

COACH'S REPORT

The 1993/94 season marked an overall improvement in the club's standing in the WACA competition. To finish fifth in the club championship was no reason to pop the Moet, but compared to the previous season it was encouraging to see the players had, to some degree, become fed up of losing.

I thank him for instilling some much-needed mental toughness on the field through his example, and wish him well in his future pursuits.

In the same category of hard-nosed competitiveness was Brian Raven who also decided to retire as a player at the end of 1993/94. Brian's feats in A Grade last season were marvellous and he certainly helped the A Grade players to "back themselves". I wish you good things for the future Bird.

To the committee, many thanks for your support in 1993/94, and I'm positive the players appreciated your work behind the scenes.

FIRST GRADE CAPTAINS REPORT

The 1993/94 season was one in which the A Grade finished the season far better than it started. The barn-storming end of season run was partly due to a terrific level of commitment by the players and a greater pride in their performance. The embarrassment of finishing the season near the bottom of the table seemed to motivate most of the players.

The team finished in 9th position with 5 wins. I thought there were some very positive signs shown by the team during the year and with an ounce of luck our final position would have been better still. But it is results that count and 9th position is simply not good enough.

The summer for the A Grade team was broken into two distictly contrasting parts.

At the start of the season, I was convinced that for our team to be consistently competitive then everyone selected needed to play to the best of their ability in every game.

It is unfortunate that only in the last half of the summer did the team perform as it should have where everyone was eager to make a contribution. Throughout the season, Subiaco-Floreat troubled some of the best teams in the competition but it was only when all team members contributed that we started winning games.

Many of my team mates seem quite happy to perform at a mediocre level without striving to improve their performances. The need to score maore than just 20 or 30 when batting or to maintain the pressure on the opposing teams' batsmen when fielding or to chip in with more than just a couple of wickets when bowling are glaring shortcomings of our game.

The improvement on our performance of last year was very pleasing. From our 12 first innings' results, the batsmen produced 2570 runs at 214 per innings and our bowlers conceded 2716 runs at 226 per innings. The most pleasing aspect of these figures is the increase in average first innings totals from 180 last year to 214 this year. We must make this total our minimum target each game in order to improve on our position next year.

There were some very good individual performances during the summer including 4 centuries and 6 hauls of 5 wickets or more by the bowlers.

Brian Raven set the standard of our bowling attack throughout the year and showed the other team members his healthy competitive spirit and pride in performance. Brain "no I have not had enough!" Raven took 37 wickets that included 3 bags of 5 or more. I was able to feed off a lot of Brian's good work to pick up 32 wickets.





Gavin Swan needs to gain more consistency but showed that he can trouble the best batsmen and he finished the year well. Robert Campbell showed improvement in all aspects of his game but must strive to improve again next year.

Once again Greg Fitzgerald's wicket-keeping was outstanding and his year included a game in which he took 5 catches. The less said about Fitz's batting here the better.

Murray Goodwin was by far the best of our batsmen whenever he was available to play. The improvement that I have witnessed in Murray this season showed that he is bound for higher cricketing honours. Murray made 2 quality centuries and 3 scores of higher than 50.

Glen Dehring showed a lot more determination in his batting throughout the year and was rewarded with his maiden first grade century that was scaroed against the "Towners". At other times during the year, Glen began to show more consistent glimpses of his undoubted talent and he must now strive for a very good season next year.

During the early part of the season, Stuart Page was the only real shining light in our batting lineup. He carried his bat against Scarborough scoring an unbeaten century and made several other good scores. Stuart showed that he can play at his level but he must be disappointed with his end of year fade out.

The club can look confidently towards next year if it takes steps to gain a couple of key players and to hold the ones we've got.

The year has been most enjoyable on the social front and calls of 'it wasn't me mate' and 'I'll take you on' have been heard regularly. When our team is as skilful on the field as it is off we will be in position to challenge the shield champions.

The fines system implemented by the enforcer worked very well. The final total of about \$500 allowed for a really good day out that will be well remembered by all.

My thanks to the committee, Jane Reilly, Graham Stafford, Jim Rule and Kevin Payne.

