COACH'S REPORT

GRADE RESULTS

Firstly, congratulations to Greg Catlin's Fourth Grade side for bringing home the Club's only "Premiership Flag" for the season. It was an excellent effort by all the players who contributed during the season and particularly pleasing for those fortunate enough to play in the four day final at Kingsway Reserve, Wanneroo. Well done to the players concerned.

Another excellent achievement was the "A" Grade players efforts in making the Final of the Coca Cola Sunday League one day competition which was played as a day/night game at the WACA. Congratulations to Peter Capes for his excellent captaincy and personal performances, particularly his 29 runs off one over against Scarborough in the first round, which not only won that game, but ensured we got through to the Quarter Finals. Congratulations to all the players, who I know enjoyed the experience of playing in a final and under lights.

However, unfortunately the same can not be said for the "A" Grade performances in the main WACA Competition. Players seemed to think it was possible to be successful adopting one day tactics in the two day games. It was disappointing to play so inconsistently and to fritter away a number of winning opportunities.

The Thirds were desperately unlucky to lose the final game by six runs and to be replaced in the four by the side that they were playing. Bad luck to all those players who performed consistently for most of the year.

The Seconds were a major disappointment given the strength of the sides on paper each game. Not only was it disappointing to finish well out of contention for finals but there was a lack of pressure placed on the "A" Grade players who were performing poorly in the main competition.

THE SEASON IN GENERAL

Notwithstanding the loss of a number of talented senior players overseas and through retirements, the Club was bolstered to some extent by the return of some former players. I was optimistic at the beginning of the season that the Club would be competitive in all four grades.

While this was the case in the lower grades, the performances in the top sides were unacceptable. Despite efforts to introduce a greater level of skills training (physical and mental) than has been the case in previous years, some players continued to show a reluctance to "bite the bullet" and change the lacksidasical attitude that has crept into the Club over the past four or five years.

While the bowlers toiled manfully all season the batting continues to be a concern. The batting is inconsistent, lacks discipline and generally requires a greater level of mental toughness from all players. Those players who aspire to be good "A" Grade players need to put in considerably greater effort in those areas if this Club is to perform more consistently a the higher level. I hope all players take the opportunity during the winter to analyse their past seasons performance and create new goals and make a strong commitment to take the Club forward.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the players for their efforts, particularly those who did put in extra. It does not go unnoticed. Special thanks to Peter Carlstein for his specialist coaching and the knowledge he passed on to all of us. To John Worland for his excellent efforts as practice captain and for all his other work in directly assisting the players and the Club. To Greg Maskiell and Craig Harms for their assistance, support and contributions in their respective areas of expertise. The input and support from the four Captains, the President Ian Plaisted and the Clubs hard working Committee was greatly appreciated.

Cricket is a sport to enjoy and the more you win the more you enjoy it. This simple philosophy has not been embraced by the players as a motivation to succeed and until the players as a group show a hunger to win we will continue to produce mediocre performances.

An individual performance that merits a mention was Phil Jeffrey who was the stand out player this season, taking 30 wickets and making 335 runs. His performances were consistent and he showed a professional attitude and a will to win.

Robbie Campbell continued to improve and had his best year with the club making 341 runs and chipping in with some handy wickets. He has a good work ethic but must continue to strive for more consistency.

Murray Goodwin again showed he has the ability to play at the next level making 382 runs for the season averaging 54.57 and including a career high 188 against Wanneroo. He should be disappointed that nearly half his runs were made in the one innings.

The bowling attack struggled all year following the injury to Gavin Swan and the retirement (again) of Brian Raven. Next year the bowlers brought into the side will be better for the experience. Greg Fitzgerald was again a polished performer behind the stumps.

I have really enjoyed playing at Subiaco-Floreat and I am convinced that the players can and must bond together to again create a winning atmosphere. Special thanks to Graham Stafford and the other captains for their input and hard work throughout a very long year.

Danny Quai also bowled some excellent spells in the latter half of the season, his effort versus Melville where he took 6-79 from 30 overs was outstanding.

A plus to come out of the season was the First Grade debuts of David Darragh, Dan O'Regan, Phil Henryon, Paul Kirk and Andy Worland. Lets hope you guys really kick-on next season and push for regular spots in First Grade. It was also great to see Marty Nice and Gary Godfrey return to First Grade ranks and perform well, particularly in our Coca Cola Cup matches.

