COACH'S REPORT

Pre-Season

The season started back in June 1995 with a small development squad of "potential A Grade" players working in the Hale School nets. At the beginning of August Club training commenced using a variety of venues such as Floreat Oval and nets, McLean Park, the Beach, Kings Park and the WACA Indoor Nets.

Player Strength

Player numbers at the begining of the year were very good with approximately 50 to 55 players available and vying for selection in the first game. Generally, I was very happy with attendances and the attitude of those who made the efforts in the pre-season training. However, while it is always pleasing to have those numbers early, it is inevitable that there will be disappointments causing those players not selected to disappear very quickly.

New players to the Club were significant with some 25 new faces playing at some stage during the season in the four grades. One of the most significant changes occurred at A Grade level with 7 new faces representing the Club in the first game. In many respects it was the heralding a new era in the Club.

Results

Overall the results on paper may not appear to be that good, however there are some significant positives which counterbalance the points ultimately scored. The most significant being the introduction of a number of young talented players to all grades of cricket throughout the Club.

The average age of all players in the Club was only 21 years which is by far the youngest I can recall in my 33 year association with the Club. The successful introduction of 17 year olds Matthew Elliott and Chris Isles, and 18 year olds Warwick Finlay and Paddy McKeown to the A Grade this season was very gratifying. Matthew and Paddy both scored around 400 runs which was a tremendous first up effort.

Equally other young players aged from 15 to 17 were introduced to the other grades with considerable individual success. Clearly the Club has a real future through most of these players together with an extremely talented bunch of players who are constantly winning "Premiership Flags" in the under age competitions, U13's, U15's and U17's.

A Grade

The A Grade was a very competitive side in all games it contested this season and all players can feel proud of their efforts. The most significant reason for this was the appointment of Steve Herzberg as Captain. Steve was the best thing that has happened on the playing side to this Club for a long time with his extreme competitiveness, aggression, professionalism, skills and experience and his positive outlook and belief in his and his players abilities to perform.

I would like to personally thank Steve for his efforts not only on the playing field as a player and Captain but also for his significant coaching contribution by effectively playing the role of "Captain Coach" of the A Grade squad. The support and efforts of Craig Harms as our Mental Skills Coach and the time he spent in assisting Steve with fielding drills all year and the other work he did with other players in all grades was greatly appreciated.

To Murray Goodwin who has been our outstanding batsmen for a number of seasons my congratulations on an excellent season in winning both the WACA Batting Aggregates and Averages for 1995/96. My only regret for Murray was that he did not get his just deserts and have the opportunity to wield the willow for his State this season.

Seconds, Thirds and Fourths

Towards the end of the season the seconds were the only grade with a realistic chance of making the finals. Unfortunately this was not to be in the end equation, however, I am sure all players learnt a lot



from the season and improved as players. Of all our sides the seconds were the most experienced and the players would no doubt be a little disappointed that they did not get there in the end. My thanks to Captain Vince Rule and stand in Captain for the last part of the season Tim Beattie for their efforts.

The Thirds and Fourths were also a little disappointing as most of the season they appeared to have reasonably competitive and talented sides on paper. However, in my opinion it became obvious later in the season that a lack of experienced players was the major reason for not being able to rack up any more wins. Notwithstanding that, I have already touched on the counterbalancing positives to that issue earlier in this report. To the Captains Richard Catlin and Tony Hoar my thanks for your efforts.

Support

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of those who contributed to the success of the Club this season and also provided me personally with the level of support I received. To our President Ian Plaisted and the hard working Committee who put in considerable hours and efforts way beyond what the players will ever understand. To our Practice Captain John Worland for a difficult job well done. To Kerry Darragh and Alan Bolton who formed part of the Playing Committee and Selection Panel, I greatly appreciated your support, cricket experience and knowledge which made a big difference to me.

Finale

Finally, I have informed the Committee that I will be standing down as Coach after a two year stint due to family and work commitments. I have certainly enjoyed the experience of Coaching "My Club" and being involved so closely with all the players old and new. I have always had a deep passion for cricket and in particular for this Club and its ongoing wellbeing. I would like to take this opportunity to wish my successor and the Club all the very best in what I believe will be a fruitful future.

The Seconds set out in 95/96 with the aim of significantly improving on a poor 94/95 season. I felt overall that the team's performance of 6 wins was a good effort, and if not for a couple of very close games going against us, we would have made the finals.

The season started disastrously with a very poor performance against the new boys of the competition, Rockingham-Mandurah. To be bowled out twice against a Country Week side was very disappointing and the low point of the season. To the credit of the guys, we showed a lot of character to bounce back with a couple of great victories against Bayswater -Morley and Gosnells, the latter being one of the finest wins I've been associated with. These wins really created a good team spirit and made for an enjoyable season.

