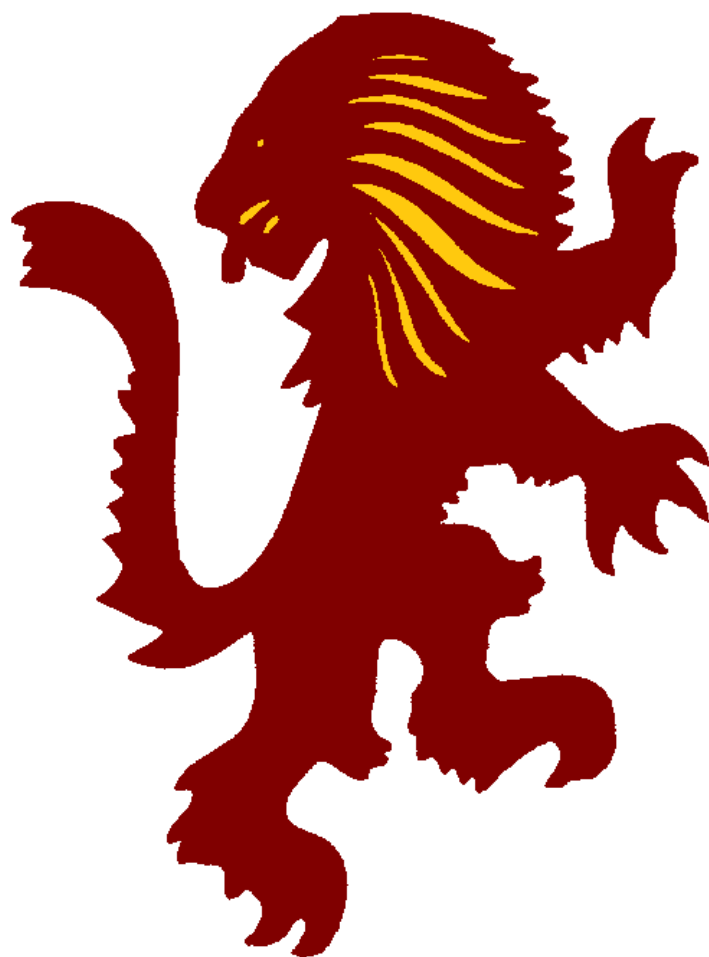

President's Report

The 2010/11 was a fantastic year for the Lions both on and off the field.

Without doubt our First Grade side set the standard, not just for the Club but for District Cricket in general. It was a terrific performance to win both the one day and two day competitions and to be the First Grade Minor Premiers.

As I mentioned at the end of last season, this was going to be one of significant change, with a change of coach and a change of first grade skipper for starters. The approach to the season with a strong emphasis on physical conditioning certainly paid dividends, especially early in the season.

Other changes which paid dividends were the appointment of Brett Bowker as Club Coach, the strengthening of the role of Chairman of Selectors and the appointment of Dan O'Regan to this role and the appointment of David Bolton as First Grade Captain. I believe that it was also significant that the Committee enunciated as its goal the development of future State and National Players. We believe that premierships and club championships will flow if we are achieving that goal.

From my point of view I was fortunate to watch a lot of good cricket but none gave me more satisfaction than seeing our players play some good hard cricket to prevail over good opponents or get ourselves out of tough situations. It says a lot about the character of the players representing the Club.

Our Second Grade side fought back well at the end of the season to again make the finals and acquitted themselves well. The Third Grade were thereabouts but let too many close ones slip. We saw a lot of talented players show something of their ability with both bat and ball but we really need a more consistent effort from them. The Fourth Grade again blooded a lot of young players and although they didn't have a lot of success we are hopeful that the experience gained will help us perform strongly over the coming years.

The Junior sides again performed admirably given the limited pool of players we have to draw on. Without doubt a stand out feature of our Club is the way the juniors are organised and coached. I owe a special thanks to all the parents, coaches, managers and senior players who contributed to the effort.

A major disappointment for the season was the Colts Competition. To see it changed into a knockout competition instead of a round robin was very disappointing. It has been a competition which has helped develop many of our successful First Grade players over the last two decades. The Committee has fought hard to have the competition reinstated in a more appropriate format for the coming season.

