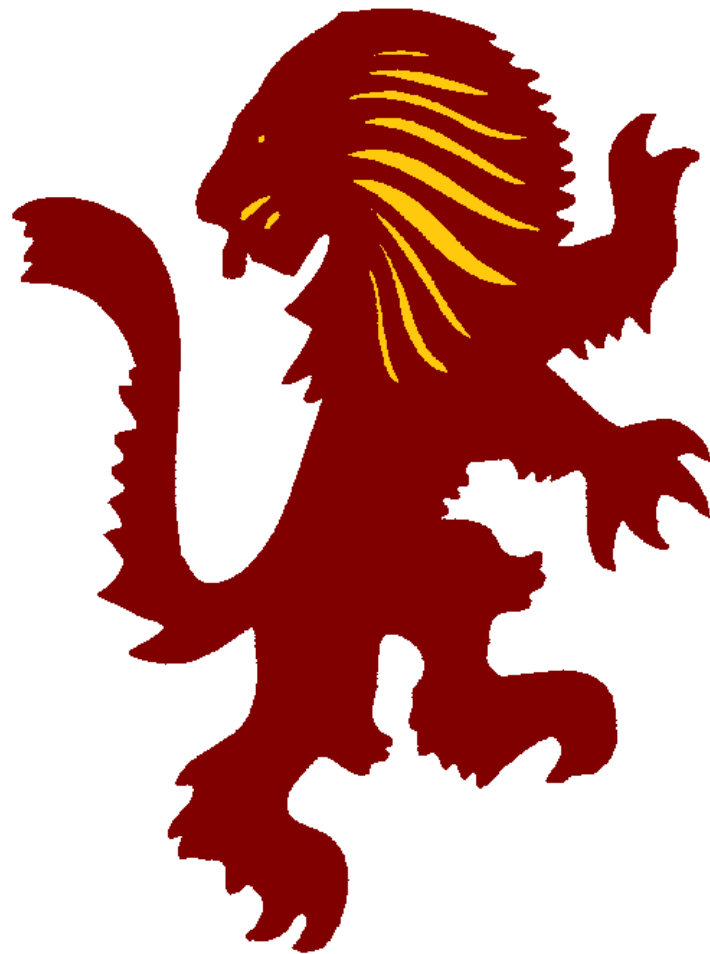

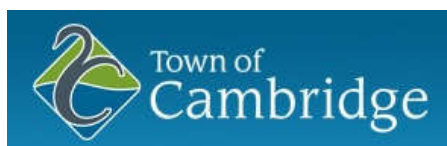

Season 2020/21 was another successful year for the club underpinned by some selfless volunteers, excellent coaching staff and enthusiastic/talented players across all parts of the club. Unlike many competitions around the world, we were fortunate that COVID-19 impacted only a very small portion of the season.

From my perspective, the major highlights of the year were:

- being recognised for at least the 5th year in a row as a Top 3 ranked Premier League Club in Western Australia pursuant to the annual Premier Cricket Development Program survey. A fantastic achievement and a reflection of the wonderful club culture and people that we have.
- the test debut by our own Cam Green who is the first SFCC born and bred male player to play test cricket for Australia since the days of Kim Hughes and Terry Alderman. A great effort by Cam and good luck to him as he embarks on what is poised to be a long and successful career.
- a 4th placing in the Club Championships, which is great effort by all of the players and coaches involved, and a reflection of the good work done by Wayne Clark as the Head Coach and ably supported by Swanny. We continue to strive for our ultimate goal of winning the Club Champs.
- qualifying for the Grand finals in the A Grade women's 50 over, the men's 2nd grade and the U/13 boys' competitions
- a fantastic charity event organised by Tom Wilson whereby we raised approximately a \$1,000 for Youth Focus, and brought the male and female parts of the club closer together
- the commencement of the livestreaming of some of the club's matches
- a vastly improved social media presence thanks to Gus McKenzie

