

I consider the season to have been a very successful one, especially the strong performance of the "A" grade team led by Gavin Swan, and the back-to-back premiership by the Colts led by Chris Cann. The "A" grade team finished the season in fourth place after being as high as third on the premiership ladder. Unfortunately the team did not perform as well in the finals, being beaten by the eventual winners, Bayswater Morley. Iam sure the experience will stand the club in good stead in the future.

The club's persistence with younger cricketers is now starting to pay dividends and we expect an even better performance next year as most players will remain with the club. The "A" grade team was competently led by Gavin Swan who had a very successful season. He finished with 43 "A" grade wickets and a fourth place in the Olly Cooley Medal Count. Gavin was well supported by his deputies, Michael Simpson and Steven Glew. Steven has accepted an invitation to attend the Cricket Academy in Adelaide - well done Steven!

The seconds, thirds and fourths had reasonable seasons, however when you take out four of the "A" grade side to represent the State Under 19's for two matches, the replacements have to come from these teams. Often we did not have the depth of players ready to perform at the next level. Nevertheless it does give the younger players the opportunity. Thanks to the "old brigade" that helped the club out. Well done to the captains, Tim, Arnie and Bernie.

Our colts team led by Chris Cann won the flag for the second year in a row. This is an excellent achievement and we hope the success will continue next season. Congratulations to the coach Graham Gaunt for the excellent result. In our junior grades the club had a successful year which stands us well for the future. Well done to all concerned. The club is pleased to announce that lan Herbert has agreed to take on the coach's position for another year. Ian has been a driving force with the club and is now reaping the benefits of the programs he has initiated over the past three years. Ian was capably assisted by Peter Capes, Craig Harms, Jeremy Allen and net captain Chris Beattie.

At the club presentation evening, Jim Rule was awarded life membership by the club for his dedication over a number of years. Unfortunately the club lost one of the original life members in M C C (Bill) Bolton - our condolences go to the Bolton family. The Town of Cambridge, through the efforts of Ross Farlekas and Geoff Harvey have the ground in top condition. Many say it is the best they have seen the playing arena. The wickets have settled in well with favourable reports being received.

I would like to personally thank the very dedicated committee for their support during the year. Also to the ladies who assisted with afternoon teas, my wife Lyn for organising the rosters and Jane and Terry for the lunches, Phil Thomson, the "A" grade scorer for his support and the cooking of Thursday nights meals. There were a few matters the club commenced during the year that have not been completed but are well under-way. The club has had a slow year financially in terms of its own fund-raising efforts, though it was bailed out by a substantial increase in WACA funding. It is the end of my third season and it only seems like yesterday that I was meeting the players for the first time. Many changes have occurred in this time. I believe players now understand that there is no substitute for hard work and a belief that they are capable of success both individually and as a tearn.

All followers of Subiaco-Floreat Cricket Club have noted the improvement in performance of the 'A' Grade team. This improvement reflects the attitude that has developed within the team itself. Captain Gavin Swan supported a change in focus based on placing most attention on the positives. This resulted in players who were more confident and not focused on the consequences of failure.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Club finished with a net book profit for the year of \$4,739 (after including \$2,227 received from the WACA on 18 June 1998 which related to the previous year).

The actual surplus for the 98/99 year was \$2.512

Profit from bar trading was down \$1,607 and sponsorship was \$2,510 less than the previous year. This was offset by an increase in WACA grants of \$2,765, the majority coming from Lilac Hill.

Equipment costs were down by \$4,319, primarily due to reduced expenditure on cricket balls.

An amount of \$4,893 was accrued in the accounts for wicket maintenance; this amount has not been paid and we have requested the Cambridge Council to provide substantiation of the amount claimed; wicket maintenance in previous years has been in the order of \$1500 pa.

Other costs were generally in line with the previous year.

Outstanding fees of \$2,204 should be fully recoverable.

Continuing control of costs, an ongoing effort in gaining Sponsorship and prompt payment of fees together with success in the field should assist in building the club's reserves for the future.

Looking back at the season, and then the one previous, one does not need to be a Rhodes scholar to notice that a dramatic improvement occurred.

Ifinished last year's captain's report by saying that if we were to improve we needed to set some appropriate individual and team goals, and show a little determination. To the credit of all who played A Grade this year, we were able to achieve this objective and consequently we won a number of close games that required an extra special effort under considerable pressure. Imade reference to being a 'champion team' and although at times we played like one, we faulted by losing the semi-final and squandered a lot of very hard work. Despite this a season of 8 wins, 2 draws (one due to rain) and 2 losses is a good season. Hopefully the experience of playing finals cricket, with the extra pressure and excitement involved, will be a learning experience for all. Remember the pain we felt after the loss and make sure that when we get another chance, we don't make the same mistakes.