The Club owes Jane O'Brien a very special thank you for the terrific job she did in getting our finances sorted out leaving us in a strong financial position. It is a hard job getting a voluntary organisation to adhere to the rigours needed to ensure all funds are accounted for correctly and all activities are planned in a way that ensures financial sustainability. She has moved us a long way towards our objectives in this area. While talking about finances our position has been enhanced by the strong work of Dan O'Regan, Simon Heyting, Jane and Glyn O'Brien and others in securing a strong sponsor base both for our Junior sides and the Senior Club. This is a terrific outcome for the Club.



Finally I wish to thank all those involved in making the Club an enjoyable social venue and one which is respected by opposition teams when they visit. Jim Ryan continues to provide a great service when WACA sponsored matches are played at our ground, the Sansalones who continue to run an amazing kitchen that produces terrific lunches and much sort after dinners and our players have organised terrific social functions.

All these events and contributors help to make this a great Club. Our challenge is to provide the guidance and stewardship to keep it as a great club as we again will face changes, especially in the Committee structure.

I cannot leave this report without thanking Steve Petsos and Dan O'Regan for their strong support over a number of years, both on and off the field. They are moving on to other parts of their lives and we wish them well but still hope to see them around the Lion's Den.

1st Grade Report

The 2010/11 season for the first grade side was a memorable one. The side played total of 20 matches, winning 15, drawing 1 and losing 4 which culminated in a Minor Premiership, One-Day Premiership, Retravision Shield and the joint Olly Cooley Medallist. The rewards achieved were a testament not only to the skill and effort of the 18 players who represented Subiaco Floreat at first grade level during the year but to the support we received from everyone at the club including the playing group, coaching staff, committee, family and friends.

Our season started slowly as we struggled to settle on a line-up for our first match against a strong Fremantle side, a game we fought hard in but lost after putting ourselves in a winning position. We started slowly again against Gosnells but a flawless run chase gave our season a kick start and we were then able to play some outstanding one day cricket to win 4 matches in a row. Our season now had some momentum.

We would remain undefeated through to the Christmas break which was a great effort by everyone involved as we had people moving in and out of the team over that period but still managed to play consistently good cricket for longer than our opposition. Our one day cricket was particularly good during this period and was characterised by disciplined bowling, excellent fielding and well structured (in general) run chases.

Highlights over this period included a great hundred from Tim Monteleone in the Gosnells run chase, a couple of 5-fors from Tom Moscarda at Rockingham and Scarborough, a match winning effort from Aaron Lilly against Mt Lawley, a club record score from Dave Bandy and a club record 3rd wicket stand with Steve Glew against Midland (Glew also got a ton) and a classy 70 from Chris Hansberry against Wanneroo on a tough wicket. We had given ourselves an opportunity to push hard for finals glory post Christmas.

We began the post Christmas phase with a tough draw against South Perth, a game which we dominated, then won three on the trot including a hard fought top of the table clash against Bayswater Morley and our one-day semi-final against Joondalup. Then, as is generally the case as the season takes its toll we lost 2 games in a row, each being winnable, before we comfortably beat Perth in the last round to secure the Minor Premiership.

During this period standout performances included centuries from Glew and Bandy versus South Perth and University respectively, Monteleone and Hansberry's bowling against University, Hansberry's all-round performance against Claremont and Melville in a row, Bandy and Jason Behrendorff's bowling against Perth and Jimmy Sansalone's knack of getting important wickets. The major highlight however, was winning the clubs 3rd one-day premiership. We played well in both the semi-final and final, defeating two strong teams with superb batting, bowling and fielding performances with contributions from Bandy, Nathan Coulter-Nile, Anthony Murphy and Alex Malcolm deserving particular mention together with Vin Sandhu's outrageous catch.

Having conquered the one-day realm, we now had the finals of the Retravision Shield to contest. Finishing on top gave us a double chance, which we made use of after losing to Joondalup in our first final. We never really got going in this match and continued the clubs poor success rate in the first week of the finals.



We faced South Perth in the Semi-Final and batted first on a wicket the skipper thought would be a little tough early but flatten out. Having slumped to 5 for 70, Behrendorff and Murphy set about a partnership that, with the aid of the tail, would give us something to bowl at. In the field, our bowling, fielding and pressure were of the highest level, and when the last South Perth wicket fell, we were into a grand final. Behrendorff and Bandy were the stars with the ball.

