#### 1st GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Cricket is a great game, particularly when you win. There is no better feeling than sitting back watching your teammates bat after winning, or relaxing in the rooms after a comprehensive victory. Keeping this in mind, I guess we could divide our season into two halves. Those games at the beginning of the season, where we did a portion of this and those played after Christmas where we did

The feeling and aspiration to win among the players was attitudinous at the onset of the season. Robbie Campbell was inspirational in the field early and his prowess lifted all the players. All players were contributing to the side during the first half of the season. Michael Simpson, batting at four, scored 55 against Claremont and then Brendan Balcombe top-scored for the year against Midland-Guildford with a determined and entertaining 82 not out. Then the two new players to the Subiaco-Floreat 1st Grade line-up, Chris Cann and Steven Glew, both made 60 each against Gosnells. 'Canny' then lined up the next week with a solid 54 against Perth to allow us to get the respectable score of

With the welcome return of Jeremy Allen to the club, we managed to dismiss Perth for 84.

It is interesting to note that in all these games, with the exception of Bayswater-Morley, we managed to score over 200. In 1st Grade cricket, with bowling being one of the club's strengths, it is imperative, if we are to be successful next season, that we set a team goal of scoring at least 200 each game. If we can achieve this goal then I am sure that Subiaco-Floreat can be a final four contender next

Without dwelling on the negatives too much, the second half of the season was most disappointing, and at times quite inept.

We only managed to score 200 once from the final 6 games, with the average team score for those games being 154. This is not enough runs to defend. We as a team of batsmen need to learn to occupy the crease for a longer period of time and to really fight when a bowling attack is on top. We cannot give up by playing a shot which is not really on, or by playing a shot which is not one we play well. A good batsman knows what shots he can play well and those that he cannot. Successful batsman, at any level, do this. Steve Waugh is a good example of a player who knows his limitations and plays inside them. Subiaco - Floreat as a team of batsmen need to learn to do this to enable us to reach that illusive 200. We really need to work on our concentration and discipline when batting and need to know our limitations as players. We are not all like Brian Lara, who can hit any ball, anywhere, anytime at will. I believe that 80% of being a good 1st Grade cricketer is being able to cope mentally with the situation, and about 20% innate skill.

Being able to cope mentally comes with experience and exposure to those situations, and our 1st Grade team this year has played a number of players who have played their first game. To those generally younger players who have played this year I commend you on your efforts, as I know you gave it your all. Learn from those experiences and try to acquire as much knowledge as possible from the more experienced players. Three of these players have represented Western Australia and I am sure would be more than willing to help you through any difficulties you are having with your cricket. In addition I am sure they can provide you with a little advice on life, as well as good many other things.

I would like to pay credit to our bowlers for their efforts throughout the season, in particular Jeremy Allen and Peter Capes. 'JA' rejoined Subiaco-Floreat this season and from the time that he arrived, bowled superbly. In just 7 games 'JA' captured 21 wickets at about 11 and in doing so made a number of batsmen look quite inadequate. 'Capesy', as usual, performed admirably with ball this season, and at times was far too good for most batsmen. Not only for his dangerous new ball bowling, Peter has been a great asset to the team this season for his guidance, controlled aggression, competitiveness, experience and humour.

#### 2nd GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The second grade team completed the 1997-98 season with a record of 5 wins, 5 losses and 2 draws. Following the loss of several more experienced players prior to and during the season the team was a lot younger and less experienced than any second grade team in memory. There were 27 players used throughout the season which is evidence of the instability in the team from week to week. This factor, together with the unavoidable use of three different captains due to Gary Godfrey's work commitments and Tim Silinger's injury problems was a significant contributor to the inconsistency of performance during the season.

The opening round saw us comprehensively beaten by South Perth. The team then recovered to win its next two games against Bayswater-Morley and Claremont-Nedlands respectively. These wins were largely due to some very good bowling by Sam Howman and Duncan Bond to defend modest totals, and the solid batting of Paul Silinger and David Bolton. Round four brought a disappointing draw after outplaying Midland-Guildford in a rain affected 45 overs a side match. A dropped catch with one wicket needed to secure a deserved victory saw a valuable win thrown away. Matthew Elliott made a stylish 125 and Sam Howman and Gary Godfrey were again outstanding with the ball.

