

President's Report

Another season completed. Whilst not as successful as in the past few years, the club's overall performance was a solid one.

At last work has commenced on the practice wickets and plans are well advanced for alterations to the clubhouse. It is now obvious the practice wickets will not be ready for use at the beginning of the season, and with the relocation of the croquet club being sooner than we anticipated, the club will be required to find a practice venue for a period of 3/4 months.

It is unfortunate that the 1st grade premiership reign came to an end. The side finished 3rd at the end of the regular season and 5th after the elimination final. This is the 6th consecutive season that the SFCC 1st grade team has been in the finals, with three premierships – a success rate that would leave most clubs envious.

The club's bowling strength was tested with the loss overseas of Gavin Swan and Robbie Campbell together with injuries suffered by our senior bowlers. However, the younger bowlers stepped up and performed above expectations. The side's cavalier batting at times did not get sufficient runs on the board for the bowlers to protect, as was the case in the elimination final.

The seconds had a good season in making the semi-finals. It was great to see the improvement from the previous season. The semi-final was a close game and could have gone either way.

The thirds also had a rewarding season but were eliminated in the semi final in a very close match that was in the balance for most of the game.

The fourths struggled for most of the season due to factors beyond their control. Numbers were always a problem with reliance on the under 15's and 17's to make up the places. Well done. We will address the position before next season.

The colts had a successful year and were runners up in the WACA Mid Colts competition.

The junior grades also performed well. There are a number of good players in the junior grades.

After some sound performances, the Club's final appearance in the one-day Don't Drink and Drive shield ended, as in previous years, with another poor performance.

The club finished 3rd in the club championship which made the season a rewarding one.

The committee wishes to congratulate Sam Howman for attaining the WACA best bowling aggregate of 55 wickets @ 17.38 runs.

Other notable performances were captain Steve Glew's 5000 career runs, 100 career catches and Club's highest 1st grade score; 223 runs against Perth. Wally Driver has held this record since the 1942/43 season. Chris Cann 2000 career runs, Sam Howman 200 career wickets and Murray Goodwin 100 1st grade matches for the Club.

On behalf of the committee we would like to thank Jane and her assistants for the lunches and the ladies /gents involved with preparing the afternoon teas, especially Sue Malcolm for her efforts and Nell Giew for her input and assistance. Afternoon teas are very much a part of cricket.

The committee would like to thank the captains for their contribution to the club, Steve Glew, Danny O'Regan, David Darragh, Brad Barnes, Steve Petsos and Wes Lind as well as Don Weir as coach. Don has been reappointed for a further term.

Coach's Report

The past season was one of mixed emotions and varied results with three grades making the finals, a colts grand final appearance and a one-day semi-final for the 1st grade. The Club did have a successful year, arguably more successful than the previous season.

The problem however is that emotions are often not logical. We did not add any silverware to the trophy cabinet and this leaves a hollow feeling with regard to the past season. Perhaps in previous seasons the Club may not have been hit by such significant player losses. These losses particularly with regard to our bowling stocks were further highlighted by long term injuries to personnel recruited to cover our player losses. As a consequence our bowling depth was severely tested with some individuals having to carry an inequitable load. To their credit our bowlers were always competitive and the reality of the season, in all grades, was that we did not make enough runs, on enough occasions to give our bowlers a fair competitive opportunity.

Multiple wicket collapses were prevalent throughout the Club and whilst some notable middle-order and late-order rescue jobs were accomplished, too often the net result was not large enough to realistically give the bowlers a fair chance.

I look forward to all batsmen adhering to what may say are boring or trite principles of batting, but which time has proven to be so true:- Occupy, build an innings, be positive by knowing the correct ball to attack and the correct ball to leave or defend, endure, the longer you occupy the crease the greater you expose the lack of depth of opposition attacks of the duration of a days play.

We've heard it all before but by continually failing to the above principles we continue to do ourselves a major injustice with regard to batting performance.

I wish to acknowledge the significant achievement of the grade and colts captains, their manipulation of bowling attacks to achieve a result as well as astute field placements certainly contributed greatly to our success.

Practice attendance and application were areas of concern this season, but one person who is above reproach is our net captain Chris Beattie. His punctuality, efficiency and enthusiasm should act as a fine example to the players of this club. My thanks and admiration goes to Kerry Darragh for once again handling the unenviable job of Chairman of Selectors with quiet efficiency.

Phil Thomson as scorer and statistician is an institution at this Club and his efforts this year were again beyond reproach. We are extremely fortunate to have Phil within our Club.

Whether it be attending the scoreboard, rolling pitches or putting out covers, Alan Bolton displays a passion for the Club which one would hope might rub off on the playing personnel. Thank you Alan for always being there.

My sincere thanks to John Worland and his committee, for their support and assistance. Their efforts enable the players to take the field week in and week out. I hope the players appreciate this fact. My thanks also go to David Hansberry for his assistance with the colts campaign.