I really feel that an improved attitude and a greater commitment to the club is required to get the Seconds back on the winning track next season. This includes even basic aspects of the game such as being at the ground on time before a match.

We must improve next season, as I believe our poor form contributed to the First Grade's lack of success, in not putting any pressure on positions in the top side. Players shouldn't be promoted after making scores of 20 or 30, as happened this season.

In closing, I would like congratulate the First Grade on playing off in the Coca-Cola Cup one-day final at the WACA and the Fourth Grade boys for a great effort in winning our only premiership. Also, congratulations to Murray Goodwin on making the Western Warriors team, particularly his great debut performance versus England.

Thanks to Graham Stafford, Peter Capes and Richard and Greg Catlin on their efforts and support over the season, including those tough selection meetings.

Simmo struggled in seconds after a late start due to injury, but showed true grit in four third grade innings to make two 50's and one century in pressure situations. Other good individual performances came from Danny Quai, with 102 not out against South Perth, and Justin Riley's 5 wicket haul against University.

Finally, I would like to thank the committee and coaching staff for their help in the past season. The club could not function without "Jim and Jan" rolls or any of the other hard work that is put in by many helpers. Thanks again for all your help.

FOURTH GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

A winning combination of experience, youth, ability and a little bit of luck enabled the 4th grade to succeed as premiers for season 1994/95.

The hardest aspect of winning a premiership is qualifying for the finals. To qualify it is imperative for a team to win the early games so that it isn't playing catch up cricket for the rest of the season and relying on favourable results in other matches to qualify.

This season, the fourths were fortunate to get away to good start, losing only one out of their first six matches. We were fortunate because on paper we did not appear to be a strong side, with many new and untried players, a constantly changing team due to last minute withdrawals, and a lack of proven batsmen. However, Lady Luck smiled upon us, we kept on winning the toss and batting first, allowing our bowling strength to control the games, and rain washed out likely defeat against South Perth. While our luck was good, some solid individual performances with the bat from veterans John "Fitzy" Fitzgerald and Tony "Umumza" Hoar and youngster Paul "The Coit" Courtis, and good consistent bowling from all bowlers enabled the fourths to ride their luck and win the early games.

By the new year, the fourths were second and with the introduction of couple more batsmen, the team was looking a strong and balanced unit. Despite this, the fourths then played poorly and lost to third placed Gosnells, increasing the pressure to win the remaining games to qualify. The next three games were won comfortably, and with two games to go the fourths only had to win one to be fairly certain of playing in the finals. It nearly didn't happen. Our batting depth was sorely tested as we lost players to replace those players up the grades whose seasons came to a premature end. Against Melville, we were 7/78 before Justin "Swannie" Swan, ably assisted by Dylan "Bob" Allsopp, smashed us out of trouble with a magnificent 100, in a partnership of 130, thereby giving the bowlers a total they were able to defend. Against Scarborough we batted poorly again to be all out for 138, our lowest score of the season, but it didn't matter, despite losing, we finished third.

Luck favoured the fourths again, with the thirds just failing to qualify, those players who had gone up to thirds in the final two games were eligible to play fourths. While this allowed us to shore up the batting and select a balanced team, the downside was that a couple of players who were primarily bowlers and had been valued members of the fourths over the season missed out on playing in the finals. It was bad luck for Cam "Barnsey" Barnes and Ryan "Caveman" Parkin, and hopefully their form next season will be such that it will demand selection in all games.

The semi-final was against Midland-Guildford. We batted first and gave our best batting performance of the season. We finished at 8/328 with "Swannie" scoring a blazing 69 and "The Coit" a patient 58. The next day our bowlers tore into the "Towner's" batting in the first session, with Duncan "Tickets" Bond taking 3/23 with help from "Swannie" and James "JT" Tranter taking two wickets each, before John "Sure Hands" Gillam mesmerised a spellbound tail to take 3/13. Midland were bowled out for 166 and we had easily played our best cricket of the season.

The grand final was against Gosnells. For only the third time during the season we lost the toss and bowled first. After a nervous start where we dropped two early catches, we started to take wickets wickets at steady rate. "JT" ripped out the Gosnells top order with 3/17 and then "Fitzy" cleaned up with some well flighed leggies, to finish with 3/34. Gosnells were all out soon after the tea break for 178.