The final at the WACA was a fantastic game of cricket to be involved in. Having won the toss and elected to bat, the boys batted our allocation of 112 overs amassing a score of 393 for 6, highlighted by magnificent centuries from Malcolm, who batted the entire first day, and Glew. Feeling pretty confident we had a winning score, we proceeded to chase some leather as Willetton made a great fist of the run chase. All the boys bowled and fielded with everything they had, and led by Coulter-Niles's 5-for we manage to hold on for a draw and secure the Retravision Shield, a great achievement and well deserved given our season.

Although the team had a fantastic year collectively, it would be remiss of me not to mention the individual performance of David Bandy. Bands had, quite simply, the greatest first grade season of all time in which he broke records with the bat, bowled match winning spells with the ball, fielded at an elite level and won the Olly Cooley Medal. His drive to get us over the line in the final moments of the grand final exemplified how passionate he is about the guys he plays cricket with and the club and people he plays for. It's a credit to him. Thanks Bands.

During the season Tom Moscarda, Joel Heyting, Andrew Holder, Nathan Coulter-Nile and Simon Heyting all debuted. Congratulations lads and let's hope they are the first of many games played for the Lions in first grade.

I would like to thank all the players who played first grade this year for your support and understanding, and in particular my vice captain Alex Malcolm who was my sounding board all year and someone who provided vital feedback on all facets of the game. Also, a big thankyou to Brett Bowker who did a great job in his first season of coaching, introducing a level of professionalism to our preparation that enabled us to have a full strength squad to pick from in the finals.

Finally I would like to thank Brett, Dano and all the captains for the assistance this year, it was greatly appreciated. To Larry, Frank and their committee, thanks for all your support during the year and the opportunity to captain the first grade side, an honour I will be eternally grateful for. To Phil Thompson on the scorebook, Tony Cranstoun as net captain and manager, my old boy on the scoreboard, Russ on the ice baths, Dom and Sue in the kitchen and Petsy on the bar and everyone that I have missed, a big thanks, it was greatly appreciated.

It was a pleasure to be involved in such a successful year for the club, and I look forward to celebrating future successes.

2nd Grade Report

It was a year on unknown's for the second grade side leading into the 2010/11 season and collectively we really didn't know what to expect. Having finished the previous year with one of the stronger sides in the competition, the winter saw six of these players from our final 11 not committing to the Lion's den 2010/11. The club further experienced changes through a new coach, new selection committee and new A grade captain. With such a large turnover of quality players the expectations of what our second grade may achieve through the season was hard to determine.

The benefit of having the turnover that we did was that it provided an avenue for a group of players to gain exposure to a level of cricket through which they had yet to play. There was no bigger example of this than our bowling attack for round 1; Eales, Galatti, O'Regan and Syme all debuted. Providing this exposure is one thing, but having playing a group that absorbed the requirements to succeed at this level went a long way defining the season.

Throughout the year we had a number of individual performances that require special mention:

- Kim Manolas twice scored hundreds with one being 187 against Melville in Round 14;
- Noddy Holder batted through the day for 174 not out against Midland;
- Ben Hansberry and Stef Collins both scored hundreds against Wanneroo;
- Simon Heyting took 5 wickets in an innings on three consecutive occasions;
- Nic Syme took 5 wickets in an innings against Perth in the last round;
- Aaron Lily showed with both the bat and the ball he is a match winner with 85 against Baysie during the year then taking 5/21 in the first final;
- And not surprisingly Tom Moscarda took 2 five wicket hauls from the 3 games he played.

The most pleasing aspect of these performances from my perspective is they highlighted the depth of talent displayed by the guys in the second grade was spread among all players.

From a team perspective the attitude from which we approached games ensured we were able to finish the year in the manner we did. We won 8 of our 11 games leading into the finals, in that however we lost a game by 3 runs, another by 1 wicket and drew with the opposition 9 down in another. This approach allowed for a successful first final against Bayswater in a game of cricket in which we were made to fight for the win from the outset.

