


President's Report

Another flag in a grade to make it 3 in a row and some 77 years since this was last achieved. This is a wonderful effort. SFCC has surpassed a number of records over the past 5 years and I believe the club will continue to be a very competitive club for some time to come.

Winning the 2002/2003 final was a team effort. Getting away to a good start with our opening pair Rob Campbell and David Bolton set the target for a big score. Of course Steve Glew's innings of 215 was a gem. Steve scored over 1000 runs for the season and broke Kim Hughes club record of 853 runs set in 1988/89. We also saw Gavin Swan take 2 hat tricks and 50 wickets for the season; Sam Howman also took 50 wickets. Mike Simpson and Rob Campbell reached the 100 game milestone and Michael Clark was selected in an Australian A team to tour India. Michael had a successful Pura Cup season and won the Coach's Award at the Gold Cup dinner. Murray Goodwin had another successful Pura Cup season and is presently in the UK to play cricket with Sussex.

The club missed winning the club championship by 100 points, which is basically about three wins across the board. The 2nd, 3rd, and 4th grade teams, had slow seasons by their standards and missed the finals. The junior teams had mixed success. However there are a number of quality players coming through. Thanks to the captains Gavin Swan, Danny O'Regan, Dave Darragh and Richard Catlin for all your efforts.

Congratulations go to Richard Catlin, the fourth grade captain for winning the WACA 4th grade fairest and best cricketer award.

Prior to the commencement of the season we lost our popular coach Noel Knight from the last 2 seasons. Noel was appointed full time WACA assistant coach. However we obtained the services of Don Weir. Don coached SFCC back in the early 1990's. He continued with the recent success of the club coaching the a grade to it's 3rd consecutive premiership. Well done Don and we look forward to another successful season.

The wickets at Alderbury Street Reserve have been completed and will be ready for use at the start of next season. Regarding the redevelopment of the Floreat Oval complex, we believe tenders have been called for the architects. Further discussion will take place once the tender has been approved. However it could be some time before we see anything happening.

During the season the social committee ran a very successful film night that was well attended. Graham Stafford with assistance ran the Wilberforce day. It was very successful and it was very rewarding to see a number of our greats and past players return for the game.

The Presidents Dinner was another successful night. Thanks to Greg Catlin and Graham Stafford for their contributions. The Club's End-of-Season function was again held at Ridolfo's restaurant. Hosted again by our Mike Simpson, who as usual put in a top performance, it was a great success. Thanks also to David Jones and Steve Petsos for organising the night.

Successful clubs generally have a very competent committee and at SFCC we have one of the best committees I have been involved with. Thanks to everyone for your support and I look forward to your future involvement.

Coach's Report

In my address at the President's Dinner, I alluded to the question I had asked myself many times, why take on a coaching position where the club had achieved so much in the previous two seasons?

The answer to this question, the Challenge!

How did the Club and myself respond to this challenge?

1. A 1st Grade Premiership (three in row),
2. Minor Premiers,
3. Second in the club championship,
4. Semi-finalists in the Don't Drink and Drive Shield one day competition, and
5. Semi-finalists in the Carlton Mid-Strength Colts one day competition.

A good performance club-wise, outstanding as far as the 1st grade were concerned, but below par when compared to the previous year.

Playing stocks, particularly with regard to bowling, were down. To lose quality bowlers from the Club and expect to replace them from the within proved to be a difficult task. Whilst it was encouraging that players were promoted to higher grades and will obviously be better for the experience, our depth was severely tested on occasions and the lower grades did struggle in some grades. I wish to acknowledge the excellent effort of grade captains who manipulated their manpower most effectively.

Thus under the circumstances, with regard to our player depth, to finish second in the club championship was a creditable performance.

I would like to the team captains, Gavin Swan, Dan O'Regan, David Darragh and Richard Catlin for their efforts. Thank you also David Jones for his management of the Colts.

The support of the committee was greatly appreciated and specific thanks go to John Worland for always being there. Chris Beattie for his punctuality, organisational skills and wit. Kerry Darragh for his invaluable knowledge of WACA rules regarding player availability and skill in producing four sides each week. Alan Bolton for his tireless scoreboard stints and pitch liaisons.

We are the "yardstick" of the competition, other clubs are plotting our demise, to maintain our status we must improve. Firstly pre-season training was erratically attended which made fluency of skill progression difficult. Pre-season training is the time to work on skills and technique. I urge all players who have the desire to achieve at a higher level (this should be everyone) to fully commit to the entire pre-season programme, rather than "tuning in" just before the new season commences.

As a club our batting consistency still has a way to go. Significant improvement was made the 1st grade level but generally we do not turn starts into solid scores. If you believe you can perform at a higher level relying on two short nets a week, then you will continue to lack the physical and mental toughness to be a consistent performer.

We lacked bowling depth as a club and with the exception of the 1st grade struggled to dismiss sides. We need to supplement our depth and pay greater attention to quality net sessions for sustained periods. This would greatly assist our batsmen's practise quality. I believe our training could be far more productive if more people arrived earlier and on arrival do not take an eternity to actually become physically involved rather verbally involved.