The next four rounds saw the team lose its way rather badly with 3 demoralising losses to Gosnells, Willetton and Fremantle and a draw with Perth. Despite some excellent individual contributions from Chris Isles, Paul Silinger and David Bolton the team failed to build respectable totals in three of the four games.

The final four rounds produced some very exciting performances, the highlights being an outright victory over North Perth and a memorable 15 run win against Mt Lawley. The only blemish in this period being a disappointing but closely fought loss to Melville. These last four matches marked a new level of maturity in the side, and particularly in some of the younger player's performances. It was particularly pleasing that the players learnt from a poor first day against Melville to fight back on the second day and push the opposition close to defeat in trying conditions.

Sam Howman, Duncan Bond and Tim Silinger were superb with the ball and formed the basis of a very mean and potent attack. Phil Henryon, Ryan Parken and David Bolton bowled extremely well under pressure against an experienced North Perth line-up. Special mention must be made of Duncan Bond's performance to steal the game from Mt Lawley with a spell of 5 wickets for 5 runs on the second day after Mt Lawley seemed headed for a comfortable pursuit of our meagre target of 121. Kosta Kapinkoff and Simon Leahy played several dominant innings in these matches.

Although frustrating in the area of consistency at times there are strong signs that a talented group of players is coming together and learning from their experience in the top grades. The continued development of very good young players such as Sam Howman, David Bolton, Kosta Kapinkoff, Chris Isles, Duncan Bond and George Christadoulou ensures that the club will have greater success in the top two grades in years to come.

Also, players such as Adam Cross, Dylan Allsopp, Nick Plaisted, Ryan Parken, Hamish McIntosh, Daniel Barnes and Sam Pearce made debuts this season and showed that they are capable of playing well at this level.

The following players made significant contributions throughout the season:

Sam Howman took 27 wickets at 15.26 and made 208 runs at 29.71. Sam was a dominant player in his first full season of second grade and showed with his talent, competitive nature and maturity well beyond his 17 years in his thinking about the game that he is destined for higher honours. He made his A grade debut against Mt Lawley late in the season and will be a regular next season.

David Bolton batted consistently throughout the season to compile 326 runs at 36.22. David was also playing his first full season seconds after making a promising start last season and demonstrated that he has the technique and ability to make it at a higher level. He also played A grade at the end of the season and looks set for more appearances next year.

Duncan Bond proved to be the most improved player at the club this season. He took 18 wickets at 20.83 and made 229 runs at 20.82 in second grade. Duncan's competitiveness and enthusiasm in all facets of the game were very important to the team this season and I am sure he will learn quickly from his experiences at second grade and A grade level this season and become an even better player next season.

Paul Silinger opened the season in devastating form, moving quickly up to the seconds and proceeding to carve out 251 runs at 50.20 to earn promotion to A grade for the rest of the season where he made some good contributions.

Chris Isles played some remarkable innings on his way to making 233 runs at 38.83. Unfortunately for all batting enthusiasts he played only 5 matches due to study and football commitments.

Tim Silinger proved to be the premier leg spinner in the second grade competition, taking 21 wickets at 19.57. Tim returned to his best form in the second half of the year, proving unplayable to most second grade batsmen despite playing with the distraction of a broken left hand and forced a deserved recall to the A grade for the last game.

Kosta Kapinkoff impressed all with a couple of outstanding performances in his four matches at the end of the season, blazing 198 runs at 39.60. He is a very powerful and exciting strokemaker who is capable of dominating bowling attacks, and an exceptional fieldsman. Kosta made his debut in A grade in the final match and made 45 out of a small total to show that he is one to watch next season.

#### 3rd GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

SFCC 3<sup>rd</sup> grade set its sights on capitalising on an excellent season in 1996/97, however due to inconsistent performances during the latter stages of the year we unfortunately failed to qualify for the finals. During the season all players gained valuable experience which we need to learn from and build on to develop into successful cricketers. Through improved experience and determination 1998/99 can be looked at with great optimism.

The season started with a drawn cliff hanger against South Perth. This match was indicative of our season where we would place ourselves in a match winning situation but were unable to deliver the knockout punch. After some solid batting we declared at 7/242 setting a tough target for victory. We had South Perth 8/107 after a fine early contribution by the bowlers, but dogged batting, poor bowling and some ordinary fielding allowed their tail to hold out for a hollow draw. A disappointing result considering we had outplayed them and especially as there are no points for draws.