I believe the biggest indication of our success was unfortunately the feeling that having lost to Scarborough in the semi we had underachieved. The evolution of our expectations from an unknown at seasons beginning to that of premiership contenders highlights the success that we experienced this year. It is something that we can all be proud of.

I would also like to congratulate the A grade on a season of pure dominance capturing two flags and being minor premiers. I would like to thank Simba, Benny, and Tony for their help in captaining the side this year, along with all the guys who made the job another good experience for me.



Lastly the game of cricket provides many opportunities, but really only in this atmosphere at this club will you meet people like Dom and Sue, Tony Cranstoun, Bowks, HotDog, Larry, Phil, Petsy and understand how much they enhance the experiences of playing this game. Thank you to you guys for everything you have done this year and thanks to everyone involved at the club.

3rd Grade Report

The 3's started their 2010/11 campaign as reigning premiers. Absent from the premiers side for the start of the season were: Luke McShane the premiers skipper on a world trip, SFCC immortal Vincent Rule, retired, Davinder Sandhu, Promotion to 1st grade wicketkeeper, Thomas Moscarda, man of the match in the Grand Final, 1's & 2's, Ian Hyland, retired, Nick Partridge, retired, Joel Heyting, - 2's & 1's, Daniel Barnes, work commitments and Perry Colyer, 2's. The surviving 2 were Gianni Di Rosso, promoted to captain and David Colin-Thome. Needless to say it was impossible to replace that amount of talent and experience from a side that scored over 300 in every final from 2009/10.

Some of the season's highlights were;

In round 2 against Gosnells, Mitch De Barro carried his bat in an outstanding innings of 171 not out (in a total of 6/280) in one of the best innings I've seen by a 17 year old. The bowlers all contributed to roll Gosnells for 169 in 53 disciplined overs.

The round 3 match against Rockingham-Mandurah had many highlights and was one of the great wins the players will ever experience. On a lightning outfield we were bowled out with 19 overs still available to us for 276. Emo 63 and 1st gamer Alex Blofield 40 from England took the shine off the new ball. Then Dos belted a rapid 52 & 3 wickets fell on 219. Roy & Muddy then had a 10th wicket stand of 57 which proved invaluable. R/M was 1/64 at stumps. Day 2 saw R/M bat well to be 2/177 with still 47 overs to face. 113 runs were scored off 38 overs for only 1 wicket. Then R/M lost 7 for 13 due to J. Hart's 5 for 60 and Albany talent Rohan Quain executing Dos's plea to hit the batsman on their toes. 6 of the next 7 wickets were LBW's and R/M in 7 incredible overs was reduced to 9/190. The young Lions had played their part in a miracle!

Emerson Walker made his maiden century with a chanceless 103 in the round 5 match against Midland Guilford. It was a superb display from an opening batsman and keeper with a bright future.

The highlight of the round 6 defeat to Wanneroo, saw Pez Coyler, who can bowl, take his first 5 wicket haul taking 5/51 of the 6 wickets to fall.

In the one day against South Perth Pez Coyler after regaining his confidence with the ball against Wanneroo, compiled 78 in an innings we expect from Pez, such is his batting talent, but our total of 167 was enough to win the game.



The Grand Final re-match saw Dos win the toss & bat. SFCC at 2 for 2 saw Mala & Pez grind out a 30 over partnership putting on 67. The 3's had the luxury of Dorf playing as a bat and he batted for 51 overs and made 88 not out. SFCC fought out the day and made 218, a gutsy effort after a nightmare start. BMCC at 2/39 looked shaky. Enter the late great John De Celis who peeled off a signature century and guided his team to victory. Always a thorn in SFCC's side throughout his career he left this world a premiership captain, a true gentleman, husband & father. Tragic end for a great leader & cricketer, he'll be sorely missed.

Against University in another one dayer, Mala was finally rewarded after spending hours in the middle for small starts & his free flowing stroke play was again on display. He batted for 36 overs for 51 on a day everyone else literally couldn't stand the extreme heat and we compiled 172.. Uni couldn't lay bat on ball and were rolled for 96 with Pez taking his 2nd 5 wicket haul & Dos cleaning up the tail.