Finally I give credit to our batsmen in that they achieve when practice and game pitches are not conclusive to good batting. The facilities are fine, but the preparation of these facilities is a real problem. We must keep pushing as a club we deserve better.

I look forward to the 2003/2004 season in anticipation of the whole club realising the challenge of staying ahead of the pack. We improve or we stagnate. We improve we will be successful.

We must all welcome the challenge.

1st Grade Report

The 2002/3 season saw Subiaco-Floreat become the first side in 77 years to win three consecutive first-grade flags, as Canny put it...Groundhog Day! The convincing victory over a team who we have had great tussles with over the years in Bayswater was just reward for the hard work of what has become a very close knit team, led brilliantly both on and off the field by our valiant skipper Gavin Swan. The win had several girlfriends and mothers questioning whether or not it was everyday you won a premiership, such have been the seemingly endless celebrations following the historic win.

In past seasons it had been our bowlers who had won most games for us, however this season saw a turnaround in that trend as several of the batsmen stepped up. This was never more evident than in the Grand Final when Subi got away to solid start thanks to a 121 opening partnership between David Bolton (88) and Robert Campbell (46). Steve Glew then smashed the innings of a life-time in belting a chanceless 215 as Subi amassed an unsurpassable 451. He belted an amazing 42 fours with one six and had a strike rate of 90. He was well supported by a subdued Kosta Kapinkoff and middle order batsman Chris Cann. Glew was named man of the match for his innings that was six short of setting a new individual highest score for the Lions.

In fact it should be all of the batsmen who should be congratulated. Glew's marathon innings capped off a stella year resulting in 1107 runs (breaking Kim Hughes 15 year old record of 853) and becoming the first a-grade batsman to top the thousand run barrier since Robin Smith. Bolts and RC became a dominant opening pair scoring nearly 1200 runs between them, with there best effort being a 180 plus stand against Mt Lawley. Bolts will also tell you they were quite handy with the ball.

Rob has accepted a job overseas, which will be a big blow for the A grade side. He has been our number one all rounder for many seasons and played 115 matches for the club. His experience and contribution to the fines kitty will be sorely missed. Once again, we wish him all the best.

Murray Goodwin, had a great year for WA, thus did not get to represent Subi too often, but showed his class to ease his way to 118 in the semi to guide us into the grand final. In each of the last 3 finals campaigns Muzz has come good for us with a ton, a great effort from a great player. Canny also came of age, at least with his batting, scoring his maiden first grade century against last years finals victims South Perth. An excellent year from Chris, who this year learnt the benefits of patience, realizing some of the potential we all knew he had. I might also add that Canny did a great job producing the club magazine "Subi Once". He did so pretty much on his own, providing a lot of humour for the whole club, ensuring a closer bond between everyone from the captain of the club down to the twelfth man for fourths.

Kosta, by his own admission, didn't have quite as good a season as last year, but still contributed nearly 500 runs, and along with the other batsmen was well supported by the engine room, now renamed the lower order. The lads down the order were not required nearly as much as years gone by, but still grabbed the gauntlet when the chips were down, making valuable contributions in several of the games to ensure a Subi victory.

Overall the batting was fantastic, especially given that our home ground is regarded around the competition as somewhat of a bowler's paradise. Our discipline and shot selection improved markedly on previous years making us a formidable line up.

Having pumped up the batsmen's wheels, we should also congratulate the bowlers on another fine season. Sam Howman and Gavin Swan both had remarkable seasons taking 54 and 53 wickets respectively. Clarky also chipped in with a seven-wicket haul against Midland, but it was these two that shouldered most of the responsibility. Clarky was the mainstay for State bowling line up for most of the season and our veteran leggy Moody and wild thing Phil Henryon opted to stay in England for the winter. Howie took an amazing 5, five wicket hauls earning him the fairest and best for this season, while Swanny overtook Giles Bush as the leading wicket taker in Subi Floreat's history. In the process the "king" as he has become known, took 2 hat tricks.

Special mention must be made of all the young lions who broke into our side during the course of the year, each of them contributing and gaining experience so that the future holds more success for our club. Sam Pearce and Chad Jones acquitted themselves very well with the bat, while Wulfy, Wes Lind and Ian Hyland showed they have what it takes to succeed at this level. It should also be noted that they all made notable performances on the social front, thus fitting very well into the a grade line up. 18 players played for the Subi firsts this year, and though only 11 could take the field in the grandy the success of the season is shared amongst the 18. Congratulations to you all!!!

Thanks must go to the hard work and countless hours put in by club coach Don Weir, a previously successful coach with Subi Floreat, and fielding coach for the Western Australian team. Don has managed to combine the strengths of the club and some of his own ideas to ensure the continued growth of us as players. I guess you could say he found that much debated "little something" that we had know idea what he was on about at the start of the season, that he thought was within our team and brought it to fruition again. Thank you for all your efforts Don.