Our next outing against an eventual finals team, Bayswater Morley. This was an exciting win due to an excellent partnership between our new pressure player Hamish McIntosh 72, and the veteran Clinton Palmer 32, who also bowled extremely well capturing 3/14. Their stand of 82, coming together at 8/117 chasing 133 was a morale boosting effort providing our first victory for the year.

The next game versus Claremont was similar to the previous week, that man Hamish was involved in another pressure run chase with Nick Plaisted providing solid entertaining support at a crucial time. Again our bowling was solid with all chipping in, and contributions by most batsmen added to a great team victory chasing a difficult target of 247.

Our season roller coaster started with a poor performance against our/my loathed enemy Midland Guildford. The loss highlighted what was a problem during the season, we failed to bowl out sides on the ropes allowing them to post a competitive score of 223 after being 6/85. Ryan Parkin showed signs of things to come with a excellent return of 5/36. Our first innings was disastrous being bowled out for 110 which could have been worse had Ryan not made a fighting 37 at No. 10.

Fortunately we were able to extract some positives from the game. The second innings proved how much we let ourselves and the team down in the first innings by posting 4/234. The highlight was a magnificent 108 no by Daniel Barnes who had an excellent season as our opening bat, and was deservedly rewarded with his promotion to 2nds.

Our next game against Gosnells was our greatest team victory for the year. A great batting performance by Damian Casson 97 and Chris Payne 79, allowed us to declare at 5/303, this was capped off by awesome team effort and some tireless bowling from Phil Henryon who captured the last wicket to win with three balls to spare. The effort, enthusiasm and intensity created by the team in the field was above expectation, it was exciting and a pleasure to be involved in with all players remaining positive and focused for the whole day giving 110%. The intensity generated for that game is what is required every week to be champions.

The next fixture was a fighting win against Willeton. Phil Henryon again showed his potency as a strike bowler by taking a match winning 7/59 in helping bundle Willetton out for 155. The familiar wobbles set in during the run chase requiring the nerves of Hamish the "money man" who performed admirably with 59. Next was a game versus powerhouse team Perth resulting in entertaining but nail biting draw due to the fantastic last wicket stand between Phil and Darren Stevens. Congratulations must go to Phil's batting improvement this season.

Our last victory over Fremantle was our most resounding win for the year, but I feel the start of the down fall of what could have been the year of the Lion in 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade. After punishing Fremantle with the bat declaring at 4/302, due to centuries to Kosta Kapinkoff 138 no (who had an excellent season) and your truly 130, we just failed to gain an outright victory after bundling them out for 108 and having them on the ropes 8/112. Ryan Parkin 7/37 and Adam Cross 6/66 were rewarded for their great bowling and were supported by some excellent fielding.

After the resounding victory the team was in a strong position on the ladder, unfortunately the wheels began, no they actually fell off. There was no one to blame but ourselves for poor inept performances with the bat and ball losing the next three games and drawing the last. What started as a positive season turned sour due to complacency, inconsistency, and lack of desire and determination by most players.

Poor batting was the main down fall as most struggled. Partnerships were hard to come by and those that showed some grit were unable to capitalise on their efforts when the chips were down. Our fielding took a turn for the worse, the unacceptable happened, it was no longer easy and unfortunately we rolled belly up.

Some positives where attained through this poor patch with Nick Plaisted relishing the opportunity to bat up the order with fine knocks in the last two games. Especially a gritty 72 on a rain effected pitch versus Wanneroo. Importantly all players felt the pain and displeasure losing brings with it and hopefully we learn from it becoming more resilient and harder cricketers for it. Cricket is mental no matter how much ability one has. Self-belief, effort, experience and professionalism are some of the qualities we need to develop to become more consistent winners.

To all the players I wish to thank them for the season it was a pleasure playing with great blokes. I would also like to thank joint captain Clinton Palmer who unfortunately had an injury interrupted season. The future is bright for SFCC 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, with the players we have we can win the big one but, fire, passion and desire has to show at all times especially when its tough. Cricket is a team game and we all need to take responsibility in ensuring ourselves and our team mates give all they have at all times. Sounds easy, but as we all know it can only be done collectively! I hope to see you at the first function next year!