One particular improvement this year was our fielding and catching. Having a more consistent player line up each week allowed us to field players in specialist positions and consequently a dramatic improvement occurred. Kosta Kapikoff in cover and Rob Campbell at mid wicket or extra cover allowed us to put pressure on batsmen by stopping quick singles and led to a few run outs. Our slips were very good, taking almost all the chances, in particular Steven Glew at second. Brad Hart at gully took a record number of catches breaking a 30-year record at the club. Mike Simpson was outstanding with the gloves finishing with 38 catches for the season.

Our batting was sporadic this year but was generally good enough to allow us to win most games. This is still an area where we can improve. Steven Glew was the best of our batsmen compiling 376 runs at 31.3 including a very good 80 against Perth on a wicket that was not conducive to batting to say the least. 'Glewey' batted very well and did a good job batting in the difficult number 3 position. Rob Campbell and Brad Hart had the next 2 best averages scoring 263 at 26.3 and 286 at 25.9 respectively batting at number 6 and 7 for most of the season. These two batsmen batted very well and often were in the middle when the pressure was on and managed to get us over the line when required.

David Bolton and Bryn Lockie our Scottish friend opened the batting for most of the season and were able to see the new ball off on most occasions. David finished with 227 at 25.4; a commendable effort in his first season of A-grade cricket batting in a difficult position.

Signs of brilliance were shown by the other batsmen but unfortunately they failed to capitalise on opportunities. There has not been an A-grade hundred scored at the club in the past two years. Let's set ourselves to get at least one next year.

Bowling was solid for the season. We narrowly missed two outright wins. This was particularly evident at the beginning of the season in having the luxury of an exceptional bowler in Jeremy Allen. Jeremy only played half the season due to work commitments but finished with 19 wickets at 13.7.

In Jeremy's absence, Sam Howman stepped up with the new ball and bowled very well at times with good line and late swing. Sam finished with 27 wickets at 25.8. Rob Campbell, bowling first change, was often called upon as the partnership breaker and did it with consummate ease. 27 wickets at 14.6 with the ball, a batting average of 27 and very few runs given away in the field indicates a good 'all round' performance.

Brad Hart found it difficult at times to get the ball due to the dominance of the pace attack but when called upon bowled well, finishing with 21 wickets for the season. One of the keys to our improvement this year was the ability to build pressure consistently by bowling in partnerships and bowling the odd wicket- taking ball during this time.

Thank-you to all the players for your commitment and humour over the season, especially my deputies Glewey and Simo. Thanks to lan for your dedication and assistance throughout the year. Finally thanks must go to Peter Capes who assisted us with our bowling and fielding this season, the committee and Phil Thomson for his cryptic score book.

We have now as a team had a taste of success and have played some very classy cricket. Cricket is a great game that is especially gratifying when you win. Let's become that 'champion team' next year and climb over the hurdles we stumbled upon this year.

The second grade team completed the 1998-99 season with a record of 4 wins, 7 losses and 2 draws. Disappointing considering what I thought the side could have achieved at the start of the season.

The most frustrating thing was the consistency of the side. Many times did we play good cricket for 2 or 3 hours, only to throw it away with one very bad hour of cricket. So if the side can improve in this area we can start thinking about playing in finals.

In many ways the season was played in two halves, batting and bowling. The bowling was close to, if not the best in the competition, while the batting was one of the worst in the competition.

When playing together the bowling quartet of Duncan Bond, Phil Henryon, Dylan Allsopp and Brendan Balcombe was the most feared in the competition, with sides rarely passing 150 runs. Duncan Bond spent half of the season playing 1st grade and if he can continue to improve his consistency will become an even more effective bowler. Phil Henryon had an outstanding season and again if he can improve his consistency can play a lot more 1st grade in the future. Dylan Allsopp's bowling was one of the finds of the season. At the start of the season he was only just getting a game, but he improved greatly and finished taking out the bowling award for 2rd grade. Brendan Balcombe was the workhorse of the side, usually bowling 25 overs per innings and tying up an end for the afternoon, and more often than not taking 3 or 4 wickets. I believe that in most other teams these four bowlers would be regular 1st graders.

The batting for the season was most disappointing but there were some good signs after Christmas when we started to get some partnerships going and posting some defendable scores.

George Christodoulou showed again that he is a quality wicket keeper with another consistent season, and once given the opportunity to open the innings, often got the team away to a good start.