The round 11 match had a thrilling finish that saw the Lions humble Claremont after coming back from the dead. Stocko, O'Regan, Dos & Symsey bowled tight lines to restrict Claremont to 175 but we slumped to 3/41 by stumps in darkness. The entire ground was in shadow and Dos pleaded bad light, the umpire was unmoved. Day 2 saw 2 wickets fall in the first 2 overs, Subi were 5/44. Dan Barnes was outstanding batting 70 overs for 65 runs. With him was Oregano who finally made some runs (61) and listened to his more experienced partner. In the final match with nothing but pride to play for and Barney (57) & O'Regan (37) helped post 168 after being 4/44. Story of the 3's season - the top 6 with its youth & raw talent sadly lacked consistency while the bowlers put the team in winning positions restricting the opposition to less than 200 on most occasions. The last game was the team's worst bowling effort which was more frustration at our batsmen not standing up.

In Conclusion it was a season of extreme highs followed by depressing lows in the following fixture. Ah the youth of today- opinions of them don't change as each generation passes by. They will seldom listen to old timer's advice until the day they reach that old timer's age and the cycle will repeat infinitely!

It's magic though when youth occasionally realises the basic plan, executes it and crushes the opposition.

Club History

The Subiaco Cricket Club was admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association in 1907 and was formed from the remnants of a mercantile cricket club based at Whittaker's timber mill in Subiaco. The Club played originally at Subiaco Oval before re-locating to Rosalie Park in the 1960's. Some of the better-known Subiaco players were Johnny Rutherford, Jim Hubble, Des Hoare and former Prime Minister Bob Hawke.

The Floreat Park Cricket Club was founded in 1956 and admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association as a 2nd Grade Club. The most famous players to be produced by the Floreat Park Club were Australian Test players Kim Hughes and Terry Alderman who both went to the Subiaco Club to play 1st grade cricket before returning to Floreat Oval when the two clubs merged.

The Subiaco-Floreat Cricket Club was founded in 1977 as a result of the amalgamation between the Subiaco Cricket Club and the Floreat Park Cricket Club and commenced playing in the 1977/78 season. Ray Young was the inaugural President and Paul Nicholls the inaugural 1st Grade Captain.

Since the amalgamation the Club has produced from within its own ranks, many 1st class representatives including Glenn Hughes, Giles Bush, Todd Breman, Gavin Swan, Michael Clark, Steven Glew and Murray Goodwin.

In season 2000/01, the Club won the Club Championship by a margin of 300 points. This was the largest winning margin on record. In 2001/02, the Club became the first club since 1982/83 to win successive 1st Grade Premierships, the first club since 1986/87 to win successive Club Championships and the only club in the history of the WACA competition to win successive 1st Grade Premierships and Club Championships and at the same time.

In season 2002/03 the Club won a third successive 1st Grade Premiership. This was only the third time in WACA history that a club has won three successive 1st Grade Premierships; the previous occurrence was back in 1924/25. In 2004/05, the club won the Sunday League one-day competition for the first time since it began in 1978/79.

In 2005/06, the club had a distinguished season, being the only club with all four grades making the semi-finals and, in what is probably a national first, all four captains losing the toss on rain-affected wickets (Richie Benaud would receive a frosty welcome if he was to repeat the quote below). The club was also the runner-up in the club championship and we were semi-finalists in both the Sunday League and Colts competitions, whilst our Juniors took the flag in the U/17 competition.

In addition, the umpires awarded champion bowler Sam Howman the prestigious Olly Cooley Medal as fairest and best in the WACA competition and awarded the club the Lords Taverners' Spirit of Cricket Award on the basis of points for each match in every grade throughout the season. Previous Subiaco-Floreat Olly Cooley medallists since it was first awarded in 1976-77 have been Kevin Sharp, who won it in 1980-81, and Brian 'Big Bird' Raven, who won it in 1989-90.

Also in 2005/06, Chris Hansberry was awarded the 2005/06 WA Media Guild prize as State U/19 Cricketer of the Year and Adam Bolton was awarded the JP Robbins Medal as the Second Grade Cricketer of the Year, determined by umpires' votes in a similar manner to the Olly Cooley medal. In the Juniors, Tim Monteleone took the WACA Junior Cricketer of the Year Award and Jimmy Sansalone won the WACA U/17's Cricketer of the Year and WACA bowling aggregate and averages trophies.