I would also like to congratulate Steven Glew, Sam Howman, Michael Clark and Chris Hansberry on their State representation along with Western Warrior Murray Goodwin.

I look forward to a successful 2004-2005 with a Club Championship being our major goal and several more premiership flags to join our impressive collection.

1st Grade Report

Following three premierships in the last three seasons, the first grade side was looking forward to another successful season. We lost Gavin Swan and Robert Campbell at the end of last season, both venturing overseas, and also lost Michael Clark to injury before the season started. These circumstances reduced our bowling stocks substantially. This would require some of the younger guys to step up if we were to continue to be successful.

The season started of slowly seeing us with three wins and three loses after the first six rounds leaving us sitting a little lower on the ladder than which we had been use to over the past few seasons. The team rallied to win six of the final seven games (with the other being a close draw against Mt Lawley). The spirit, passion and desire shown when we had our backs to the wall, is a true credit to all everyone involved to finish the second half of the season so well. This enabled us to finish third on the ladder, ready to start another finals onslaught.

Unfortunately we got bombed out in the quarterfinals to Bayswater Morley, where we fell short by just two wickets in another close encounter. Again the lads fought the game out until the very last ball and can hold their heads high.

Individually Sam Howman carried the bowling for the season, bowling in excess of 400 overs for the season. He again took 56 wickets at 18.20, to win the side's bowling award. Kim Wulff stepped up with 21 wickets at an average 18.48l, with the rest of the bowlers all chipping in at various times through out the season.

On the batting side Murray Goodwin again showed his class when he was available to win the batting award scoring 388 run at an average of 48.50. The overall batting as a team was solid with the lower order regularly scoring vital runs to set a competitive total. The top order under performed as a unit and individuals should look to step up a notch for next season, even though the standard the Floreat wicket was at times below standard and difficult to bat on.

There were a number of debutants this season including Adam Bolton, Andy Malajcuk, the Hansberry brothers, Ben and Chris, and Paul Glew, all of whom showed potential to succeed at 'A' grade level in the future. Congratulations to you all and I look forward to playing along side of you in the seasons to come. This new generation along with the current 'A' grade players should ensure SCFC to be successful for many seasons to come.

I would like to thank Sam Howman (vice captain) and Michael Simpson for their support throughout the season and would like to congratulate them and all my teammates on a successful season.

2nd Grade Report

The 2003/2004 2nd grade season was an enjoyable and successful year. At the end of the home and away rounds we were placed fourth on the premiership table and reasonably placed for the finals. Statistically we had nine wins and four losses from thirteen games. Perhaps for those involved, it will be remembered as a quality group of people, playing for enjoyment and each other which in turn produced reasonable success.

Like most years, the 2nd's performance was impacted by the loss of several players and the "player drain" that filters through the club when the representative players are called upon for higher duties or are injured. To ensure the best for our club and its future, at times the team selected seemed unbalanced. For example, it was not uncommon for our attack to include two pace and three spin bowlers. What must be commended is the ability for the players to recognise this and "stand up" for the occasion.

SUBIACO - FLOREAT CRICKET CLUB (Inc)

Club History

The Subiaco Cricket Club was admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association in 1907 and was formed from the remnants of a mercantile cricket club based at Whittaker's timber mill in Subiaco. The Club played originally at Subiaco Oval before re-locating to Rosalie Park in the 1960's. Some of the better-known Subiaco players were Johnny Rutherford, Jim Hubble, Des Hoare and a certain R. J. Hawke.

The Floreat Park Cricket Club was founded in 1956 and admitted to the Western Australian Cricket Association as a 2nd Grade Club. The most famous players to be produced by the Floreat Park Club were Australian Test players Kim Hughes and Terry Alderman who both went to the Subiaco Club to play 1st grade cricket before returning to Floreat Oval when the two clubs merged.

The Subiaco-Floreat Cricket Club was founded in 1977 as a result of the amalgamation between the Subiaco Cricket Club and the Floreat Park Cricket Club and commenced playing in the 1977/78 season. Ray Young was the inaugural President and Paul Nicholls the inaugural 1st Grade Captain.

Since the amalgamation the Club has produced from within its own ranks, many 1st class representatives including Glenn Hughes, Giles Bush, Todd Breman, Gavin Swan, Michael Clark, Steven Glew and Murray Goodwin.

In season 2000/01, the Club won the Club Championship by a margin of 300 points. Which was the largest winning margin on record. In 2001/02, the Club became the first club since 1982/83 to win successive 1st Grade Premierships, the first club since 1986/87 to win successive Club Championships and the only club in the history of the WACA competition to win successive 1st Grade Premierships and Club Championships and at the same time.

In season 2002/03 the Club won a third successive 1st Grade Premiership. This was only the third time in WACA history that a club has won three successive 1st Grade Premiership; the previous occurrence was back in 1924/25.