David Kinsella won the batting trophy and at the age of 17 showed a lot of maturity while batting in difficult circumstances. If he can continue to work hard at his game he has a bright future ahead of him. Daniel Barnes is another young player with a promising future, and finished the season strongly, scoring enough runs to earn a place in 1st grade for the finals. Vince Rule, while having a disappointing start to the season, also finished the season strongly and earned a recall to the 1st grade for the finals.

For me the highlight of the year was the outright victory against North Perth. We bowled North Perth out for 104 and 85. After making the runs comfortably in the first innings, we required 85 to win off 26 overs on a very difficult wicket to bat. We made the runs with 7 wickets down and Vince Rule hitting a six in the last over to win the game.

To all the players, I wish to thank them for the season, it was a pleasure playing with a great bunch of blokes. I would also like to thank Vince Rule and Chris Payne for helping me out with the captaincy. The $1^{\rm st}$ grade had an outstanding season, but the $2^{\rm st}$ grade must improve to increase the depth of the club so Subi-Floreat can become a dominant force in years to come.

Every player who played 2rd grade this season has the ability to play 1 st grade, but to play 1 st grade they must continue to train hard and work on all facets of their game.

Overall results

4 wins 7 losses 1 draw

A quick glance at our overall statistics will reveal a couple of facts straight away. Firstly a lot of players represented the club in 4th grade this year! (23 played only 1 or 2 games) and secondly there was a virtual drought of runs. Only one player, Damian Hughes, scored more than 200 for the year. This inability to make defendable scores or to chase scores was a major factor in the 4th's second half of the season slump. One win in the last six games saw us gradually fall down the ladder to eventually end 13th.

The season started promisingly enough with a good effort against Midland Guildford followed by a 1 run win over Scarborough. In this game our team professional Robbie Parr captured his 50th career wicket for Subi-Floreat before jetting out to fulfill his contract in Argentina.

Following a strong win in Round 4 versus Gosnells things were on the up and up. Good performances coming from new players, Graham Pearson, Brendan Bates and Steve Kostarelas plus Damian Hughes and Karl Langdon. SUBI-FLOREAT'S HISTORY

The Subiaco Cricket Club was admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association in 1907 and was formed from the remnants of a mercantile cricket club based at Whittakers timber mill in Subiaco. The Club played originally at Subiaco Oval before re-locating to Rosalie Park in the 1960's. Some of the more well known Subiaco players were Johnny Rutherford, Jim Hubble, Des Hoare and a certain R. J. Hawke.

The Floreat Park Cricket Club was founded in 1956 and admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association as a 2nd Grade Club. The most famous players to be produced by the Floreat Park Club were Australian Test players Kim Hughes and Terry Alderman who both went to the Subiaco Club to play 1st grade cricket before returning to Floreat Oval when the two clubs merged.

The Subiaco-Floreat Cricket Club was founded in 1977 as a result of the amalgamation between the Subiaco Cricket Club and the Floreat Park Cricket Club and commenced playing in the 1977/78 season. Ray Young was the inaugural President and Paul Nicholls the inaugural 1st Grade Captain.

M C C (Bill) Bolton (1918 - 1999) - The end of an Innings

It was with great sadness that we learned of the death of Bill Bolton on 29 January 1999. After starting his cricketing career at Guildford Grammar, Bill (a left hand batsman) joined Subiaco Cricket Club where his father, L B Bolton MLC, was Patron at the time. He left to go to Melbourne in 1938 where he played first grade cricket for St Kilda. He returned to Perth in 1939 in time to join the first grade team in winning the premiership in 1939/40. After the Second World War, Subiaco won two more premierships in 1945/46 and 1946/47, with Bill as a member of the side.

After retiring from playing cricket, Bill spent many years coaching young cricketers in the Floreat area. He was honoured with Life Membership of Subiaco Cricket Club of which he was a member for 63 years. He was a Life Member of the WACA for over 50 years. He is best remembered at SFCC for his annual trophy, the L B Bolton Memorial Shield, a tribute to his father. The trophy is for the Club Cricketer of the Year, and is open to all senior grade cricketers on a points per run, wicket, catch, and stumping basis, won this year by Gavin Swan.

Bill had many other interests, one of which was playing billiards. He won the State title five times. He was the Patron and a Life Member of the WA Billiards & Snooker Association where he had served as state president for 6 years. Bill also played lawn bowls with the Floreat Park Bowling Club where he was a member for 42 years. He was a member of the WAFL and Subiaco Football Club for 35 years.

Away from sport, Bill was a keen 'ham' amateur radio operator, served a term as president of the West Perth branch of Rotary, and was granted honorary membership of that club. Bill leaves a widow, Poppy (to whom many thanks for this information), three sons, Alan, Ross & Neil, a daughter, Helen, and 12 grand-children, to all of whom the Committee's sympathies are extended.