Most of the above highlights happen as a result of work undertaken by our tireless volunteers, and I would like to give special mentions to Jordan Brock (Club Person of the Year) and Andrew Sculthorpe for the work they do in the Female and Junior parts of the club respectively. Also, some more special thanks to Sam Pearce, Stu McKenzie and Dos for the major support they provide to me and the club, to Larry Davies and Frank Collins for looking after the net captaincy for the guys, Phil Gregson for helping out at training with the fielding, Willo Snr for his work on the tongs, and for Greg Catlin who did a fantastic job driving a change of uniform supplier and processes and with the help of Chris Isles, sharpened up the club's style/branding and the way uniforms are managed. And many thanks also to Kim Morcom for taking on the important new role of the club's Child Safety Officer.

Our very loyal curator, Scott McLean continued to provide first class practice and match wickets with his efforts recognised by the 2nd and 6th rankings for Floreat Oval and Alderbury respectively amongst the +32 Premier League pitches. We are extremely fortunate to have these excellent facilities.

1st Grade Report

2nd Grade Report

In cricket, rarely will a side have as successful a season as the SFCC 2nd grade did in 2020/21 and despite ultimately coming second in the season decider, we can all be immensely proud of our performance and the many highlights we enjoyed throughout the campaign.

It is fair to say that this 2nd Grade side set the benchmark for the club this season, both on and off the field and while making the Grand Final was certainly a great measure of our success, equally for me was the feedback I continually received throughout the year about the collective character of our side. This feedback was received from umpires, opposition sides, supporters and players who have correctly identified the unity of our group and the respect with which we display for ourselves, our opposition, our volunteers and our environment. As such, it has been my absolute privilege and pleasure to lead the side this season and I enjoyed the year as much as any I can recall.

On the field, our greatest strength this season was developing a game plan built around pressure. We were able to perfect this throughout the year and despite not being the sexiest of styles it was ultimately a method that stood up when it mattered. It is an absolute credit to our young side that we were able to maintain such long periods of pressure and it is a cornerstone of our game upon which we will continue to develop.

This season saw 24 players play for the 2's including seven debutants in **Callum Stevenson, Nathan Bothma, Kieren Jones, Matthew Sculthorpe, Guy Taylor, Tatenda Makova** and **Ben Massey** who took the route less travelled to make his debut after already having featured in the 1st Grade! Notably **Jason Behrendorff** also made an appearance in the 2's and we look forward to seeing him continue to work on his skills through the off-season and try and break his way back into the side next year!

The start to our season was a strong one and we had some standout performers across the opening rounds. **Tom Wilson** maturely carried his bat for 89no in our opening round win against Mount Lawley while **Kiran Prashanth** made a rapid 74 (including 4 massive sixes!). In round 4, **Ethan Chivers** also carried his bat for an elegant 103no (inc. 10 fours & a six) before **Andrew Nicholson** took 4/28 in a narrow final over loss to Scarborough.

Throughout the opening rounds though, the clear standout was **Ross Williams**. After round five, Ross had taken 10 wickets at an average of 8.40, contributed valuable runs, including 53 in our win against Wanneroo and taken a couple of genuine screamers! Injury stalled Ross' season and he was sorely missed in our side for the remainder of the year, both on the field and in the rooms!

We comfortably accounted for South Perth in Round 7 as **David Lane** (95) and **Ben Parker** (57) starred. I didn't play that game but Dad says it was one super classy innings from Laney!

Round Nine saw the single greatest catch of all time in our match against Rockingham-Mandurah. A huge skier was sent out towards Floreat Forum and running around from deep square leg was **Tom Murray** who had completely misjudged the ball's flight path. Hope was all but lost before Muzz dove full stretch, backwards and plucked the ball from the air with a single hand. Chaos ensued!

We won that match and **Declan Evans** took 4/16 in what would continue a strong run of form from the swing king! Dec had an outstanding season and after forcing his way into the side he consistently gave us a head start with early wickets and dot ball pressure.

