11. The following season, the Club finished runners-up after losing a close grand final. The 1st grade bowling attack was particularly strong with fast



bowlers Nathan Coulter-Nile and Jason Behrendorff operating. Coulter-Nile has gone on to represent both WA and Australia while Behrendorff debuted for WA in 2011.

The 3rd grade won a flag in 2012-13 and in the following season with Noel Knight returning to the Club as Head Coach the 1st grade once again won the Sunday League Championship.

2014/15 saw the Club expand when the local WA Female Cricket Council A and B grade teams elected to join Subiaco Floreat. It was a homecoming of sorts, as back in the 1970's the Subiaco men's and women's cricket clubs shared the facilities at Rosalie Park. The ladies made an immediate impact, winning the T20 final at the WACA ground.

Season 2016-17 saw Chris Hansberry lead the First-Grade team to a premiership, with gritty victories against top teams Fremantle and Claremont in the semi-finals before a memorable victory over Joondalup in the grand-final. Cameron Green also made his debut for Western Australia.

In 2017-18, the Colts competition was changed from a 50 over format to 20 overs. In 2018-19, the Subi-Floreat Colts produced one of the most remarkable performances seen at the WACA. After reaching 9/86 off 20 overs, an inspired spell of opening bowling dismissed Scarborough for 66 and saw the boys bring home the premiership. They then repeated the dose, going back-to-back, with a convincing victory over Claremont in 2019-20.

Regrettably, COVID-19 prevented season 2019-20 holding a complete finals series as the season was called off after the first week of finals. For the Club's First-Grade team this was an unfortunate result as it was poised to challenge for silverware after a powerful victory in week one, while the all-conquering Third-Grade team was crowned premiers after a dominant season under the astute leadership of Tom Moscarda.