Finally, special thanks to Peter Gonnella who has worked hard throughout the year and has given me great support.

THIRD GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Season 1993/94 would not be one that the majority of the third team could look back on with any degree of pride or achievement. This may seem a hard statement to some, but a won 4, lost 8 ratio was a very poor return, considering the ability "on paper" of each player, even though we used thirty one of them during the season. Apartfromafewindividual performances, we lacked a commitment to succeed and a team discipline both on and off the field, required of successful sides.

After a good first up win, we collapsed in the second game from 4 for 217 to be all out for 234. Scarborough were in trouble at 7 for 185, but with overs to spare, just hung around to pass our score with 9 wickets down. Our inability to bat the full allocation of overs cost us the game and would do so throughtout the remainder of the season. Our four victories were the only games we managed to bat all day, thereby making an easier job for the bowlers. This was a season that most of the side did not or could not achieve in eight matches during the season.

In three of the victories centuries were scored in a manner which should have been repeated. Steve George 151, David Harris 145 and Tony Flynn 155 NO, but generally our batting lacked discipline and too often players got out going for the big hit. Of the regular batsmen only Bernie Le Tessier, 217 runs at, 31.0 and Andy Worland 276 runs at, 30.6 showed any degree of consistency. Three visitors to the team should receive a special mention. Tony Flynn, 3 innings 233 runs at, 135, Steve George 2 innings 233 runs at 116, and Tim Beatie, 2 innings 142 runs, at 71 showed the rest of us how the game should be played.

The bowling performed reasonably well throughout the season, especially considering the pressure applied on them by our poor batting displays. In fact, we bowled eight sides out and had nine wickets down in three other matches. Justin Swan bowled with pace and spirit, without a great deal of luck, in taking 14 wkts at, 37.5 from 135 overs. Paul Kirk topped the averages, taking 16 wkts at, 18.3 from 106 overs, a feat that saw him elevated to the second team halfway through the season. Fourteen players bowled 30 overs or maore, a testiment to the continual changes made to the team. Dave Harris produced the individual bowling performance of the season taking 7 for 49 from 23 overs in dismissing Willetton for 188. We then produced the worst batting performance of the season by being dismissed for 177. Someone who indeed did give 100% in every game was Shane Liddelow, whose tragic accident whilst chasing a ball at Melville proved more costly than anyone had thought. He did not play another match, but during his four games, he scored 138 runs at 46.0 and bowled 36 overs taking 3 wickets at 28.6. Shane was sorely missed in the remaining games.

In closing, I must congratulate the 'WACA Team of the Year', Subiaco Floreat 2nds. Glyn O'Brien has lead from the front and shown all those qualities of leadership that I knew he was capable of. To Vince Rule and Tim Beattie "The Men of the Match" a truely exceptional innings by both of you, of which I had the pleasure to witness. To all the team, including Chris Payne, Joel Murphy and Tony Flynncongratulations on a woderful season and a great finals victory.

FOURTH GRADE CAPTAINS REPORT

With the majority of fourth grade players playing only their first or second seasons of senior cricket and with a lack of experienced cricketers in the team, the final result of the 4th grade in finishing sixth and missing the finals by a handful of points, was a very creditable performance.

As usual the fortunes of the 4ths depended on the availablity of players. It was no co-incidence that of the four games lost, three were when the 4ths were left two players short and had to make up the numbers with friends, relations and U/17s. This was suprising, as pre-season there were over 50 players training, yet from the first game onwards we achieved full availability only twice, as players made themselves unavailable for a variety of reasons, some of which appeared to be flimsy.

While this was always going to be a problem, it appears to be getting worse each season. From a 4th grade point of view, it is frustrating whenevery game our chances of winning are dependent not only on the skills of the players selected, but also on our ability to field a full team of cricketers in training. It is also disappointing to see young players who have made a commitment to playing cricket each week for the Club, have their chances of playing in the finals hindered by the unavailability of other players, who were perhaps less committed to the Club, but when available played in higher grades.