Rounds 10 and 11 were huge in the context of our season as we knocked off both Bayswater-Morley and Fremantle who were sitting first and second on the ladder at the time. After restricting Bayswater to 163, we comfortably chased it down thanks largely to **Jack Retallack's** 60 which followed up his 4/28 with the ball.



The following week saw us dominate Fremantle. Muzz (62) and Chiv (102) put on 141 for the first wicket on our way to 254 before we bowled Fremantle out for 150. **Brodee Lockwood** was outstanding with 4/38. A hundred run win against the league leaders had us in great spirits and filled us with real belief!

Round 12 was called off as we went into lockdown on day two of our match against Melville, not before **Angus McKenzie** could take 3/17 from his 26 overs including 16 maidens! Another Retallack masterclass (5/37 & 53) saw us cruise past Joondalup in Round 14 and we finished the year off with another one-day win against Claremont.

And so onto finals...

Each of our three finals were extremely hard-fought contests and the game plan we had perfected throughout the year held up very well. Our first final against Melville was a prime example as we scraped our way to 184 from our 90 overs after a shaky start (5/66). Kiran and Ben each assessed the situation expertly, occupying the crease for extended periods and each compiling crucial 40's before Angus finished the innings off with a dashing 32no.

The following day saw us start very well and apply good early pressure before Melville wrestled back momentum to have the game firmly in the balance at 4/110. Enter The Freak. Thrown the ball and tasked with breaking the game open, Tom Murray obliged taking the remaining 6 wickets (6/24 from 12 overs) and sending us into the second week!

With the A grade women also making the Semi's, we were lucky enough to play our next final at the Spiritual Home of Cricket, Alderbury Reserve. Batting first, we got off to a flyer with Wilson (41) and Chivers (72) putting on 100 before lunch. It was however tough going from then as we consistently lost wickets on our way to 238.

Day 2 was another opportunity to "go to work" as we went about applying sustained pressure. Wickets did not come easy, however we chipped away and kept things tight as the overs began to creep up on Willetton. All of the bowlers bowled well in warm conditions, but the pick was again Angus McKenzie who ended with 6/72 from his 27 overs, leading us to victory with some violently cramping fingers and forearm! Tom Wilson also took 4 catches for the second week in a row, continuing a truly remarkable season behind the stumps. Tom embraced the role in the absence of a recognised keeper, worked hard at it and genuinely excelled.

Finally, to the Grand Final which was to be against Bayswater-Morley on their home deck. Winning the toss for the third week in a row, we batted. As expected, the intensity of the contest was fierce, and runs were not easy to come by as we again lost wickets consistently through the day. At 6/101 things were looking dire before Lane and Murray steadied the ship with a 61 run partnership and some late order heroics from Evans (including a big Dorothy) and Massey, who put on 29 for the last wicket, got us to a competitive 221.

The Bayswater innings the next day followed a remarkably similar path to ours. Both sides had their 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th and 9th wickets fall within 5 runs of each other and indeed it took an identical last wicket partnership of 29 to knock us off. Our spinners again turned the game for us with Angus and Tom each taking 3 wickets from their 20 overs. Ben Massey was huge with the ball and Jack Retallack beat the bat too many times to count during a last ditch, second new ball effort. After never really being in control of the contest, to get ourselves into a winning position was a remarkable feat in itself and having tried everything at the end, we can acknowledge what an amazing game it was and have no regrets.

Finally, our side would like to thank the Club's sponsors, Greg Fitzgerald and the committee, the coaching staff and our supporters. We would also like to acknowledge the special contribution Phil Thompson has made to our side this season in his capacity as Team Statistician (those wagon-wheels are a powerful feedback tool Phil, thank-you). Thank you to Jamie Collins, who was ever present early in the season



despite sporting a moon-boot and to Conor Moldrich for carrying out the warm up duties through our finals campaign. Thank you to Larry Davies and super-sub, Frank Collins, for their efforts throughout the year as Net Captains, Phil Gregson for his mentorship and to club Chef, Andrew Wilson and Sous-Chef, Stuart McKenzie, thank you for feeding us of a Thursday Night and helping to create such a buzz around our club!