On behalf of all the players we would like to extend our heart felt appreciation for all of those people on the committee. The work that they do, and from all those behind the scenes, does not go unnoticed. From Mrs Glew and the ladies who devote the odd afternoon to making teas, the lads who put the time in behind the bar, to those who chase up sponsors and deal with the WACA, right down to Alan Bolton who helped with the scoreboard, preparing the pitch in the a grade. In particular Phil Thompson who has spent countless hours over that scorebook that only he can understand. We owe you our gratitude. This great year for Subi Floreat has been a team effort from all those that scored the runs and got the wickets, as well as the fantastic supporting network behind the scenes. Congratulations to you all too.

Finally, a thanks to our captain. Swanny has been an inspirational leader and a large reason for why the last few seasons have been the most successful era of our club. In fact, as our coach said to us at the start of this years season assault, we sometimes found ourselves doing it tough, stuck in the trenches, as every other club wanted a piece of our previous success. On many occasions during his reign Swanny has led us out of the trenches and into match winning positions. Ultimately he is highly respected by his cricketing peers throughout the competition for his abilities as captain and simply as a quality bloke, more so by his team mates.

The king should have the final word, as he said at the presentation of our third premiership pennant in a row.

2nd Grade Report

The 2002/2003 2nd grade season will be recorded statistically as an average season with six wins, seven losses and two draws to finish middle of the road and a couple of games away from finals action. The season will be remembered by those involved, as unusual, frustrating yet enjoyable.

As was the case the previous year, the 2's performance was impacted by the loss of several players and the "player drain" that filters through the club when the representative players are called upon for higher duties. This was evidence at the start of the season when after a washout in the first two rounds, we recorded four straight wins to then fall away with seven straight losses to then fight out a couple of great wins at the end. As stated, an unusual season.

At the commencement of the year, it was thought our key to success for our side would be our batting strength. Unfortunately, the potential was not realised and it was a very disappointing year for the batsmen with only Daniel Barnes, Andrew Malajczuk, Chris Payne and Vince Rule scoring in excess of 300 season runs and Daniel and Andy averaging over 25.00. We failed to apply the basics of occupying the crease, build partnerships and in turn make sizable totals and were consistently scoring around the 200-220 mark, which makes it extremely difficult for success at this level. I would like to mention some notable individual batting performances of Daniel Barnes 127NO and Chad Jones 93 before his promotion to A grade.

On the other hand, the bowling and fielding had a better than expected year with Paul Glew, Andre Casson, Tim Silinger, Kim Wulff and Chris Payne all averaging under 23.00. The bowlers consistently bowled to the plan and to their strengths and should be commended on a good season. Paul Glew had an outstanding season with the ball and is a good example of what hard work, consistent lines and building pressure results in success. Paul finished with 20 wickets from only 8 matches at an average of 16.90 including one match where he took 5/44. Other great individual performances were Andre Casson 6/67, Kim Wulff 5/14 and Wes Lind after spending the majority of the season in A grade taking 5/62 at the end of the season. Our fielding was a marked improvement on last year and in particular our runouts. All the "snapping off" training with Don paid handsome dividends in a number of games. I would like to make special mention of Ben Hansberry's solid glove work this season, which was very impressive. Great work Ben on this thankless task.

My Congratulations to Andre Casson, Tim Silinger, Sam Pearce, Kim Wulff, Ian Hyland, Wes Lind, Chad Jones and Chris Payne who all played A grade this season. I would also like to congratulate Andy Malajczuk, Adam Bolton and Ben and Chris Hansberry on making their 2nd grade debuts this year. Club History

The Subiaco Cricket Club was admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association in 1907 and was formed from the remnants of a mercantile cricket club based at Whittaker's timber mill in Subiaco. The Club played originally at Subiaco Oval before re-locating to Rosalie Park in the 1960's. Some of the better-known Subiaco players were Johnny Rutherford, Jim Hubble, Des Hoare and a certain R. J. Hawke.

The Floreat Park Cricket Club was founded in 1956 and admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association as a 2nd Grade Club. The most famous players to be produced by the Floreat Park Club were Australian Test players Kim Hughes and Terry Alderman who both went to the Subiaco Club to play 1st grade cricket before returning to Floreat Oval when the two clubs merged.

The Subiaco-Floreat Cricket Club was founded in 1977 as a result of the amalgamation between the Subiaco Cricket Club and the Floreat Park Cricket Club and commenced playing in the 1977/78 season. Ray Young was the inaugural President and Paul Nicholls the inaugural 1st Grade Captain.

Since the amalgamation the Club has produced from within its own ranks, many 1st class representatives including Glenn Hughes, Giles Bush, Todd Breman, Gavin Swan, Michael Clark, Steven Glew and Murray Goodwin.

In season 2000/01, the Club won the Club Championship by a margin of 300 points. Which was the largest winning margin on record. In 2001/02, the Club became the first club since 1982/83 to win successive 1st Grade Premierships, the first club since 1986/87 to win successive Club Championships and the only club in the history of the WACA competition to win successive 1st Grade Premierships and Club Championships and at the same time.

In season 2002/03 the Club won a third successive 1st Grade Premiership. This was only the third time in WACA history that a club has won three successive 1st Grade Premiership, the previous occurrence was back in 1924/25.