#### 4th GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The 4s put together a creditable season with 7 wins (one outright), 5 losses and an honourable draw. The most pleasing aspect of our performances was the consistency of batting with scores of 268; 5/301: 9/153 (on a sticky); 179; 172; 215; 253; 204; 190; 237; 245; 85 (only blemish) and 204. Our track record in chasing sizeable scores was not bad, with two wins, a creditable draw and two near misses, mainly due to middle order tentativeness. Bernic Le Tessier took off the batting award with a very consistent season (27, 35, 71, 20, 14, 16, 79, 16, 6, 23, 33, 12) in the opening spot. Joel Hubble was also a reliable contributor and with better umpiring would probably have made bigger scores than his regulation 30. Joel did however get the award for worst runner between wickets, which gave his skipper a few grey hairs. Our lone century maker was Hamish MacIntosh who performed well during the year in 3rd grade and subsequently ended the season in the 2nds.

Other steady performers with the bat were Rich Catlin, David Kinsella and our part-timers from the 17s - Sam Pearse, Curtis Lind and Brett Jones. Some memorable tail end performances from Robbie Parr, Dave Garnsey and Greg Catlin were produced. Catto's 3 boundaries in 4 balls to clinch victory in round 1 was an outstanding moment in the year.

Our bowling was professional, if sometimes lacking the ability to clean up the tail. As is usual in fourth grade, bowlers suffered from missed catches. Rich Catlin was the most consistent wicket taker with 16 scalps, closely followed by David Garnsey with 13. Outstanding hauls included Richard's 6/61 vs. Bays-Morley, Karl Langdon's match-winning 7/57 vs. Mid-Guildford and Justin Swan's 7/73 vs. Gosnells which also delivered victory.

Robbie Parr, Andy Rintoul and Bernie Le Tessier were all steady contributors with the ball. John Elliman also put in some excellent spells and Greg Catlin chimed in with two crucial stints at the crease.

Although a few regulation catches went to ground (notably by the oldies and particularly by the skip!) we fielded relatively well - for fourth grade. Some excellent grabs were taken in slips and also in the outfield. Too many run out opportunities went begging and, as is to be expected, much more practice time fielding is required by all.

A very pleasing aspect of the year was the way we were able to construct a competitive team each week using old timers, part timers, the regulars and budding stars from the juniors. Having Karl Langdon, Andy Worland and Greg Catlin step into the team on occasions and perform was a great benefit to the team, and particularly to the younger players. Boris in particular added vigour and enthusiasm to the team and receives a special award for his caber tossing performance at Veryard. The return of Anthony Tsokos to the club added spark to our batting and with 'Sox', Robbie Parr, Boris and Bernie Le T managing the on-field chat, there was rarely a dull moment. At the other end of the age scale, our under 17's, Hubble, Kinsella, Elliman, Price, Pearse, Jones and Lind all put in excellent performances and showed their credentials as senior cricketers.

The aspects of our team game to work on next year are - more confidence in middle order batting, more aggressive bowling, particularly to the lower order batsmen and as always, all aspects of fielding - let's get more run-outs next year! In summary, the season was a good one.

#### SUBI-FLOREAT'S HISTORY

The Subiaco Cricket Club was admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association in 1907 and was formed from the remnants of a mercantile cricket club based at Whittakers timber mill in Subiaco. The Club played originally at Subiaco Oval before re-locating to Rosalie Park in the 1960's. Some of the more well known Subiaco players were Johnny Rutherford, Jim Hubble, Des Hoare and a certain R. J. Hawke.

The Floreat Park Cricket Club was founded in 1956 and admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association as a 2nd Grade Club. The most famous players to be produced by the Floreat Park Club were Australian Test players Kim Hughes and Terry Alderman who both went to the Subiaco Club to play 1st grade cricket before returning to Floreat Oval when the two clubs merged.

The Subiaco-Floreat Cricket Club was founded in 1977 as a result of the amalgamation between the Subiaco Cricket Club and the Floreat Park Cricket Club and commenced playing in the 1977/78 season. Ray Young was the inaugural President and Paul Nicholls the inaugural 1st Grade Captain.

Season 1996/97 was the twentieth season of cricket for the Subiaco-Floreat Cricket Club. As Subiaco-Floreat's first twenty years came to a close, it was considered appropriate to look back over the past and name an Allstar Team of the best players to have represented the Club over the past twenty years. To be eligible players must have been Australian and have played 25 1st grade games.