These promotions were headlined by Benjamin Massey who made the almost unheard-of, however exceptionally well earned, leap from 4th grade to 1st grade cricket, and Callum Stevenson who started the year in 2nd grade.

In total 5 mainstays of the 20/21 4th grade side did not see a game of 4th grade during the year and a further 6 were selected in higher grades throughout the year. These numbers are a testament to the work ethic of our young players and represents what an exciting the future the club has as a whole.

Female Coach's report

The SFCC Lionesses had an inconsistent year. The A grade side stood out in the longer format, topping the 50-over table to qualify for the Grand Final for the second time in two years. Unfortunately, a hundred by WA and Midland-Guildford captain Chloe Piparo was too much to overcome in the final, hosted at Floreat Oval. The T20 title was evenly contested, and after starting particularly well, we lost our last three matches to fall one win short of the final.

As ever, Nicole Bolton was consistently superior to the competition, amassing 618 runs at 154.5 this summer. Between this, her effective off-breaks and electric fielding, she was a deserving winner of the Karen Read medal for the competitions' best player. Jacqueline Naidoo further legitimised an opinion widely considered that she is the best amateur seamer in the competition with 19 wickets. Jacqui earned selection into both the WACA's team of the year, and the U19s' tour of South Australia in April.

The primary challenge for our A grade side in the short term is establishing and owning a brand of cricket that is repeatable and effective when our contracted players are absent. There have been glimpses of this through the season, most notably in a 50-over match vs South Perth, where captain Olivia Purnell led an assertive batting effort which saw 8 of 9 batters used contribute double figures toward a total of 8/219. Characterised by proactive batting, commitment to strokes, and assertive running, this innings should serve as a blueprint for our brand. This will take courage at an individual level, coupled with a psychologically safe environment we have worked to cultivate. Talent is not a barrier to consistent results – rather timidity is the genesis of our troubles.

Our B grade side valiantly endured a difficult season in which we won just 4 games. Captain Lizzy Alderson's leadership was paramount in ensuring we competed despite fielding highly inexperienced teams throughout much of the year. Lizzy was named in the WACA team of the year as wicket-keeper, and although consistently impactful at the crease, averaging 28 and 30 in the two match formats, her service to the club perennially through the summer in myriad forms requires special acknowledgement, thank you Lizzy! The consistent on-field contributions and development of Yi Shan Lim was also a highlight from an otherwise frustrating B grade season.

The primary challenge for the B grade is in the consistency of the playing group. With several youth league players eligible for senior cricket next season, the club is finally poised to enjoy some depth in the near future - the light at the end of a long tunnel which has plagued our consistency across the past two seasons. The rest of the T20 season was perhaps slightly disappointing as we failed to capitalise on some solid batting performances, being unable to take enough wickets, or restrict the opposition from scoring. However, we have a young squad, and the girls continued to develop their skills and presence, and more importantly build friendships and began to embody the Subiaco-Floreat spirit.

After the holiday break, we were back into one day cricket. Some unfortunate scheduling of the first round, combined with some injuries to key players meant we were short of players and so had to fill the squad with a number of new girls. They all performed with great spirit, but unfortunately suffered a heavy defeat to Midland-Guildford, the eventual Premiers.

Another difficult loss in round 2, but then the return of some more experienced players saw the team start to bat more cohesively and put some more pressure on opposition batters. We got our first win in Round 4 down at Lark Hill, with captain Charis Bekker scoring a magnificent 60* after taking 3/8 earlier in the day.

There were plenty of individual highlights throughout the season: Abigail McIlveen taking 3/4 and 3/12 in the T20 season. Olivia McSweeney and Erin Classen formed a good opening partnership in the T20 season, top scoring 28 and 34 respectively. Holly Appleby had a couple of great performances with the ball, with a 2/2 off 2, and a 3/19 later in the season, Evelyn Brock was consistent throughout, picking up 2 wickets on a number of occasions.

