COACH'S REPORT

1st GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The 1st grade team this year performed very well with a good balance of youth and experience. The teams success, I believe, can be attributed to a much more disciplined approach to our bowling and batting, and when this is compiled with quality fielding and catching, not many teams were good enough to beat us. Consequently we were able to finish third on the ladder, which is an improvement of one position on last year.

Having said all that, the greatest strength that we have as a team, is TEAM SPIRIT. We have won a number of games this year by 'feeding off' each other's success and pulling together as a unit when things become difficult or even seemingly impossible. Perhaps the greatest example of this was the win at Hillcrest in the last game when we won outright to be given the chance to play in the finals. Lets continue our exceptional team spirit next year by doing the difficult things together at training and in games, as well as enjoying the good times at various venues after hours.

The seasons batting resulted in a number of highlights from in particular Kosta Kapinkoff early and Mike Simpson more consistently.

'Simmo' batting at 5 for most of the season, scored 450 runs at an average of 34.6 and on a number of occasions was the person who held our batting together. The patience and discipline that 'Simmo' showed when he batted were an excellent example of how to bat under pressure and his determination and leadership were paramount throughout the season.

Kosta, batting at 4 started sensationally with two hundreds early which resulted in him setting these games up for the team. Kosta finished with 385 runs at an average of 25.6. Coupled with Kostas' explosive batting, he was exceptional in the field, setting the standard for us all.

The remainder of the batting was sporadic in its consistency although Sam Howman, who scored 227 at 37.7 and Rob Campbell who scored 324 at 23.1 batted well in the final overs of matches to win us a number of games. Both these players can be described as true 'all rounders' and very valuable to the team.

Our bowling was strong throughout the season and we managed to bowl all the opposing teams out.

Phil Henryon played his first whole 1st grade season and was at times very quick and unplayable. Phil finished with 22 wickets at an average of 23.2. With a little more consistency on his line and length he should be able to finish next season with 35 wickets plus.

Sam Howman who has evolved into a very good swing bowler, improved as the season progressed. Sam has the ability to dismiss quality batsmen and always gives the team nothing less than his very best. 27 wickets at an average of 17.9 is a good year.

Rob Campbell and our leg spinner Scott Moody found it difficult to get the ball and keep it at times due to the dominance of our pace attack, but when called upon, both bowled well and often came up with the "partnership breaker" that the team needed.

His form in the last qualifying game and the first final where he took a couple of 5 wicket hauls proved what he is capable of when fed raw meat. His end of season form was remarkable. The side was also lucky to have the benefit of a good leg spinner in Luke Sweeney. His ability suggests he was born in the southern hemisphere. Following a rebuilding year in 1998/99 in which the 4th's fielded nearly 4 full sides during the year, a more consistent line-up this season afforded the 4th Grade a more successful year in 1999/2000. We were a very consistent side and the second half of the season saw the fourths produce three excellent wins in the final 4 rounds. These included defeating finalists Perth by defending a small total at Alderbury, successfully chasing 274 against Melville, making 6/292 and downing eventual premiers North Perth by nearly 100 runs at Floreat Oval. The last two games featured a century-plus opening stand in each game by Damien Hughes and Joel McShane. The last three games featured good performances in all aspects of our game. Good aggressive batting, tight pressure bowling and supportive fielding featuring good catching. By the end of the season, we were a confident team who knew how to win and all players involved should have learned a lot from these good wins. Come season's end, we were left to rue some early losses, 3 games going against us by a total of only 27 runs.

A number of players had excellent seasons but none more so than Damien Hughes who made 429 runs at the excellent average of 42.9. His season included 4 half centuries, scoring 91, 89, 64 and 57 not out. Two of these innings were match-winning digs and his 91 was from a team total of 161. Add to this 8 wickets at 12.75 and 12 catches and you have an excellent contribution. His successful season should be a stepping stone to better things. Jason Bull also featured prominently and was just pipped by Damien for the best average. Jason's 4th Grade result of 287 @ 41 was excellent, unfortunately his 3rd Grade efforts met with little success. Other batting contributions came from Joel McShane - 236 @ 18.15 (he would love me to quote only his year 2000 figures), Bernie Le Tessier 222 @ 22.2, Sam Pearce 120 @ 24, and Vinnie Sandhu 111 @ 55.5. Richard Catlin averaged 21.33 in his shortened season, and the year saw the welcome return of Brad Barnes.

The bowling uncovered some very good new talent in Dave Reddie - 16 wickets @ 17.81 and Ian Hyland 17 wickets @ 20.47 including 6/37 on debut vs University. Both these bowlers also have the talent to rise to a higher level of cricket. Other contributions came from Bernie Le Tessier, 15 wickets at 18.26, and Robbie Parr, 14 wickets at 19.28, including a sensational 5/10 in Round One! Richard Catlin chimed in with 10 wickets at 14.2.

SUBI-FLOREAT'S HISTORY

The Subiaco Cricket Club was admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association in 1907 and was formed from the remnants of a mercantile cricket club based at Whittaker's timber mill in Subiaco. The Club played originally at Subiaco Oval before re-locating to Rosalie Park in the 1960's. Some of the better known Subiaco players were Johnny Rutherford, Jim Hubble, Des Hoare and a certain R. J. Hawke.

The Floreat Park Cricket Club was founded in 1956 and admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association as a 2nd Grade Club. The most famous players to be produced by the Floreat Park Club were Australian Test players Kim Hughes and Terry Alderman who both went to the Subiaco Club to play 1st grade cricket before returning to Floreat Oval when the two clubs merged.

The Subiaco-Floreat Cricket Club was founded in 1977 as a result of the amalgamation between the Subiaco Cricket Club and the Floreat Park Cricket Club and commenced playing in the 1977/78 season. Ray Young was the inaugural President and Paul Nicholls the inaugural 1st Grade Captain.