It would be great to see next season, all players being committed to playing in a premiership team for Subiaco-Floreat, and therefore being committed to playing in every possible game of the season. Without this commitment, finals appearances will be possible only for the 1st and 2nd grades and a Club Championship will be beyond the reach of the Club.

On the playing side of things, the other great stumbling block to success, was a lack of consistency, especially in our batting. While all the players improved over the season and all made a couple of significant contributions to our victories, individually the players were not able to string together a number of major performances that would demand promotion to higher grades.

Nonetheless, there were some fine performances that warrant recognition. Bernie Le Tessier's innings of 99 vs Claremont-Nedlands and Andrew Steindl's 93 vs Fremantle, both made when were chasing totals, were full of merit. Phil Henryon's 6 wickets for 61 vs Claremont-Nedlands underlined his potential to be a match winner, while Greg Catlin took a hat trick against Scarborough. Perhaps the best individual performance was when 15 year old Chris Isles took 5 wickets for 8 runs off 8 overs to singlehandedly win the game against Mt Lawley.

The best team effort was when we recovered from being 2 for nought against Midland-Guildford to be all out for 269 and then bowled them out, on a hot day, on a flat Lilac Hill pitch for 214. It was a fighting effort and showed the players what they were capable of when they fully applied themselves.

Our batting was technically sound, but over the season the batsmen found it difficult to turn starts of 20s and 30s into big scores, and we only had six individual scores over 60 during the season. This meant that we failed to bat out our overs in nine of the twelve games. The ability to bat out the overs is a characteristic of all very good



Derek Fry was our leading run scorer with 301 runs at an average of 37.63. Derek was our most consistant batsman, who next season should do well in higher grades. Top order batsman Andrew Steindl (235 runs@26.11) and Simon Botsis (289 runs@19.85 and 17 wickets@14.06) were both matchwinners in their games, then they could both succeed in higher grades.

Our bowling, was a bit more consistent than our batting, only once did we fail to bowl out the opposition. The bowlers generally bowled to plan, and bowled tightly, although sometimes, especially with the new ball, we did not attack the stumps enough and bowled too wide. Of the bowlers, Phil Henryon impressed, not only with his pace, but also with his application and determination, in taking 18 wickets @ 28.06. If we had been able to catch in the slips better, then Phil would have taken many more wickets. Cameron Barnes also impressed with his control in four games, in taking 11 wickets @ 15.86. Andrew Steindl with 8 wickets and offspinners Derek Fry and Simon Botsis with 4 wickets each, all bowled well when required.


Overall our fielding was of an ordinary standard, with all the players showing a lack of proper fielding technique and attimes, concentration. Too often, during the season, opposition batsmen took singles when hitting the ball direct to fielders, with no pressure being applied to the fielders and rarely did a runout result. Unless this situation is addressed early next season by the coaching staff, and the players themselves, then we will see more and more inefficient fielders within the club.

On reflection, our record was a fair indication of our abilities over the season, but a finals appearance would have been good experience for our younger players development. Overall itwas an enjoyable season (apart from Friday night recruiting!) and hopefully all the players lamt something that will help them to improve and play successfully in higher grades next season.

Finally, I would like to thank the small core of young players whose attitude and commitment to playing for the Club, was exemplary and a credit to themselves. Well done.

The District Under 15 team also showed considerable improvement during the season and with the success of the under 13 team in recent seasons, a further improvement for the next season is expected. The final game was a tough one against Midland Guildford at Lialcon a stiffling hot day of 40°C. Fortunately we won the toss and batted but found the bowling of Bill Van Vliet much better than what we were used to. However Roas Bolton batted superbly to make 98 from 107 balls and was well supported by Larry King in the innings with 69 from 57 balls. After 45 overs we finished at 6/221. Midland got off to a blistering start and were 0/80 off 14 overs and later cruising at 2/140. Spinners: Larry Davies 1/28 (9 overs), Paul Forrestal 1/33 (7 overs) and Graham Stafford 2/23 (9 overs) made some inroads. Midland were all out for 198.

Again the feature event of the season was the Richard Wilberforce Memorial Game between Subiaco and Floreat C.C. Subiaco again won for the fourth consecutive year putting enormous pressure on Floreat to improve their rating.