In the One Day season Charis scored a couple of 30's, along with her 60*. She batted particularly well with Kate Johnson who supported her partner with smart batting and good running. Kate also chipped in with the ball, picking up a few wickets throughout the season.

The end of season awards night saw the batting award go to Charis Bekker for scoring 200 runs at 28.6, and the bowling award went to Evelyn Brock for taking 13 wickets at 13.1. The coaches' awards went to Olivia McSweeney, and the Emerging Lioness award went to Kate Johnson.

Jen Appleby was magnificent and tireless as Team Manager during the T20 season, and Julia Young stepped into the role admirably in the One Day season. I'd like to thank both Sophie Kalia and Andrew Sculthorpe for all of their hard work and support throughout the season, and also the Club Committee for being such strong advocates of Female Cricket.

On a personal note, this was my last year coaching the Youth League team, after three years. Winning the inaugural Youth League Premiership in 2018/2019 was definitely a highlight (the memory of the girls singing the club song after the final will live long in my heart). However, I think that the way that the squad has formed into a great group of friends, both new and old, has been the most important memory

Club History

The Subiaco Floreat Cricket Club was formed in 1977 when the Subiaco and Floreat Park clubs merged.

1900 to 1949

A cricket club in the Subiaco area was first formed in 1896 and played in the Senior Matting Association based at the Shenton Park Lake ground. In 1907-08 the Subiaco Club was admitted to the WACA A Grade competition but after two seasons were relegated to B Grade. During this time the Club moved to the newly developed Mueller Park in Subiaco where at the western end (later Subiaco Oval) they shared the playing fields with the Subiaco Football Club.

In the 1910-11 season, Subiaco combined with fellow B Grade team; Whittaker's and was re-admitted to A Grade as the Subiaco Cricket Club. The following season Subiaco merged with the neighbouring Leederville club to form the Subiaco-Leederville Cricket Club and played under this name until 1930-31, when they reverted to Subiaco Cricket Club.

By this time Mueller Park had been renamed Subiaco Oval and from 1929-30 the Club enjoyed sustained success winning six premierships in the 17 seasons until 1946-47. Many Subiaco players from this era represented Western Australia, in the days before WA was admitted into the Sheffield Shield competition. Future Prime Minister, R.J. Hawke, played for the Club in the post-war years.

1950 to 1977

The Subiaco Club did not enjoy team success during the 1950's and 1960's finishing runner-up twice and making the finals one other time. The highlight for the Club from this era was Jack Rutherford being the first Western Australian to be selected for Australia on a major tour and the first to be capped when he was included in the Australian side which visited England, India, and Pakistan in 1956. Rutherford's single test was against India in Bombay.

In 1965-66 the Subiaco Club left Subiaco Oval and moved to Rosalie Park on the west side of Thomas Street. Jim Hubble became the Club's second Australian representative, touring South Africa in the summer of 1966-67, playing in nine matches, but not in the Tests. During the 1960's former England player Tony Lock played for the Club.

The Floreat Park Cricket Club was formed in the post-war years. In the 1959-60 season, Floreat Park was admitted into the WACA completion as a 2nd Grade club fielding teams in the lower grades only. Talented Floreat Park juniors seeking to play 1st Grade invariably moved to the neighbouring Subiaco Club. Notable Floreat Park juniors who made the move to Subiaco were Kim Hughes, Terry Alderman and Sam Gannon who all played Tests for Australia.

The recruitment of former Australian player Des Hoare as Captain-Coach in the late 1960's saw the Subiaco Club play in the finals four times in seven years, winning Premierships in 1971-72 and 1973-74. However, while the Subiaco Club was competitive at 1st Grade level, a small district and declining junior



player numbers saw the Subiaco Club merge with the 2nd Grade Floreat Park Club. The Club was named Subiaco Floreat Cricket Club and commenced playing in the 1977-78 season.

The last match played between the two clubs was the 1976-77 4th grade grand final where the Subiaco 4th's captained by future President Larry Davies triumphed.