The batting was still inconsistent this season. There were four games we can point to where we had major collapses in the first session. It goes without saying that it is very difficult to post winning scores when the side is 4/20. There were some excellent performances however, and it was great to see some centuries scored. Tim Beattie played a superb innings of 134, when we fell tantalisingly short by 5 runs in a chase against Willetton. Dave Harris played as only he can when he slaughtered the North Perth attack for a great 140. Stuart Boyle hit a magnificent 120 in only his second game of 2nd grade against South Perth. Coming in to bat at No 8, and chasing a large total of 334, Boyley and Paul Kirk (who made 62), made what was almost a match winning partnership only to fall 9 runs short of what would have been an incredible victory. Our fourth centurion was Dan O'Regan who made his first century in 2nd's against his favourite team, Midland Guildford. Dan hit a fine 120 and really relished the opportunity to open after spending a lot of time in the middle order. Together with another solid season with the gloves, I'm hoping Dan can really kick on next season.

One player I'd like to make mention of is Tony Flynn. "Errol" started the season in 3rds and felt that he had a few points to prove when he was given his chance in 2nds. He responded in magnificent fashion to win the 2nd grade average with 428 runs at 35.67. He was very consistent all season and most of his runs came when the side was deep in trouble. Coupled with some good spells with the ball and his always enthusiastic approach in the field, Tony had his best ever season in 2nds.

The bowlers again performed admirably in trying circumstances, with the hard working Joel Murphy again leading the way with 28 wickets at 14.39 to take out the bowling award. Joel has been a great performer in 2nd grade for the last couple of seasons and with his great attitude to training, he fully deserves his successes. Paul Kirk also bowled some excellent spells and always gives 110% on and off the field. This was recognised in the latter stages of the season when "Beefy" was promoted to 1st grade.

A couple of young players emerged in 2nds this season. Stuart Boyle's performances have been mentioned earlier, and he has got a heap of ability. It would be great to see him take the next step in season 96/97. Chris Isles showed his great potential and was promoted to 1st grade where he made a couple of good forties. At just 18, he has the ability to be a good 1st grade player for the Club for many years.

I would like to thank all the players who represented the 2nds this season, particularly Tim Beattie who took over the captaincy in my absence.

Finally I would like to take the opportunity to thank Graham Stafford for his work over the last two seasons. Graham has put in a lot of time and energy into the Club and should be commended for a job well done.

Against South Perth, Andy Worland led the side with style, with several players making contributions, Best with the ball was Duncan Bond (4/33), while run getters were Captain Worland (41), Danny Quai in a rare 3rd Grade appearance (75) and the ageless Nick Rule (55).

Wanneroo had Subiaco Floreat on the ropes at 6/138 chasing 261. However, the middle order batsmen came to the rescue. Damien Casson scored a great 59 before veterans Callin (56 not out) and Arnie Palmer (18 not out) brought the side home with 3 balls to spare. Unfortunately the game was declared a tie as the scorers for Subiaco-Floreat forgot how to count! I hope we can improve on that part of our game by next year. This mistake could have cost us a place in the finals in different circumstances.

Dubious decisions and a dead wicket made for a low scoring game at Cottesloe Oval against Claremont-Nedlands. In a return from the wilderness Gordon Webster top scored with 37 whilst sheik of tweak, Robbie "Neil" Parr finally got rewards for his toils with 4/20 including two match winning caught and bowleds. Robbie struggled for most of the season but by the end of the year he started to trouble more batsmen when he worked harder at bowling more leggies. He can continue to move up the grades in the future. However leg spin is an "art" and no one knows more than Robbie that perfection takes time.

The third grade bowling attack struggled during the season. Clinton "Arnie" Palmer stood out like a sore thumb as the teams most potent and reliable bowler. With 22 wickets at an average of 18.18, Arnie well deserved the bowling award. Steve Wright also showed potential with 15 wickets. With a little more consistency Wrighty can develop into a good bowler.

The teams batting was a little better but definitely lacked consistency. Kim Lange showed the way with 317 runs at 24.38, to win the batting averages. In the first half of the season Stuart Boyle made 197 runs at 32.83 before going on to bigger and better things in 2nd Grade. In two 3rd Grade innings Danny Quai made two fifties and now just needs to take the next step to success at the next level. Part time captain Catlin also had success down the order scoring 180 runs at an average of 35.60.

Other players to show glimpses of form were Duncan Bond, Nick Plaisted and Dylan Allsopp. Duncan had some good performances with both bat and ball. To become a good cricketer he needs to show the extra dedication required to be a consistently good performer. Nick showed style behind the stumps and made some handy contributions with the bat. By working on the concentration side of his game, Nick could turn twenties into fifties and take the winning catch at the end of a long day behind the stumps. Dylan showed great courage when asked to open the batting and the experience gained this year will be of benefit next season when the runs should flow for him at the top the order.

It is fair to say that the team did suffer during the year when the captain was away on work commitments. Sincere thanks go to the variety of other captains that helped out during the year. Many thanks also for the tireless work of the committee, coaching staff, and in particular Jan Plaisted and other afternoon tea helpers. As a whole the club became more competitive this year. It would be great to improve on that again next year and see sides making finals appearances.