With 90 minutes to bat to stumps, a potentially difficult time lay ahead. After a hard day in the field, "The Coit" was out for a duck. Disaster loomed as "Umumza" and "Fitzy" had failed as a pair all season, not once posting a partnership of more than ten. However, they overcame their hoodoo and saw us through to stumps. The next day "Umumza" and "Fitzy" gave a great display on how to bat as a pair, within their ability and with a goal in mind. In what turned out to be the most dominant performance in the final, they put on 161 runs in just under four and a half hours. In the final wash up, this partnership was the cornerstone that allowed us to go on win the final. "Umumza" was first to go for a patient 76. "Fitzy" saw us to the lead before being bowled for a fine 88.

Unfortunately the middle order was not able to go on with the job and put the game beyond the reach of the "Gossie Bears". After such a good start, we relaxed and thinking the game was in the bag, promptly lost 7/56. It was only when the two youngest in the team, "Bob" and Duncan "Tickets" Bond, got together and batted with purpose, did we start to build a lead. "Bob" was out just before stumps for 22, but the youngsters had added a valuable 39 runs and we finished the day at 9/263.

The following weekend, "Tickets" aided by his skipper's front pad, batted on for another ten overs adding 25 runs for the last wicket, before missing a straight one (again) having scored 40. We were all out for 283 off 147 overs.

Bowling a second time, we were in unfamiliar territory. With a lead of 105, we relaxed once more, our bowling was not as sharp as the first innings and our fielding was ordinary, dropping a couple easy catches. However, the Gosnells's batsmen kept playing rash shots and by tea they were 5/122. A wicket fell straight after the break and an early finish looked likely, but once again we failed to crush the opposition when we had the chance. "Swannie" was asleep on the boundary and dropped an easy catch hit down his throat. The batsman then proceeded to smash 74 runs in quick time, before the skipper fooled him with a slow, wide one and "Fitzy" took a great catch at slip.

A now wide-awake "Swannie" came back and cleaned up the tail with the new ball to finish with 3/60, and the skipper had bowled well all day to finish with 4/46 off 28 overs. Gosnells were all out on the last ball of the third day for 248, setting us the task of scoring a potentially tricky 144 to win.

The next day the run chase started well. "The Coit" was dropped twice at slip and survived two confident lbw appeals in the first over. Our luck was in! We crawled to 48 against negative bowling, before an absolute balls-up saw "Umumza" run out for 20. A typical 4th grade mini-collapse followed and we were 4/86 before Stuart "Lance" Boyle with help from "Swannie" attacked the bowling with a flourish adding on 51 runs in less than an hour. Both were out going for big hits, "Lance" for a sweet 42 and "Swannie" trying to hit a six with two runs to win. "Bob" had the glory of scoring the winning runs and in the end the scorebook showed we won by four wickets.

It was a satisfying victory, for while we always held the upper hand, we had to work hard and come back a few times to ensure victory. Playing the Grand Final on four days over two weekends, produced a new and unique experience for the players, although by the second weekend the atmosphere and intensity of the occasion had waned.

Statistically, after a successful final series, the players contributions for the season were good. Batsmen Hoar, Fitzgerald, Courtis, Boyle and Swan all scored in excess of 350 runs at an average of 30 or better. "Umumza" and "Fitzy's" experience and competitiveness were big factors in our success and in the improvement in the young players who spent time batting with them. "The Coit's" application and concentration to batting is to be admired, he now needs to show the same with his fielding if he is to progress beyond 4th grade. "Lance" improved tremendously over the season and looks well suited for higher grades. "Swannie's" batting was a revelation, after being

dropped to 4ths for disciplinary reasons he made use of the opportunity to bat up the order, to show that he has the talent to succeed as an allrounder in any grade, if he chooses to seriously apply himself.

"JT" weighed in with some useful innings, Matt Elliot showed real promise in the few games that he played and young "Bob" improved dramatically, showing a sound technique and temperament and becoming an important member of side.

The bowling was sound all year, only twice did we fail to bowl out the opposition. Justin Riley bowled well early before finishing the season in 2nds, "Swannie" was just as quick and did well to finish with 18 wickets. "Barnsey" had a couple of good hauls, but struggled with consistency, "JT" was economical and kept making vital breakthroughs and "Tickets" showed real improvement by the season's end, bowling with good pace and control.

Spinners "Fitzy" and "Sure Hands" added much needed variety to the attack and were very productive. The Skipper bowled steadily into the wind all season and was the leading wicket taker with 32 wickets.