The amalgamation was a true merger with administrators and players from both Clubs sharing the roles. The new Club's headquarters was Floreat Oval, with Rosalie Park retained as the second ground (until 1981) along with Floreat's Alderbury Street Reserve. Subiaco's Lion emblem and gold and maroon colours were combined with the royal blue of Floreat Park, but there was no room for the Floreat Park grey.

1977 to 1999

WA Parliamentarian Ray Young was the inaugural President and Jim Hubble the inaugural Captain of Subiaco Floreat and Terry Alderman returned to Floreat Oval but the first season did not bring instant success. During the following three seasons the Club were runners-up twice and semi-finalists once, as well as being Club Champions in 1978-79. All-rounder, Graeme Porter played for Australia in the 1979 World Cup.

1st grade success was finally achieved in the 1987-88 where a strong squad including Test players Terry Alderman, Kim Hughes and Tom Hogan alongside present or future 1st class players Giles Bush, Todd Breman and Peter Gonnella won the first 1st grade flag for the amalgamated Club and the ninth overall.

In 1983-84 future cricket broadcaster Glenn Mitchell, captained the Colts undefeated for nine matches to capture the Club's first Colts Premiership.

The 1980's decade was overall successful, in addition to the 1st grade and Colts, the Club also won a 2nd grade and a 3rd grade flag, while the 4ths won a hat-trick of flags under the wily leadership of club stalwart Alan Bolton.

The 1990's were fairly lean for the 1st grade with only three final appearances. However, this decade saw the debut of Bunbury junior, Murray Goodwin, who would go on to play Test cricket for his native Zimbabwe. In 1990-91 all four senior sides qualified for the finals and the Club was once again Club Champion. The lower grades continued to be successful in this decade, the 2^{nds} and 4^{ths} both won two flags each as did the Colts. The 1997-98 Colts were captained by Steven Glew in his first of many Premierships for the Club.

2000 onwards

The 21st Century began with a bang. Under the inspiring leadership of fast bowler Gavin Swan, the 1st grade team won three successive premierships from 2000-01. The 1^{sts} competed in the finals eight times in the first decade of the new century. The dominance of the 1st grade team in this period saw the Club also claim the Club Championship in successive seasons 2000-01 and 2001-02. The Colts added three more flags to their collection, while the 3^{rds} with two flags and the 4^{ths} with one continued the success of the lower grade teams. In the One Day Sunday League competition, the Club finally found a winning formula, winning titles in 2004-05 and 2008-09.

Success continued into the 2010's. Under David Bolton the 1st grade did the "double", winning both the Pennant competition and the One Day League in 2010-11. The following season, the Club finished runners-up after losing a close grand final. The 1st grade bowling attack was particularly strong with fast



bowlers Nathan Coulter-Nile and Jason Behrendorff operating. Coulter-Nile has gone on to represent both WA and Australia while Behrendorff debuted for WA in 2011 and subsequently represented Australia.

The 3rd grade won a flag in 2012-13 and in the following season with Noel Knight returning to the Club as Head Coach the 1st grade once again won the Sunday League Championship.

2014/15 saw the Club expand when the local WA Female Cricket Council A and B grade teams elected to join Subiaco Floreat. It was a homecoming of sorts, as back in the 1970's the Subiaco men's and women's cricket clubs shared the facilities at Rosalie Park. The ladies made an immediate impact, winning the T20 final at the WACA ground.

Season 2016-17 saw Chris Hansberry lead the First Grade team to a premiership, with gritty victories against top teams Fremantle and Claremont in the semi-finals before a memorable victory over Joondalup in the grand final. Cameron Green also made his debut for Western Australia and in 2020 made his test debut for Australia.

In 2017-18, the Colts competition was changed from a 50 over format to 20 overs. In 2018-19, the Subi-Floreat Colts produced one of the most remarkable performances seen at the WACA. After reaching 9/86 off 20 overs, an inspired spell of opening bowling dismissed Scarborough for 66 and saw the boys bring home the premiership. They then repeated the dose, going back-to-back, with a convincing victory over Claremont in 2019-20.