Wicket-Keeper Simeon "Sinbad" Botsis a had good season with the gloves, making 19 dismissals in seven games and taking some great catches in the finals. Unfortunately "Sinbad" suffered from the second year blues and had a shocker of a season with the bat (which seemed to be the way for all Subi-Floreat 'keepers this season!).

As usual in fourth grade, a number of young players made their debuts in senior cricket and played a handful of games, of these the most impressive were legspinner Rob "Ponytail" Parr and athletic allrounder Ryan "Caveman" Parkin. These two should be big improvers next season.

The season also saw a couple a couple of veterans in John "Fitzy" Fitzgerald and John "Sure Hands" Gillam resume playing for the club after several years absence. Their contribution to the 4th's success cannot be underestimated. Having both played in numerous premiership teams for the club, they re-introduced a bit of the "old" Subi-Floreat into the 4ths with their stories of past (in)famous deeds and the (radical) idea of playing winning cricket with the goal of qualifying for the finals. Their leadership, their "living club history" status and their enthusiasm for winning, encouraged the rest of the team to share their goal and work towards a finals appearance. Well done!

"Fitzy" had a great season and must be congratulated on receiving the prestigious L.B. Bolton Shield as Club Champion. As well as taking 15 wickets, "Fitzy" scored 540 runs for the season, the most by any player in the Club. This was a tremendous effort, but from an overall Club perspective it is a bit disappointing that the Club's the leading runscorer, was it's eldest regular player and not a youngster on the way up.

In closing, I would like to thank all the players who contributed to the 4th's premiership season. It was a great effort. Personally, it is the perfect way for me to finish my stint as captain after six seasons. Thanks also to Graham Stafford for all his help and support during the season and to all the committee members and Club helpers for their efforts over the season.

Playing in the finals is a great experience and I hope that our all players get the opportunity to appear in the finals. However it will only happen if all 11 players share and work towards the same goal.

It is pleasing to report that the growth and success of the junior section of the Club has continued throughout the 1994/95 season. Over 130 players aged between six and 11 participated in the Kanga and modified cricket program at McGillvray Oval on Friday nights throughout the season. The change in time and venue undoubtedly proved very successful with both the players and parents, although there was some difficulty initially in getting the level of parent support required to manage the number of players. The assistance of David Nichols, the WACA Junior Development Officer in attending and providing assistance with training parents as coaches is greatly appreciated.

There can be little doubt that the success of the Junior Development Program over the last several years is now being reflected in the success of the Club in the WACA Junior Competition, with the Club having finalists in all age groups. The Junior Development Program established over the last few years now sees increased player participation within the District against the trend noticed in nearly all other WACA Clubs. The adoption of the policy a few years ago ensuring that people coaching teams in both Local and District Junior Competition were duly qualified and accredited has resulted in players receiving quality tuition at an early age.

The U/13 Inverarity Shield team coached by Alan Bolton enjoyed an outstanding season, completing the season undefeated and defeating Willetton in the final to win the Club's third successive Inverarity Shield - the only club in the history of the competition to achieve such a feat. Congratulations to Alan and the players for this outstanding achievement.

The U/15's side, many of them veterans of the Club's successful 1992/93 Inverarity Shield team - were the pacesetters throughout the season, save a few minor hiccups - winning the shield in a close and exciting final. Congratulations to coach Graeme Gaunt and the players. The calibre of the players participating in this side was recognised when six of the players were selected for the WACA U/15 Junior Development Program.

The U/17's side coached by David Isles finished fourth in the competition after playing some high quality cricket throughout the season and developing into a well disciplined team that brought great credit to the Club. Unfortunately the side narrowly missed out in the semi-finals. Congratulations to David and the players for the outstanding results that were received throughout the season.

The strong growth in cricket numbers in the district is a consequence of the development of a strong base in the early age groups and undoubtedly is a principal reason for the success now being enjoyed by the Club.

It is hoped that the creation of Zones will enable greater emphasis on participation and involvement of junior cricketers in all levels of competition. There will remain however a strong emphasis on the current District Cricket competitions.

The Club noted with sadness the passing of G.A.R. Lock, who passed away after a period of illness on 31st March 1995. Tony played a significant role in the coaching of many of our juniors over a number of years and assisted in the early establishment of Modified Rules Cricket and with specialist coaching to many of the developing cricketers in the district. His contribution will undoubtedly be missed.
